Indications

For prompt relief of all the symptoms of the common cold and influenza, including headache, muscular pains, respiratory and nasal congestion.

Formula

Pseudoephedrine hydrochloride	20 mg.
Acetylsalicylic acid, B.P.	300 mg.
Caffeine, B.P.	30 mg.

Pseudoephedrine decongests the entire respiratory tract. (Unlike ephedrine, it has negligible stimulating effect). Aspirin and caffeine reduce headache, pain and fever.

Dosage

Two tablets three times a day for adults.
One tablet three times a day for children over 6 years.
The dose should be taken with water.

Caution

Although pseudoephedrine has negligible pressor effect in persons with normal blood pressure, caution should be observed in patients with cardiovascular disorders.
