

The choice of the persons here depicted: Galeazzo M. Sforza, his son G. Galeazzo, and the Duke of Bari on horseback preceded by armed soldiers, would appear to support the identification of this front with that of the wedding chest of Chiara Sforza, illegitimate daughter of Galeazzo Maria, who married Fregosino Fregosi in 1488. The dating depends on the inclusion of Ludovico il Moro, here indicated as Duke of Bari, a title he received in 1479. The painter is unknown, and the colours red, white and grey predominate, with remains of silver on the armours. Schubring, in his monumental work, mentions a « Trivulzio chest » with three Sforzesco persons on horseback, which may be identified with the present (p. 162, p. 382, no. 716). Perhaps it formed part of some furniture belonging to Princess Cristina Belgioioso Trivulzio, probably dispersed from the Como villa where she stayed, and then found by Ghinzoni (see: Bibl.).

INJECTION FOR CHILDREN - Boxes of 1 and 10 vials of 67 mg lyophilized tetracycline-l-methylene-lysine, equivalent to 50 mg tetracycline base with ampoules of solvent each containing 20 mg procaine.

DOSAGE

Orally: Adults - 4 capsules daily in divided doses
Children - 10 mg/kg/daily in divided doses

Intramuscularly: 2-3 vials daily in divided doses
Dosage may be increased in the more serious cases.

NHS COST:

Tetralysal is the least expensive tetracycline available under the NHS.
