Prescribing notes

Dosage. Initially two 250mg tablets of Doriden should be given a quarter to half-an-hour before retiring. After a few nights it will be possible, in many cases, to reduce the dose to one tablet. Occasionally for intractable insomnia larger doses may be necessary. Infants from six months to one year old should be given a quarter of a tablet; those between one and six years should be given half a tablet. A dose of one tablet is suitable for children over six years.

Side effects and precautions. There has been no evidence of any cumulative toxic effects during prolonged administration. On very rare occasions nausea and skin rash have been reported, disappearing on withdrawal of the drug.

Caution is recommended, as with all drugs, in prescribing for women who may be in the first trimester of pregnancy. Caution is also recommended in patients who may be prone to addiction, as with other drugs having sedative and hypnotic properties.
