NOTICES.

THE branches taught in the Vermont Academy of Medicine, are:—
 1st. Chymistry and Natural History: 2d, Natural Philosophy: 3d
 Anatomy and Physiology: 4th, Surgery, Obstetrics and the Diseases
 of Women and Children: 5th, Materia Medica and Pharmacy: 6th,
 Theory and Practice of Medicine: 7th Medical Jurisprudence.

The course of instruction commences at the Medical College in
 Castleton, on the third Thursday in August annually, and continues
 fourteen weeks. There are five Lectures daily, through the whole
 term, and occasionally six. A liberal credit with good security, will
 be given to those unable to make prompt payment. The Matricula-
 tion fee is \$3, the fee for all the Courses \$45, & the Graduation fee \$16.

To be entitled to a degree, the candidate must have arrived at the
 age of twenty-one years, and have sustained a good moral character;
 must have studied the different branches of Medicine, either in some
 medical institution, or with some respectable physician and surgeon,
 for at least three years, including the lecture terms: must have dili-
 gently attended two full courses of lectures, on all the several branch-
 es, either at this or some other incorporated Institution, the last of
 which must have been at this: must have passed a satisfactory exami-
 nation before the Faculty, and have delivered and defended a written
 dissertation on some medical subject, to the approbation of the Facul-
 ty: must have obtained certificates from the Treasurer, that he has
 paid into the Treasury, the graduation fee, & the prescribed lecture fees.

Having complied with these terms, the candidate will be entitled to
 the degree of Doctor of Medicine, unless some sufficient reason ap-
 pears why he should not be admitted to such honor: and said degree
 will be conferred at the annual commencement of the Vermont Acad-
 emy of Medicine in Castleton.

Medical instruction is continued in this institution through the year,
 under the superintendance of Dr. Theodore Woodward. There are
 two reading terms of 15 weeks each, during which there are recita-
 tions and examinations, and an opportunity to pursue dis-sections, for
 any that may desire it. The first term commences the first Monday

in January; the second, the first Monday in May. The fees are \$12 for each term; the Students are allowed access to the Library of the resident Professor, to the anatomical museum, and to the cabinet of minerals; and they are also furnished with reading rooms and all necessary furniture, and can have opportunity to see and practice in medicine and Surgery, as is necessary previous to entering on the duties of the profession.

The price of board lodging, room-rent, fuel, and washing, in Castleton, varies from \$1,50 to \$2 per week.
