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CAP. X.

An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine. [12th March 1805.]

HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled An Act for erecting a Lazaret on Chetney Hill, in the County of Kent, and for reducing into one Act the Laws relating to Quarantine, and for making further Provisions therein, and by other Acts antecedent thereto, Provision was made as well for purchasing Lands for erecting a Lazaret as for defraying the Expences of building the same, and for maintaining a proper Establishment of Officers necessary for enforcing a due Performance of Quarantine; in purfuance of which, Lands were purchased at Chetney Hill, in the County of Kent, and Progress was made in the Erection of a Lazaret there; but the Funds granted by the faid Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His prefent Majesty having been found infufficient for completing the same, and for the Payment of competent Salaries to the Officers who were to have the Charge thereof, and other necessary pences attendant on the Quarantine Service, according to the Plan which

Treafury to give Directions for completing the Lazaret, and appoint Officers, &c.

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had been approved of and directed by His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, a further Sum was granted by an Act of the last Seffion of Parliament : And whereas it is expedient that Provision should be made for a due Application of the fame; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That it shall and may be lawful for the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or any Three or more of them, or the Lord High Treasurer for the Time being, from and after the Commencement of this Act, to give Directions for completing the faid Lazaret, upon the faid Lands fo purchased on Chetney Hill, in the County of Kent, with all neceffary and convenient Accommodations for the Purpole of performing Quarantine, according to the Plan which has been approved of and directed by His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council; or to fuch other Plan as His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, may from Time to Time approve and direct; and for defraying the Expences attending the fame, to caufe any Part of the Money fo granted, to be iffued when it shall be neceffary for the faid Service; and the faid Lazaret when completed, and all the Buildings and Accommodations thereto belonging, shall be under the Management, Order, and Direction of fuch Officers as shall be appointed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, or any Three or more of them, or the Lord High Treafurer for the Time being, for keeping the fame fit and ready for the Reception of Perfons and Goods, and for their due Performance of Quarantine; and fuch Officers refpectively shall have fuch Salaries as shall from Time to Time be appointed by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council; and the Salaries of the faid Officers, and all contingent Expences, shall be defrayed out of the Funds, and in the Manner in which the Charges and Expences of performing Quarantine are at prefent defrayed, until fuch Time as a Revenue shall be raifed fufficient for those Purposes, in the Manner herein-after mentioned.

II. Provided always, and be it enacted, That until the faid Lazaret fhall Floating be in a State fit and proper to be used, it shall and may be lawful for be provided the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to provide One or Lazaret shall more Floating Lazarets, which shall be used for all the Purposes for which the faid Lazaret is intended by this Act; and all the Rules, Regulations, and Provisions in this Act contained, shall be deemed and taken for all Intents and Purpofes, to be applicable to fuch Floating Lazaret or Lazarets, until the Lazaret on Shore fhall, by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, and by Order of the fame, notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette, have been declared to be fit for the due Performance of Quarantine therein.

III. And whereas it is reafonable that the Owners of Ships, Veffels, and Duties shallbe Cargoes, which in future shall have to perform Quarantine, should defray Owners of the Charge incurred thereby; be it further enacted, That there shall be raifed, levied, collected, and paid to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, the feveral and refpective Duties of Cuftoms herein-after mentioned; that is to fay,

For every Ton Burthen of every Ship or Veffel, which Ship or Veffel, Duties. or the Cargo of which or any Part whereof fhall have performed Quarantine in any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernsey. Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and which shall have arrived from any Part of Turkey, or from any Port or Place in Africa, within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, with a clean Bill of Health, Seven Shillings and Sixpence :

For every Ton Burthen of every fuch Ship or Veffel, which shall have fo arrived without a clean Bill of Health, Fifteen Shillings :

For every Ton Burthen of every fuch Ship or Veffel, which Ship or Veffel, or the Cargo of which or any Part whereof shall have performed Quarantine in any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, and which shall have arrived from any Port or Place whatever, (except

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from any Part of *Turkey*, or from any Port or Place in Africa, within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the Weft Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean) with a clean Bill of Health, Three Shillings:

- For every Ton Burthen of every fuch Ship or Veffel which shall have fo arrived without a clean Bill of Health, Ten Shillings :
- For every Ton Burthen of every fuch Ship or Veffel arriving in any Port or Place in *Great Britain*, or the Iflands aforefaid, with a Cargo which in Whole or in Part fhall confift of Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of *Turkey*, or of any Port or Place in *Africa*, within the Streights of *Gibraltar*, or in the *Weft Barbary* on the *Atlantic* Ocean, and which Ship or Veffel, or the Cargo of which or any Part whereof fhall have performed Quarantine in any Port or Place in *Great Britain*, or the Iflands aforefaid, and which fhall have arrived from any Port or Place whatever, Seven Shillings and Sixpence:
- For every Ton Burthen of every Ship or Veffel which fhall have fo arrived under fuch Circumftances as fhall induce His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, or the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, under the Authority hereinafter given, to fubject fuch Ship or Veffel to the like Quarantine as Ships arriving from *Turkey* with clean Bills of Health, Seven Shillings and Sixpence:
- For every Ton Burthen of every Ship or Veffel which fhall have fo arrived under fuch Circumftances as fhall induce His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, or the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any Three or more of them as aforefaid, to fubject fuch Ship or Veffel to the like Quarantine as Ships arriving from *Turkey* without clean Bills of Health, Fifteen Shillings:
- For every Ton Burthen of every Ship or Veffel, which Ship or Veffel, or the Cargo of which or of any Part whereof fhall have performed Quarantine in any Port or Place in *Great Britain*, or the Islands aforefaid,

and

and which Ship or Veffel shall enter Inwards in the Port of London, an additional Duty of One Shilling :

All which feveral and refpective Duties shall be raifed, levied, collected, Duties shall and paid, and shall be fued for, recovered, and accounted for in the fame as Duties of Manner, and fubject to the fame Rules, Regulations, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as any Duties of Customs are now fubject to by Law, as far as the fame are applicable thereto: Provided always, that no Ship or Veffel of Exemptions War, or Transport or other Ship or Veffel employed in the Service of His Majefty's Government, nor any Ship or Veffel which fhall not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and which shall have really put into any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Iflands aforefaid, in Diftrefs; nor any Ship or Veffel which shall have been obliged to perform Quarantine only by Reafon of having certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize on board, and not producing the proper Declaration or Document as to their Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; nor any Ship or Veffel arriving in any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, with a clean Bill of Health, from any Port or Place whatever, except from any Part of Turkey, or from any Port or Place in Africa, within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, in Ballast, or whose Cargo fhall confift wholly of Salt; nor any Ship or Veffel which fhall, together with its Cargo, have duly performed Quarantine in the Lazarets of Malta, Ancona, Venice, Meffina, Leghorn, or One of them, and shall fail from thence, and arrive at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Iflands aforefaid, with proper Documents and Vouchers attefting the fame, to the Satisfaction of His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, or of His or their Privy Council, fhall be liable to or charged with any Duty under this Act.

IV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if after making Duties may be reduced, good (in the Manner herein-after mentioned) to the Confolidated Fund of and after-Great Britain, of the Sums of Sixty five thousand Pounds, granted by wards is creafed.

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the Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His prefent Majefty, and of Thirty thousand Pounds, granted by an Act of the last Seffion of Parliament, or of fo much thereof as shall be found necessary to iffue for the Services aforefaid, it shall appear to the Lord High Treafurer, or the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, that the Duties hereby granted are more than fufficient to defray the Charges and Expences already incurred, and alfo fuch further Expences as may be neceffary for carrying the feveral Purpofes of this Act into Execution, it fhall and may be lawful for the faid Lord High Treafurer, or Lords Commissioners for the Time being, from Time to Time, by any Warrant or Warrants under the Hands of the faid Lord High Treafurer, or of the faid Lords Commissioners for the Time being, or of any Three or more of the faid Lords Commissioners, to order and direct, that the Duties hereby granted fhall be reduced in fuch Proportion and Manner as they shall think proper, and also by like Warrant or Warrants (in cafe the faid neceffary Expences should afterwards require an Increase of the faid Duties) to order and direct that the fame fhall be again raifed and increafed to any Amount not exceeding the Sums which have been before granted by Parliament as aforefaid; and fuch Warrant or Warrants shall be fufficient Authority to the Commissioners and Officers of the Customs for raifing, levying, collecting, and recovering, the feveral and refpective Duties specified and contained in such Warrant or Warrants; any Law or Ufage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Ships not to be permitted to clear inwards until the Duties are paid. V. And be it further enacted, That no Ship or Veffel upon which the Tonnage Duty by this Act imposed shall be due and payable shall be permitted to be cleared Inwards in any Port of Great Britain or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, unless the faid Tonnage Duty shall have been first duly paid to the proper Officers of the Customs appointed to receive the same, or the Commissioners of the Customs shall otherwise direct; and that the Tonnage of every Ship or Veffel shall be computed and taken, for the Purpose of ascertaining the shall Duties

ties according to the Register thereof, under the Provisions of an Act paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled An Act for the further Increase and Encouragement of Shipping and Navigation ; and in cafe of any Difpute or Doubt relative thereto, the fame shall be afcertained by Admeafurement, in the Mode and Manner prefcribed in the faid last-mentioned Act.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Ship Owners Owner or Owners of any Ship or Veffel, in respect of which any of the Duties of the Duties imposed by this Act shall have been paid, to demand and recover from the refpective Importers, Proprietors, or Confignees of any Goods or Merchandize brought or imported in any fuch Ship or Veffel, fuch Sum or Sums of Money as shall be equal to the just and reasonable Contribution which the Proportion of Tonnage that fuch Goods and Merchandize bear to the Tonnage Burthen of the Ship shall require, and no more; such Proportion of Tonnage to be afcertained according to the Ufage of Merchants in like Cafes.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the Monies arising from the Duties to be Duties hereby granted shall be paid into the Receipt of His Majefty's Confolidated Exchequer, and carried to and made Part of the Confolidated Fund of Great Britain. Great Britain; and that in the Office of the Auditor of the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer there shall be provided and kept a Book or Books, in which all the Monies arifing from the faid Duties, and paid into the faid Receipt, fhall be entered feparate and apart from all other Monies paid or payable to His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, upon any Account whatfoever.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the Money fo raifed, levied, Application collected, and paid, shall be applied in the first Place to defray the annual Expences of the faid Floating Lazaret and Land Lazaret, and all other annual Expences which shall be incurred in the Execution of this Act; and in the next Place to make good any Money that shall have been isfued

IX. And whereas it is expedient that the faid herein-before recited Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, and every other Act or Acts heretofore paffed concerning Quarantine, together with fuch further Provisions as are found to be neceffary to be made in respect thereof, should be reduced into One Act; be it therefore enacted, That the faid Act fo paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His faid prefent Majefty as aforefaid be repealed, and that every other Act or Acts heretofore paffed, in fo far as the fame do or may be deemed or conftrued to relate to the Performance of Quarantine, fhall be and the fame are hereby repealed; fave and except fo much of the faid Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty as relates to the Repeal of former Acts, and to the Payment and recovering of any Duties imposed by the faid Act which shall be due and unpaid at the Time of passing this Act, and also fave and except as to any Offence or Offences done or committed before the paffing of this Act, by any Perfon or Perfons, against any Law concerning Quarantine ; and as to any Fine, Penalty, Forfeiture, or Punifhment, Fines, Penalties, Forfeitures, or Punishments, to which any fuch Perfon or Perfons may be liable by reafon of the fame; and alfo as to any Action, Suit, Profecution, or other Proceeding brought or commenced, or which shall hereafter be brought or commenced, for or on account of any fuch Offence or Offences fo done or committed as aforefaid.

X. And be it further enacted, That all Ships and Veffels, as well His shall be liable Majesty's Ships of War as all others, coming from or having touched at any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, shall have adjudged and declared

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declared it probable that the Plague, or any other infectious Difeale or Diftemper, highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, may be brought; and all Ships, Veffels, and Boats receiving any Perfon, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any Ships or Veffels fo coming from or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, whether fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles shall have come or been brought in fuch Ships or Veffels, or fuch Perfons shall have gone or Articles have been put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships or Veffels at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and whether fuch Ships or Veffels were or were not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Iflands aforefaid; and all Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, on board of any fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or on board of any fuch Receiving Ships, Veffels, or Boats as aforefaid, fhall be and be confidered to be liable to Quarantine within the Meaning of this Act, and of any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, from the Time of the Departure of fuch Ships or Veffels from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or from the Time when fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles fhall have been received on board respectively; and all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats as aforefaid, and all Perfons (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or going or being put on board the fame either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats at

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any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Iflands aforefaid; and all Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, on board any fuch Receiving Ship, Veffel, or Boat as aforefaid, fhall, upon their Arrival at any fuch Port or Place, be obliged to perform Quarantine in fuch Place or Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from fuch Quarantine, no fuch Perfon, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or other Articles as aforefaid, or any of them, fhall, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, come or be brought on Shore, or go and be put on board any other Ship, Veffel, or Boat in order to come or be brought on Shore, in any fuch Port or Place, although fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid may not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid, unlefs in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majeity, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid ; and all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, whether coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, and all Perfons (as well Pilots, as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, or going or being put on board the fame either before or after the Arrival' of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, and although fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats shall not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid, and all Commanders, Masters, or other Persons having the Charge or Command of any fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, whether coming from any infected Place, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, fhall

shall be subject to all the Provisions, Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions contained in this Act, or in any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs and Successfors, in Council as aforefaid, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, and to all the Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments contained in this Act, for any Breach or Difobedience thereof, or of any Order or Orders of His Majefty in Council made under the Authority thereof.

XI. And whereas certain Sorts of Goods and Merchandize are more espe- Goods specicially liable to retain Infection, and may be brought from Places infected Order of into other Countries, and from thence imported into Great Britain, or the Ships, shall be Iflands aforefaid ; be it enacted, That all fuch Goods and Merchandize as fhall be particularly specified for that Purpose in any Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection as aforefaid, which shall be brought or imported into any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, from any Foreign Country or Place, in any Ship or Veffel whatever, and the Ships or Veffels in which the fame fhall be brought, and alfo all Ships and Veffels which shall arrive from any Port or Place whatever under any alarming or fufpicious Circumstances as to Infection, shall be fubject and liable to fuch Regulations and Reftrictions as shall be made by fuch Order or Orders of His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid, refpecting the fame.

XII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the The Privy Lords and others of His Majefty's Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, to make fuch Order as they shall fee necessary and expedient Orders as upon any unforeseen Emergency, or in any particular Case or Cases, with think necesrespect to any Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels, arriving and having any Emergencies. infectious Disease or Distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious Difease or Diftemper may have appeared in the course of the Voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or fufpicious Circumstances

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as to Infection, although fuch Ship or Ships, Veffel or Veffels, shall not have come from any Place or Places from which His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague or any fuch infectious Difease or Distemper may be brought, and also with respect to the Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, on board the fame; and in cafe of any infectious Difeafe or Diftemper appearing or breaking out in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid, to make fuch Orders, and give fuch Directions, in order to cut off all Communication between any Perfons infected with any fuch Difeafe or Diftemper and the reft of His Majefty's Subjects, as shall appear to the faid Lords or others of His Majefty's Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, to be neceffary and expedient for that Purpofe, and likewife to make fuch Orders as they shall fee fit for shortening the Time of Quarantine to be performed by particular Ships or Veffels, or particular Perfons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or any other Articles, or for wholly releafing particular Ships or Veffels, or particular Perfons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or other Articles from Quarantine, abfolutely or conditionally, and generally to mitigate the first Performance of Quarantine in particular Cafes, as special Circumstances shall appear in their Judgment to require : and all fuch Orders fo made by the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any Three or more of them as aforefaid, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purpofes (as well with respect to the Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge of any fuch Ship or Veffel, and all other Perfons on board the fame, as with refpect to any other Perfons having any Intercourfe or Communication with them, and to the Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punifhments to which they may refpectively become liable) as any Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection as aforefaid, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette.

And be it further enacted, That if the Plague or fuch other in- Regulations for Veffels in fectious Difeafe or Diftemper as aforefaid shall appear on board any Ship or Veffel within the Streights of Gibraltar, the Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having Charge thereof, shall immediately proceed to fome one of the Foreign Lazarets, and there perform Quarantine, until fuch Time as the Land Lazaret to be erected as aforefaid fhall by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, and by Order of the fame notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette, have been declared to be fit for the due Performance of Quarantine therein; but if fuch Plague or other fuch infectious Difease or Diftemper as aforesaid shall appear on board any Ship or Veffel without the Streights of Gibraltar, then the Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge or Command thereof, shall (unlefs fuch Land Lazaret shall have been to declared to be fit for the due Performance of Quarantine therein) immediately proceed to the Harbour of Saint Helen's Tean and North Withel, being Two of the Islands commonly called The Iflands of Scilly, or to fuch other Place as His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, fhall from Time to Time direct and appoint ; where being arrived he fhall make known his Cafe to fome Officer of the Cuftoms there, who fhall'immediately acquaint the Governor, Deputy Governor, or other principal Magistrate thereof, and also the principal Officer of the Customs at some Port in England near thereunto; and the faid principal Officer of the Cuftoms at fuch near Port in England shall with all possible Speed fend Intelligence thereof to the Commissioners of the Customs in the Port of London; and the faid Governor, Deputy Governor, or other principal Magistrate shall in like Manner, with all possible Speed, fend Intelligence thereof to the Privy Council, to the end that fuch Meafures may be taken for the Comfort and Support of the Crew and Paffengers on board fuch Ship fo infected, and fuch Precautions ufed to prevent the fpreading of the Infection, as the Cafe shall require; and the faid Ship or Vessel shall there remain until Directions shall be given relative thereto by the Lords or others

XIV. And be it further enacted, That every Commander, Master, or other Person having the Charge of any Ship or Vessel liable to the Performance of Quarantine, shall be and is hereby required, at all Times when such Ship or Vessel shall meet with any other Ship or Vessel at Sea, or shall be within Four Leagues of the Coast of Great Britain or Ireland, or the Islands of Guernsfey, Jersfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, to hoist a Signal to denote

denote that his Ship or Veffel is liable to the Performance of Quarantine, which Signal shall be, in the Day Time, if the faid Ship or Vessel shall have a clean Bill of Health, a large yellow Flag of Six Breadths of Bunting at the Main-topmaft Head; and if fuch Ship or Veffel fhall not have a clean Bill of Health, then a like yellow Flag, with a circular Mark or Ball entirely Black in the Middle thereof, whofe Diameter shall be equal to Two Breadths of Bunting; and in the Night Time the Signal shall in both Cafes be a large Signal Lanthorn, with a Light therein (fuch as is commonly used on board His Majesty's Ships of War), at the same Mast-head ; and fuch Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon shall keep fuch Signals respectively, as the Cafe shall be, hoisted during such Time as the faid Ship shall continue within Sight of such other Ship or Veffel, or within Four Leagues of the faid Coafts or Iflands, and while fo in Sight, or within fuch Diftance, until fuch Ship or Veffel fo liable to Quarantine as aforefaid shall have arrived at the Port or Place where it is to perform Quarantine, and until it shall have been legally discharged from the Performance thereof; on Failure whereof fuch Commander, Master, or other Perfon having Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel fo liable to the Performance of Quarantine, shall forfeit and pay for every fuch Offence the Sum of Two hundred Pounds.

And be it further enacted, That if any Commander, Master, or Penalty of other Perfon having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Veffel, and fons hoifting knowing that the fame is not liable to the Performance of Quarantine, not liable. shall hoift fuch Signals as aforefaid, or either of them, by Day or Night respectively, fuch Commander, Master, or other Person as aforefaid shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Two hundred Pounds,

XXI. And whereas Difobedience or refractory Behaviour in Perfons Forpunishing under Quarantine, or liable to the Performance of Quarantine, or in other or refractory Perfons who may have had any Intercourfe or Communication with them, may be attended with very great Danger to His Majefty's Subjects; be it or liable to further enacted, That all Perfons liable to perform Quarantine, and all or Perfons Perfons having had any Intercourfe or Communication with them, whether in Ships or in a Lazaret or elfewhere, fhall be fubject, during the faid Quarantine, or during the Time they shall be liable to Quarantine, to fuch Orders as they shall receive from the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Afliftant, or from the principal Officer of the Cuftoms at any Port or Place where there is no fuch Superintendant or Affiftant, or from any other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized as aforefaid to act in that Behalf; and the faid Officers are hereby empowered and required to enforce all neceffary Obedience to the faid Orders, and in cafe of Neceffity to call in others to their Affiftance, and all Perfons fo called in are hereby required to affift accordingly; and fuch Officers shall and they are hereby empowered and required to compel all Perfons liable to perform Quarantine as aforefaid, and Perfons having had any Intercourfe or Communication with them, to repair to fuch Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place, and to caufe all Goods, Wares, and Merchaudize, and other Articles comprized within any fuch Orders to be made as last aforefaid, to be conveyed to fuch Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place duly appointed in that Behalf, in fuch Manner and according to fuch Directions as shall be made by Order of His Majesty in Council as aforefaid, or of the Lords and others

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of the Privy Council, or of any Three or more of them ; and if any Perfon or Perfons liable to perform Quarantine as aforefaid, or any Perfon or Perfons having had any Intercourfe or Communication with him, her, or them, fhall wilfully refuse or neglect to repair forthwith, when required and directed fo to do by fuch Officer as aforefaid, to the faid Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place duly appointed in that Behalf, or having been placed in the faid Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place, shall escape or attempt to escape out of the fame before Quarantine duly performed, it shall and may be lawful to and for the faid Quarantine Officers, and alfo the Watchmen and other Perfons appointed to fee Quarantine performed, and each of them, and they are hereby respectively required, by fuch neceffary Force as the Cafe shall require, to compel every such Person so refusing or neglecting as aforefaid, and every fuch Perfon fo escaping or attempting to escape as aforefaid, to repair or return to fuch Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place fo appointed as aforefaid; and every Perfon fo refufing or neglecting to repair forthwith, as aforefaid, to the faid Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place, and also every Perfon actually escaping as aforefaid, shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and fuffer Death as in Cafes of Felony without Benefit of Clergy.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for any Constable, Headborough, Tithingman, or other Peace Officer, or any other tine, &c. may Perfon, to feize and apprehend any Perfon that shall, contrary to the Provisions of this Act, have quitted or come on Shore from any Ship or Veffel liable to perform Quarantine, or who shall have escaped from or quitted any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, or from any Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place, appointed in that Behalf, for the Purpole of carrying fuch Perfon before any Justice of the Peace or Magistrate; and it shall be lawful for any fuch Justice of the Peace or Magistrate to grant his Warrant for the apprehending and conveying of any fuch Perfon to the Ship or Veffel from which he or fhe fhall have come on Shore, or to any Ship or Veffel performing

performing Quarantine, or Lazaret, from which he or fhe shall have escaped, or for the confining of any fuch Perfon in any fuch Place of fafe Cuftody (not being any public Gaol), and under fuch Reftrictions, as to having any Communication with any other Perfons, as may, in the Difcretion of any Justice of the Peace or Magistrate (calling to his Aid, if he shall see fit, any medical Person), appear to be proper, until such Perfon can be fafely and fecurely conveyed to fome Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, or until Directions can be obtained from the Privy Council as to the Difpofal of any fuch Perfon, and to make any further Order, or grant any further Warrant, that may be neceffary in that Behalf.

XXV. And whereas Orders have been given by the Lords of His Ma- Orders in jefty's Privy Council for Perfons on Shore, who had Intercourfe with the fending afloat Crew and Paffengers of a Veffel coming from a Place from whence it was judged that there was Danger of Infection being brought, to be fent afloat for the Performance of Quarantine, in like Manner with fuch Crew and courfe with a Paffengers; be it enacted, That fuch Orders fo iffued as aforefaid by the whichDanger Lords of His Majefty's Privy Council, for the Prevention of Infection, shall be taken and confidered to have been and are hereby declared to be good and valid in Law; and all Perfons who may have been concerned in ad- Advifers, &c. vifing, iffuing, or carrying into Execution the faid Orders, or any of them, fhall be and are hereby indemnified for the fame, and fhall be and are hereby freed and discharged from all Actions, Suits, or other Proceedings, which have been or fhall be brought and commenced against them, for or on account or by reafon of the faid Orders, or any of them, or of any other Matter or Thing done in purfuance thereof.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That if any Officer of His Majefty's Penalty on Cuftoms, or any other Officer or Perfon whatfoever to whom it doth or bezzling shall appertain to execute any Order or Orders made or to be made concerning Quarantine, or the Prevention of Infection, and notified as rantine, neg-

And be it further enacted, That all Offences committed contrary to Where Ofor in Breach or Violation of this or any other Act hereafter to be paffed, fences may be tried. or of any Order or Orders of His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, now or hereafter to be made in His or their Privy Council, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette, or of any Order or Orders made by Three or more of the Lords or others of the Privy Council as aforefaid, whether the faid Offence shall be done and committed within the Body of any County or upon the High Seas or elfewhere, shall and may be tried, heard, and determined in any County within England or Scotland, or in the proper Courts of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man respectively.

XLIII. And be it further enacted, That if any Action or Suit shall be commenced against any Perfon or Perfons for any Thing done in purfuance and Execution of this prefent Act, or of any Order of Council made by virtue thereof, the Defendant or Defendants in fuch Action or Suit may plead the General Iffue, and give this Act and the Special General Iffue. Matter in Evidence at any Trial to be had thereupon, and that the fame

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
was done in purfuance and in Execution of the faid Act; and if it shall appear fo to have been done, then the Jury shall find for the Defendant or Defendants; and if the Plaintiff shall be nonfuited, or difcontinue his Action after the Defendant or Defendants shall have appeared, or if Judgement shall have been given upon any Verdict or Demurer against Treble Cofts. the Plaintiff, the Defendant or Defendants shall and may recover Treble Cofts, and have the like Remedy for the fame as the Defendant or De-Limitation of fendants hath or have in other Cafes by Law; and that no fuch Action or Suit shall be brought against any Person for any Matter or Thing done in purfuance or Execution of this Act, but within the Space of Two Months after fuch Matter or Thing shall have been done.

Commencement of Act, which may be altered or repealed this Seffion.

XLIV. And be it further enacted. That this Act shall commence and take Effect, except as is herein-before otherwife provided, on the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, and may be altered, varied, or repealed by any Act or Acts to be made in this prefent Seffion of Parliament.

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine, it is amongst other Things enacted, That, from and after the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as all others, coming from or having touched at any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, shall have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague or any other infectious Difeafe or Diftemper, highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, may be brought, and all Ships, Veffels, and Boats receiving any Perfon, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any Ships or Veffels fo coming from or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, whether fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles, shall have come or been brought in such Ships or Vessels, or fuch Perfons shall have gone, or Articles have been put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships or Veffels at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and whether fuch Ships or Veffels were or were not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands

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aforefaid;

aforefaid; and that all Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any Articles whatever, on board any fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or on board of any fuch Receiving Ships, Veflels, or Boats as aforefaid, shall be and be confidered to be liable to Quarantine within the Meaning of the faid Act, and of any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, from the Time of the Departure of fuch Ships or Veffels from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or from the Time when fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles shall have been received on board respectively; and that such Ships, Veffels, and Boats as aforefaid, and all Perfons (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or going or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid; and all Per. fons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, on board any fuch Receiving Ship, Veffel, or Boat as aforefaid, fhall, upon their Arrival at any fuch Port or Place, be obliged to perform Quarantine in fuch Place or Places, for fuch Time and in fuch Manner as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from fuch Quarantine, no fuch Perfon, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or other Articles as aforefaid, or any of them, shall, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, come or be brought on Shore, or go

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or

or be put on board any other Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to come or be brought on Shore, in any fuch Port or Place, although fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid may not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, unlefs in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, whether coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, and all Perfons (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, or going or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Iflands aforefaid, and although fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, fhall not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid; and that all Commanders, Mafters, or other Perfons having the Charge or Command of any fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, whether coming from any infected Place, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine, as aforefaid, fhall be fubject to all the Provisions, Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions contained in the faid Act, or in any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, and to all the Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments contained in the faid Act, for any Breach or Difobedience thereof, or of any Order or Orders of His Majefty in Council made under the Authority thereof.

And it is likewife enacted by the faid Act, That whereas certain Sorts of Goods and Merchandize are more especially liable to retain Infection, and may be brought from Places infected into other Countries, and from thence imported into Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, all fuch Goods and Merchandize as shall be particularly specified for that Purpose in any Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council,

concerning

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concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection as aforefaid, which fhall be brought or imported into any Port or Place in *Great Britain*, or the Iflands aforefaid, from any Foreign Country or Place, in any Ship or Veffel whatever, and the Ships or Veffels in which the fame fhall be brought, fhall be fubject and liable to fuch Regulations and Reftrictions as fhall be made by fuch Order or Orders of His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid, refpecting the fame.

Adjudication of the Places from whence the Veffels, Perfons, and Goods, by which the Plague or other infectious Difeafe may be brought into Great Britain, &c.

His Majesty, under the Authority of the faid above-recited Act, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby adjudge and declare it probable that the Plague, or fome other infectious Difeafe or Diftemper, highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, may be brought into Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, by Ships or Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, with or without clean Bills of Mealth, and alfo by the Importation into Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, of certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, herein-after enumerated, being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, from any Port or Place in Europe without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular Establishment for the Performance of Quarantine, which shall have been declared fufficient for that Purpole by any Order of His Majesty in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered,

What Quarantine to be performed by Ships, &c. coming from fuch Places with clean

I. That all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as all others, (not having the Plague or fuch other infectious Difeafe or Diftemper as aforefaid actually on board), coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Weft Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, with clean

clean Bills of Health, and all Ships, Veffels, and Boats receiving any Bills of Perfon or Perfons, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, Packets, Packages, by Ships re-Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any fuch Ship or Veffel, before fuch Ship or Veffel shall have performed and shall be duly discharged from Quarantine, same, and by whether fuch Perfon or Perfons, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or other who shall Articles as aforefaid shall have come or been brought in fuch Ship or Intercourse Veffel, or fuch Perfon or Perfons shall have gone, or Articles have been put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ship therewith. or Vefiel, and whether fuch Ship or Veffel was or was not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, shall, together with all Perfons (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid on board thereof, perform fuch Quarantine, for fuch Time, in fuch Manner, and at fuch Places as are herein-after directed : And all Commanders, Mafters, and other Perfons on board any fuch Ship, Veffel, or Boat fo liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, and all Perfons who fhall have any Intercourfe or Communication with them or any of them, shall forthwith repair to fuch Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place, as is herein appointed, or shall hereafter be appointed in that Behalf, by any Order of His Majefty in Council as aforefaid, or of the Lords and others of the Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, for the Performance of Quarantine; and shall there perform Quarantine accordingly, under and subject to all the Pains, Penalties, Fines, Forfeitures, and Punishments, as well Pains of Death as others, to which any fuch Commander, Mafter, or Perfon is or may be by Law fubject for any Refufal or Neglect to repair to fuch Lazaret, Ship, Veffel, or Place as aforefaid, or for any Escape or Attempt to escape therefrom, or for any other Breach or Disobedience of the Provisions, Rules, and Regulations of the faid herein-before recited Act, or of this Order, or of any Orders which may hereafter be made as aforefaid.

Goods coming in fuch Ships to be opened and aired. III. And it is hereby further ordered, That all Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes imported in any fuch Ships or Veffels as aforefaid, fhall be opened and aired at the feveral Places herein-before refpectively appointed for the Performance of Quarantine by fuch Ships and Veffels refpectively, in the Manner and for the Time herein-after directed.

At what Places Ships coming without clean Bills of Health are to perform Quarantine.

IV. And it is hereby further ordered, That all Merchant Ships and Veffels, and all other Ships and Veffels not having the Plague, or fuch other infectious Difease or Distemper as aforefaid actually on board, (except any Ship of War, Transport, or other Ship in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of a Commissioned Officer of His Majesty's Navy), coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, which shall not be furnished with clean Bills of Health, shall perform Quarantine in Standgate Creek, and no where elfe: And in cafe any fuch Merchant or other Ship or Veffel as aforefaid, coming from any of the Places before defcribed, and not furnished with a clean Bill of Health, shall come or attempt to enter into any of the Out Ports of Great Britain, or any of the Islands aforefaid, the principal and other Officer of the Cuftoms at fuch Port, or in fuch Islands, or the Governor or Chief Magistrate thereof, shall caufe fuch Ship or Veffel to depart from thence immediately, and proceed to Standgate Creek to perform Quarantine; and all Ships of War, Transports, and other Ships in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of Commissioned Officers of His Majesty's Navy, coming from any of the faid Places, and not being furnished with clean Bills of Health, fhall

shall perform Quarantine at the Motherbank, in a separate and distinct Place, to be appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys for that Purpofe, in the Centre of which Place a Floating Lazaret, moored with Chains, shall be stationed, with a Yellow Flag constantly flying at the Mast Head; and all Ships, Vessels, and Boats receiving any Person, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any Ships or Veffels fo coming from any of the faid Places without clean Bills of Health as aforefaid, shall perform the like Quarantine at Standgate Creek or at the Motherbank respectively, in the fame Manner as if fuch receiving Ships, Veffels, or Boats had come from any of the faid Places without clean Bills of Health.

V. And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Veffels coming What Quafrom any Port or Place in Europe without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular Establishment for the Performance of Quarantine declared fufficient by His Majefty in Council of Turkey, as aforefaid, and having on board any of the Articles enumerated in the Port in First Class herein-after stated, being the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean; and all Ships, Veffels, tinent of and Boats receiving any of the faid Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or to perform. other Articles as aforefaid, from or out of the faid Ships or Veffels, shall, together with all Perfons (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and all Articles on board thereof, perform the fame Quarantine, for fuch Time, in fuch Manner, and at fuch Places respectively as is herein directed with respect to Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, with clean Bills of Health.

VI. Provided always, That in cafe it shall happen that any Ship or Ships having Veffel being liable to Quarantine, and having a clean Bill of Health on paffed their regular Qua-

in certain Cafes, to perform Quarantine at fome other Quarantine Port.

Regulations as to Ships not bound to Great Britain arriving or touching at any Port for Orders, or in Diftrefs.

VII. And it is hereby further ordered, That no Ship or Veffel liable to Quarantine, not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, shall touch at or attempt to enter any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, (whether fuch Port or Place shall have been appointed for the Performance of Quarantine or not), except for Orders, or in confequence of Strefs of Weather, or any Damage, Lofs, or Accidents of the Seas (the Circumstances and Necessity of which shall be proved upon Oath as aforefaid, to the Satisfaction of the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or of the principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized to act in that Behalf); and that the Commanders

And it is hereby further ordered, That on the Arrival of any Ship or Veffel liable to Quarantine, in any Port or Place hereby appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or, in cafe of fuch Superintendant and his Affiftant being otherwife neceffarily engaged, the principal Officer of His Majefty's Cuftoms at fuch Port or Place, or fuch Officer of the Cuftoms as fhall be duly authorized to act in that Behalf, (together with the Medical Attendant, in fuch Cafes as fhall be thought to require his Affiftance), fhall go alongfide fuch Ship or Veffel in a Boat (keeping to Windward), and fhall fee the Officers, Crew, and all other Perfons belonging to or being on board fuch Ship or Veffel muftered on the Gangway, and the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or fuch principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized as aforefaid, fhall then and there, in the Prefence of the Crew, put the following Queftions to the Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having Charge of the Ship or Veffel :

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X. And it is further ordered, That the Anfwers to the aforefaid Queftions shall be taken down in Writing, and the Commander, Master, or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel shall solemnly make Oath to the Truth thereof before the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, or the principal or other Officer of the Customs authorized as aforefaid (as the Cafe may be), and fuch Superintendant of Quarantine or his Aflistant, or fuch principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms as aforefaid (with the Advice of the Medical Attendant, if fuch Advice shall be judged necessary), shall, according to the Answers returned to the Questions herein-before set forth, then appoint a proper Place or Station for fuch Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel, to repair to with fuch Ship or Veffel; who thereupon

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upon shall as foon as possible, after having answered the foregoing Queftions, repair with fuch Ship or Veffel to fuch Place or Station, where the faid Ship or Veffel shall be forthwith placed, and shall there perform Quarantine accordingly; the faid Commander or Master, or other Person having the Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel, carrying with him the Log Book, Manifest, and all the Ship's Papers, all of which he shall there deliver to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or to the principal or other Officer of the Customs authorized as aforefaid (as the Cafe may be), the faid Log Book, Manifest, and Papers having been first immerfed in Vinegar and fumigated; and fuch Commander, Master, or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel, shall there folemnly make Oath to the Truth of the Contents of fuch Log Book, to the best of his Recollection and Belief, or shall state and specify upon Oath in what Particulars alone the fame or any Part thereof is falfe and incorrect, and whether every particular Entry therein was made as foon after the Fact as possible; and if not, for what Reason it was delayed, and when it was made; and alfo to the Truth of all the other Ship's Papers, before fuch Superintendant or his Affistant, or the principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized as aforefaid, and shall obey and conform to all fuch Directions as he shall then receive touching the Performance of Quarantine from fuch Superintendant or his Affiftant, or the principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized as aforefaid.

XI. And it is hereby further ordered, That in the Cafe of Ships or If fufpicious Veffels liable to Quarantine arriving at any of the Ports of Great stances ap-Britain or Islands aforefaid, if any fuspicious Circumstances shall appear in the Anfwers returned to the faid Questions by the Commander or Master, or other Perfon having Charge of any fuch Ship or Veffel, or from any other Circumstance, the proper Officer of the Customs at fuch Port or missioners of Island shall immediately transmit fuch Answers, and give Notice of the Caufe of fuch Sufpicion to the Lords of His Majefty's most Honourable Veffel to be Privy Council, and the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, and shall, Station dif-

And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Veffels liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, and being furnished with clean Bills of Health, as well as the Crews and Paffengers on board the fame, shall perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days, in the Manner heretofore practifed; which Quarantine shall commence from the Time when fuch Part of the Cargo, if any, as is enumerated in Two Claffes herein-after stated, shall have been delivered into the Floating Lazaret in Standgate Creek, or into the Lazaret to be erected at Chetney Hill, in cafe the Ship or Veffel fhall perform Quarantine in Standgate Creek; or into Lighters, or other proper Veffels appointed for the Purpofe, in cafe the Ship or Veffel shall perform Quarantine at any of the Places herein-before appointed for the Performance thereof by Ships bound to any of the Out Ports or Islands aforefaid; but in Cafes where no Part of the Cargo shall confift of fuch Goods as are last described, then such Quarantine of Fisteen Days shall commence on the Day on which the Mafter or other Perfon having Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel shall have arrived with fuch Ship or Veffel at the Station fo appointed as aforefaid.

What Quarantine Goods coming from the Mediterranean, &c. with clean Bills of Health, fhall perform. The nonenumerated Goods fhall be aired One Week.

XIII. And it is hereby further ordered, with refpect to all Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes coming from or through the *Mediterranean*, or from the *Weft Barbary* on the *Atlantic* Ocean, in Ships or Veffels furnifhed with clean Bills of Health, That all fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, other than fuch as are enumerated in the faid Firft and Second Claffes herein-after ftated, fhall be aired and treated on board the Ship or Veffel in which they fhall arrive according to the Manner heretofore practified refpecting fuch Goods imported in Ships and Veffels furnifhed with clean Bills of Health, and fhall continue to be fo treated for

and

and during the Space of One Week; and all fuch Goods, Wares, and The enume-Merchandizes as are enumerated in the faid First and Second Classes to be Fifteen herein-after stated, fo coming in Ships or Vessels with clean Bills of Days. And it is hereby further ordered, with refpect to all Goods, What Qua-Wares, and Merchandizes, and other Articles as aforefaid, brought or Goods imimported in Ships and Veffels not having the Plague or other infectious ported in Ships not Difeafe or Diftemper as aforefaid actually on board, and which may arrive furnished in any of the Ports of Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid, coming Bills of from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the perform. Atlantic Ocean, not being furnished with clean Bills of Health, That fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid (fuch Ship or Veffel having first repaired to Standgate Creek as herein before directed), shall perform Quarantine either in the Floating Lazaret there, or in the Land Lazaret at Cheiney Hill, and nowhere elfe, in the Manner and for the Time herein-after mentioned.

XV. And it is hereby further ordered, That immediately after the Two Quaran-Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having Charge of every fuch Ship dians to be or Veffel fo arriving without a clean Bill of Health, fhall have undergone the Veffel. the Examination herein before directed, and shall have arrived with his Ship or Veffel at the Station fo appointed as aforefaid, Two Quarantine Guardians shall be placed on board fuch Ship or Veffel by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant.

The Manner of conveying Letters to and from the Veffel. In Cafes where fuch Perfons shall perform Quarantine in the Lazaret at Chetney Hill, an Officer appointed by the Superintendant of Quarantine fhall daily go to a proper Place, to be appointed by the faid Superintendant of Quarantine, for the Receipt of Letters from Perfons under Quarantine; and in Cafes where fuch Perfons shall perform Quarantine in a Floating Lazaret, or in a feparate Veffel, an Office Boat, not under Quarantine, with an Officer appointed by the Superintendant of Quarantine, shall in like Manner daily at a fixed Hour go round the faid Lazaret or Veffel to receive fuch Letters, the ufual Precaution of dipping fuch Letters in Vinegar, and putting them into the fumigating Box, being always first observed; and fuch Letters shall remain in the fumigating Box until fuch Time as the Superintendant shall give Directions for taking them out to be forwarded, and no Perfon except the faid Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, or one of the Guardians on board the Ship or Veffel, shall be permitted to deliver fuch Letters from fuch fumigating Box; and the faid Perfons fo hereby authorized to deliver the fame shall take Care, where several Letters or Papers are, inclosed together, to flit open the Covers in Manner practifed in the Lazarets of the Mediterranean.

No Communication or Conference to be had with Perfons under Quarantine, except by Permiffion, or in the Prefence of the Superintendant.

And all Letters to fuch Perfons fo under Quarantine fhall be delivered to the Superintendant or his Affiftant, and fhall be diftributed by him or according to his Directions, and no Communication or Conference fhall be had by Perfons not under Quarantine with Perfons fo under Quarantine, except by Permiffion, or in the Prefence of the Superintendant or his Affiftant, and under fuch Regulations and Reftrictions as fhall be directed by the faid Superintendant; nor in Cafes where fuch Perfons fhall perform Quarantine on board any Ship or Veffel, unlefs from the Boat of the Superintendant or his Affiftant, One of whom fhall always, and in all

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all Cafes, be prefent during fuch Communication and Conference; and fuch Communication and Conference shall be had at the Distance observed by the Superintendant or his Affiftant in their ufual Communication with Ships and Perfons under Quarantine.

XVII. And it is hereby further ordered, That a Night Watch shall be A Night regularly kept, and a fufficient Number of Guard Boats and Officers shall kept to prebe appointed, for the Purpofe of preventing all clandestine Communica- munication. tion between Perfons in the Lazaret and those in the Hospital or Peft Houfe at Chetney Hill, or other Place that may be there provided for the Reception of Perfons afflicted with any infectious Difeafe; or between Perfons in the Floating Lazaret either at Standgate Creek or elfewhere, and Perfons in any Hofpital Ship, or any Place that may be provided for the Reception of Perfons afflicted with any infectious Difease as aforefaid ; or between Perfons in fuch Floating Lazaret, Hofpital Ship, or Place fo provided as aforefaid, and those in Ships and Veffels under Quarantine; or between Perfons in Ships and Veffels under Quarantine and those in any other Ship, Veffel, or Boat, or on Shore; and fuch Guard Boats shall row guard all Night; and Sentinels with loaded Mufkets, and fmall Pieces of Ordnance loaded with Grape or Canifter Shot, fhall be conftantly ftationed on the most commanding Parts of the Lazaret at Chetney Hill, or of the Floating Lazaret at Standgate Creek, or elfewhere; and no Houfes or other Buildings shall be erected at or near the Beach near Chetney Hill, other than those belonging to the faid Lazaret; and that all Boats ing to Floatbelonging to any Floating Lazaret, when not on neceffary Duty, shall be when not on always either on board the fame, or fastened thereto by Chains with strong Padlocks, the Keys of which shall be lodged in the Custody of a Perfon to be appointed for that Purpofe by the Superintendant ; and all the Boats thereto with belonging to Ships or Veffels under Quarantine, either at Standgate Creek Boats beor at the Out Ports, shall be taken from them, and no Use made of such Boats, except for the Purpole of carrying Goods to the Lazaret, or upon

And it is hereby further ordered, That the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or fome other proper Perfon appointed by the Superintendant, fhall, as often as required, afford Affiftance and provide Neceffaries for the Perfons in the Lazaret at *Chetney Hill*, or in any Floating Lazaret or Hofpital Ship, and alfo for thofe on board the Ships and Veffels under Quarantine, taking Care to allow of no improper Communication with the Perfons employed for that Purpofe; which Perfons fhall always place their Boats to windward, and fhall deliver by Means of Buckets the Articles fupplied by them.

XIX. And it is hereby further ordered, That the Quarantine Guardians, who shall be placed on board Ships and Veffels not furnished with clean Bills of Health, shall be instructed to take especial Care that nothing whatever be delivered from on board fuch Ships or Veffels when under Quarantine, without an Order in Writing from the Superintendant or his Affiftant, every fuch Order to be entered in a Book by One of the faid Guardians, and the Original to be delivered back to the Superintendant or his Affiftant; and nothing, however little fufceptible it may be thought to be of Infection, shall be conveyed from one Ship or Veffel under Quarantine to another, nor any perfonal Intercourfe be permitted from any fuch Ship or Veffel to another; and One of the Quarantine Guardians, when thereto required by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, shall accompany the Lighters and Boats which shall be employed in passing to or from the Ship or Veffel on board of which fuch Guardians are placed, during the Paffage of fuch Lighters and Boats to and from fuch Ship or Veffel, in order to prevent any Communication in the Transit of the Cargo from 7

Cafes of Paper, Books, Parchment, Cafes of Sponges, and Silk and Thread Stockings, fhall be entirely unpacked, and the fmaller Parcels feparated from each other, and fo difpofed as to admit of thorough airing. Feathers,

Feathers, Straw Hats, Artificial Flowers, Coral Beads in String, Brufhes, Ihall be fpread out in the fame Manner. Carpets, Furs, Hides and Skins,

shall be unbaled, and each Piece shall be spread and suspended on Cords, fometimes in the open Air, and frequently turned.

All Goods packed in or with Straw, Cotton, or any other Article enumerated in the faid First Class, or confidered as fusceptible, shall be entirely taken out of or separated from the same, and carefully aired.

All Goods enumerated in the faid First Class, concerning the Expurgation of which no particular Directions have been herein-before given, shall be unpacked, opened, aired, and handled in like Manner, so far as may be, as is herein before directed with regard to Goods of a similar Description.

XXXV. And it is hereby further ordered, That of the Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes which shall be imported in any Ship or Vessel arriving as above mentioned, and not furnished with clean Bills of Health, the Articles herein-after enumerated in Class the Second shall in like Manner be carried to a Floating Lazaret, or to the Lazaret at *Chetney Hill*, there to be unpacked, opened, or treated according to the Nature thereof, and aired for the Space of Thirty Days; viz.

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the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular Establishment for the Performance of Quarantine, declared fufficient by His Majefty in Council as aforefaid, the Mafter or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel is hereby required to bring with him a Declaration made and attefted in like Manner as the Declaration before mentioned, in which it shall be stated whether the faid enumerated Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes were imported into the Ports of the Countries laft mentioned in a Ship or Veffel with or without a clean Bill of Health; and fuch Mafter or other Perfon having the Charge of any fuch Ship or Veffel, if the fame shall be bound to the Port of London, or to the River of Thames or Medway, shall forthwith produce fuch Declaration or Declarations (as the Cafe may be) to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant at Standgate Creek ; or if the fame shall be bound to any of the Out Ports or Iflands aforefaid, to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or to the principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized to act in that Behalf at fuch Out Port or Place; and if it shall appear that none of the faid enumerated Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes on board fuch Ship or Veffel are of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, fuch Ship or Veffel importing the fame shall not be obliged to perform Quarantine, but shall, on Production of fuch Declaration to the Superintendant or his Affistant, or to the principal or other Officer of the Customs as aforefaid, be admitted to an Entry in the usual and legal Manner; but if it shall appear that fuch enumerated Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes, or any Part thereof, are of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of any of the Countries last mentioned, or if no fuch Declaration shall be produced by the Master or other Person having the Charge of such Ship or Veffel as aforefaid, then the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or the principal or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized to act in that Behalf as aforefaid, at the Port or Place at which fuch Ship or Veffel shall arrive.

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





C A P. XCVIII.

An Act for making additional and further Provisions for the effectual Performance of Quarantine in *Great Britain.* [16th July 1806.]

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the Forty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for making further 45 G 3.c. 10. Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine, certain Signals are directed to be used on board of Ships or Veffels having clean Bills of Health, and certain other Signals on board of Ships or Veffels not having clean Bills of Health, and it will be more conducive to the public Safety that a Third Signal fhould be used on board of Ships or Veffels having the Plague or other infectious Difease or Diftemper highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects actually on board; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, Signal to be ufed by Ships That from and after the Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hun- having the Plague, &c. dred and fix, every Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the actually on board. Charge

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Charge of any Ship or Veffel on board whereof the Plague or other infectious Difease or Diftemper highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects shall actually be, shall be and is hereby required, at all Times when fuch Ship or Veffel shall meet with any other Ship or Veffel at Sea, or shall be within Four Leagues of the Coast of Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, to hoist a Signal to denote that his Ship or Veffel has the Plague or other infectious Difeafe or Diftemper highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefly's Subjects actually on board thereof, which Signal shall be in the Day Time a Flag of Yellow and Black, borne quarterly of Eight Breadths of Bunting at the Main Top-mast Head, and in the Night Time the Signal shall be Two large Signal Lanthorns (fuch as are commonly used on board of His Majesty's Ships of War) one over the other at the same Mast Head; and fuch Commander, Master, or other Person shall keep such Signal hoisted during fuch Time as the faid Ship or Veffel fo having the Plague or fuch other infectious Difease or Distemper as aforesaid on board thereof shall continue within Sight of fuch other Ship or Veffel, or within Four Leagues of the faid Coafts or Iflands, and while fo in Sight, or within fuch Diftance until fuch Ship or Veffel fo having the Plague or fuch other infectious Difease or Distemper as aforesaid on board thereof shall have arrived at the Port or Place where it is to perform Quarantine, and until it shall have been legally difcharged from the Performance thereof; on failure whereof fuch Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel, shall forfeit and pay for every fuch Offence the Sum of Two hundred Pounds.

Mafter to deliver Account of Cargo to Pilot on Penalty of 200l.

II. And whereas it is by the faid recited Act enacted, that every Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge of any Ship or Veffel coming from Foreign Parts, shall give to the Pilot who shall go on board fuch Ship or Veffel a written Paper containing a true Account of the Names of the Place and Country at which ship or Veffel shall have loaded,

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loaded, and alfo of all the Places at which any fuch Ship or Veffel fhall have touched on the homeward Voyage: And whereas Ships and Veffels are or may be, by the Order of His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council, made liable to Quarantine by reafon of their having on board thereof certain Sorts of Goods and Merchandize more efpecially liable to retain Infection; and it is expedient that the Pilot going on board of fuch Ships and Veffels should also be informed of the Cargo thereof; be it therefore enacted, That from and after the faid Tenth Day of October every Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge of any Ship or Veffel coming from Foreign Parts, which shall not be liable to Quarantine in respect of the Place from whence such Ship or Veffel comes, shall give to the Pilot who shall go on board of fuch Ship or Veffel a written Paper containing a true Account of the different Articles composing the Cargo of fuch Ship or Veffel, on pain of forfeiting the Sum of Two hundred Pounds for any Neglect or Refufal to give fuch Paper, or for any falle Representation or wilful Omiffion therein; and if by any Proclamation or Pilot to give Order of His Majefty in Council then in force, Ships and Veffels having on board any of the Articles mentioned in fuch Paper shall be liable to the Performance of Quarantine, fuch Pilot shall immediately give Notice on Penalty of thereof to the Commander or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel, on pain of forfeiting the Sum of One hundred Pounds for any Neglect therein; and fuch Commander or other Perfon shall thereupon hoift a proper Signal according to the Provisions of the faid recited Act, and under the refpective Penalties in the faid recited Act or in this Act contained for any Neglect or Refufal in refpect of hoifting fuch Signals; and in cafe any Pilot shall bring or cause to be brought or conducted any Ship or Veffel liable to the Performance of Quarantine into any Place which is not or fhall not be fpecially appointed for the Reception of Ships and Veffels to liable, after receiving fuch Paper as aforefaid, whereby it shall have been made appear that fuch Ship or Veffel was liable to the Performance of Quarantine, or without requiring and receiving

Notice if any Articles be on board liable toQuarantine, 100l. &c.

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ceiving fuch Paper as aforefaid, unlefs compelled thereto by Strefs of Weather, adverfe Winds, or Accidents of the Seas, fuch Pilots shall for every fuch Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of One hundred Pounds.

Penalty on Pilot or Mafter for not bringing-to on Requeft of Quarantine Officer.

III. And whereas by the faid recited Act Provision is made for afcertaining whether Ships and Veffels be liable to Quarantine by means of interrogating the Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ships or Veffels, for which Purpofe it is neceffary that Ships or Veffels fhould be brought to at the Requisition of the Officer of Quarantine, which falutary Provision has in fome Instances been and may again be eluded by the Pilot on board, or by the Commander, Master, or other Perfon having the Charge of fuch Ships or Veffels ; be it therefore enacted, That if any Pilot being on board, or any Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge of any Ship or Veffel coming from Foreign Parts, whether fuch Ship or Veffel shall be liable to Quarantine or not, shall be required by any Officer authorized by the Commissioners of the Cuftoms, or any Four of them, to act in the Service of Quarantine, to bring-to fuch Ship or Veffel, to the end that the Commander, Mafter, or other Perfon having the Charge thereof may be interrogated according to the Provision of the faid recited Act, and shall neglect or refuse to bring-to fuch Ship or Veffel, as foon as it can be done with Safety, in obedience to fuch Requifition, every fuch Pilot, Commander, Master, or other Perfon having the Charge of any fuch Ship or Veffel, shall for every fuch Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of One hundred Pounds.

Ships liable to Quarantine folely by involuntary Communication, exempt from Duty. IV. And whereas by the faid recited Act certain Duties are impofed on Ships and Veffels which have performed Quarantine; and by the fame Act a Ship or Veffel may be rendered liable to the Performance of Quarantine by receiving any Perfon or Perfons from or out of any other Ship or Veffel coming from or having touched at an infected Place, under which Provision a Ship or Veffel not being originally liable to perform Quarantine may be rendered fo liable by Force and against the Will of the Master

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Master and Crew; and it is reasonable that such Ship or Vessel should be relieved from the Payment of the faid Duties; be it therefore enacted, That no Ship or Veffel which shall be rendered liable to perform Quarantine folely by reafon of having received on board thereof by Force or against the Will of the Master and Crew any Person or Persons, shall be liable to or charged with any Duty under the faid recited Act, provided that it shall appear to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of the Customs that such Perfon or Perfons was or were received on board against the Will of the Mafter and Crew of fuch Ship or Veffel.

V. And whereas the Mode prefcribed by the faid recited Act for cer- Certificate tifying that all Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles liable having been to Quarantine, have been duly opened and aired conformably to the Pro- aired. visions in the fame, have been found inconvenient ; be it therefore enacted, That fo much of the faid recited Act as relates to the Certificates and Proof of opening and airing fuch Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and other Articles, shall be and is hereby repealed; and that after fuch Orders for the opening and airing of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles, shall have been duly complied with, Proof thereof shall be made by the Oaths of the Mafter of the Lazaret or Veffel in which the Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles, fhall have been opened and aired, and of One of the Guardians, or if there be no Guardians, then of One of the Officers authorized by the Commissioners of the Customs, or any Four of them, to act in the Service of Quarantine in fuch Lazaret or Veffel, or if there be no fuch Officer, then by the Oaths of Two or more credible Witneffes ferving in the faid Lazaret or Veffel, before the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, in cafe fuch opening and airing fhall be had at a Port or Place where fuch Superintendant or Affiftant fhall be established, or otherwise before the principal Officer authorized by the Commissioners of the Customs, or any Four of them, to act in the Service of Quarantine at fuch Port or Place; which Oath fuch Superintendant,

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intendant, Afliftant, or principal Officer is hereby authorized to administer; and fuch Superintendant, Afliftant, or principal Officer, as the Cafe may be, shall make Certificate of fuch Proof having been made; and upon the Production of fuch Certificate to the proper Officer of the Cuftoms authorized by the faid Commissioners or any Four of them, fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, and other Articles, shall be liable to no further Restraint or Detention either at the Port or Place where fuch Quarantine shall have been performed, or at any other Place whereto they may be afterwards conveyed.

Power for Privy Council to order Ships coming from America or the Weit Indies when the Yellow Fever, &c. prevail there, to go to certain Places liable to Quarantine.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it fhall and may be lawful for His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, by His or their Order in Council, or for the Lords and others of His or their Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, by their Order from Time to Time, as often as they may fee Reafon to apprehend that the Yellow Fever or other highly infectious Diftemper prevails on the Continent of America, or in the West Indies, to require that every Ship and Veffel coming from or having touched at any without being Port or Place on the Continent of America, or in the West Indies, shall come to an Anchor at certain Places to be appointed from Time to Time by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England and Scotland (who are hereby respectively authorized to make such Appointment), for the Purpofe of having the State of Health of the Crew of fuch Ship or Veffel afcertained before fuch Ship or Veffel shall be permitted to enter the Port whereto flie may be bound, or any other Port of Great Britain; but that fuch Ship or Veffel shall not be deemed liable to Quarantine, unless it shall be afterwards specially ordered under that Restraint.

VII. And whereas it may be neceffary for the public Security to prevent all Communication whatever with Ships or Veffels performing Quarantine without clean Bills of Health; and the Danger of fuch Communication is greatly increased by Perfons not being prevented from going within

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within the Stations allotted for the Performance of Quarantine by fuch be prohibited Ships or Veffels; be it therefore further enacted, That it shall and may Council. be lawful to and for His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in The London Gazette, to prohibit all Perfons, Ships, Boats, and Veffels whatfoever from going, under any Pretence whatfoever, within the Limits of any Station which by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by any fuch Order or Orders in Council, has been or may be affigned for the Performance of Quarantine by any Ships or Veffels without clean Bills of Health; and that if any Perfon whatfoever, after fuch Notification or Publication of any fuch Order or Orders in Council, shall prefume under any Pretence whatfoever to go with any Ship, Boat, or Veffel within the Limits of any fuch Station, he or fhe shall for every fuch Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of Five hundred Pounds.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That if any Perfon shall knowingly Perfons and wilfully forge or counterfeit, interline, erafe, or alter, or procure to be forged or counterfeited, interlined, erafed, or altered, any Certificate directed or required to be granted by any Order of His Majesty, His Heirs Order in or Succeffors, in Council, now in force or hereafter to be made touching Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, or shall publish as true any fuch forged or counterfeited, interlined, erafed, or altered Certificate, knowing the fame to be forged or counterfeited, interlined, erafed, or altered, or shall knowingly and wilfully utter and publish any fuch Certificate with Intent to obtain the Effect of a true Certificate to be given thereto, knowing the Contents of fuch Certificate to be falle, he or fhe shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and shall fuffer Death as in Cafes of Felony without Benefit of Clergy.

IX. And be it further enacted, That the Confuls and Vice Confuls of Power to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, shall and are hereby empowered to administer

Perfons authorized to take Examinations may adminifter Oaths; and Perfons fwearing falfely, or procuring others fo to do, fhall be deemed guilty of Perjury.

X. And be it further enacted, That in all Cafes wherein by virtue and in purfuance of this Act, or any other now in force or hereafter to be made touching Quarantine, any Examinations or Anfwers fhall be taken or made upon Oath, the Perfon who fhall be authorized and required to take fuch Examinations and Anfwers fhall and fhall be deemed to have full Power and Authority to adminifter fuch Oaths; and if any Perfon who fhall be fo interrogated or examined fhall wilfully fwear falfely to any Matter concerning which fuch Perfon fhall depofe or make Oath on fuch Examination or in fuch Anfwer, or if any Perfon fhall procure any other Perfon fo to do, he or fhe fo fwearing falfely, or procuring any other Perfon fo to do, fhall be deemed to have been guilty of and fhall be liable to be profecuted for wilful and corrupt Perjury, or Subornation of wilful and corrupt Perjury, as the Cafe may be, and fhall fuffer the Pains, Penalties, and Punifhments of the Law in fuch Cafe refpectively made and provided.



required to be performed by the Superintendant of Quarantine, or his Deputy, but no Provision is made for the Execution of the fame in the Event of the Absence of those Officers; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That every Thing required in the faid Act to be done and performed by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant may, in cafe of the Absence or Sickness of fuch Superintendant or Affiftant, be done and performed by the prin-Absence, &c. cipal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place, or by fuch Officer of the Cuftoms as shall be authorized by the Commissioners of the Customs, or any Four or more of them, to act in that Behalf.

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine, it is amongst other Things enacted, That, from and after the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as all others, coming from or having touched at any Place from whence His Majesty, His Heirs or Successfors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, shall have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague or any other infectious Difease or Diftemper, highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, may be brought, and all Ships, Veffels, and Boats receiving any Perfon, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any Ships or Veffels fo coming from or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, whether fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles, fhall have come or been brought in fuch Ships or Veffels, or fuch Perfons shall have gone or Articles have been put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships or Veffels at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and whether fuch Ships or Veffels were or were not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands X aforefaid :

aforefaid; and that all Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any Articles whatever, on board any fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or on board of any fuch Receiving Ships, Veffels, or Boats as aforefaid, shall be and be confidered to be liable to Quarantine within the Meaning of the faid Act, and of any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, from the Time of the Departure of fuch Ships or Veffels from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or from the Time when fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles fhall have been received on board respectively; and that fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats as aforefaid, and all Perfons [as well Pilots as others], Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or going or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats at any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid; and all Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, on board any fuch Receiving Ship, Veffel, or Boat as aforefaid, shall, upon their Arrival at any fuch Port or Place, be obliged to perform Quarantine in fuch Place or Places for fuch Time and in fuch Manner as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successfors, by His or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in The London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from such Quarantine, no such Perfon, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or other Articles as aforefaid, or any of them, shall, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats at any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid, come

come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to come or be brought on Shore in any fuch Port or Place, although fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid may not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid, unless in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid: And that all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, whether coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforefaid; and all Perfons (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, or going or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats at any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid; and although fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats shall not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain or the Islands aforefaid; and that all Commanders, Masters, or other Perfons having the Charge or Command of any fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, whether coming from any infected Place, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, shall be subject to all the Provisions, Rules, Regulations and Reftrictions contained in the faid Act, or in any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, and to all the Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments contained in the faid Act, for any Breach or Difobedience thereof, or of any Order or Orders of His Majefty in Council made under the Authority thereof: And whereas Information hath been received that an Infectious Difease hath lately shewn itself in various Parts of the Continent of America. and particularly in the Diffrict of Southwark in the City of Philadelphia, and in the City of New York ; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon adjudge and declare it probable that the faid infectious Difease is highly dangerous to the Health of His Majesty's Sub-

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jects,

jects, and may be brought into fome Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, by Ships or Veffels coming from or having touched at any of the Ports within the State of Pennfylvania or the State of New York; and is thereupon pleafed to order, as it is hereby ordered, That all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as others (not having the faid infectious Difeafe on board) coming from or having touched at any of the Ports within the State of Pennfylvania, or the State of New York, to perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules prescribed by His Majesty's Order in Council bearing Date the Fifth Day of April last, concerning the Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain, without the Streights of Gibraltar, lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent : But in cafe it shall appear upon the Arrival of any Ship or Veffel coming from or having touched at any of the Ports within the faid States of Pennfylvania and New York, that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the fame have died, or been ill of fuch infectious Difeafe, within the Space of Forty Days prior to the Arrival of fuch Ship or Veffel on the Coafts of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; or in cafe any Perfon shall have died on board of fuch Ship or Vessel in confequence of the faid infectious Distemper within the Space of Forty Days as aforefaid, and in that Cafe the faid Ship or Veffel and her Cargo shall perform Quarantine at Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place at which fhe may have arrived or shall arrive, and shall repair to Standgate Creek, and there perform Quarantine and not elfewhere, and shall be fubject to all the Rules and Regulations to which Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain without the Streights of Gibraltar lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, and not

not being furnished with clean Bills of Health, are subject and liable to: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commisfioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Isles of Guernsfey, Jersfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled An Act for making additional and further Provisions for the effectual Performance of Quarantine, it is enacted, that the Confuls and Vice Confuls of His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, shall be and are thereby empowered to administer Oaths in all Cafes refpecting Quarantine, in like Manner as if they were Magistrates of the feveral Towns or Places where they refpectively refide : And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty, that confiderable Difficulties are experienced by the Merchants, Importers of Goods from Ruffia, in refpect to making the Declarations on Oath before a Magistrate of any Ports or Places in that Kingdom, required by Section Forty-two of His Majefty's Order in Council of Fifth April One thousand eight hundred and five, to afcertain whether certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated in the First Class of His Majesty's Order in Council, imported in any Ships coming from any Port in Europe without the Streights of Gibraltar, or on the Continent of America, are or are not the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean; and the like Difficulty occurs in respect to the special Declaration required by His Majesty's Order in Council, dated the Fifteenth of August last, in respect to any Rags imported into this Kingdom : And whereas fimilar Difficulties may occur touching the Trade from other Ports in Europe without the Streights of Gibraltar,

Gibraltar, or the Continent of America; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleafed to order (and it is hereby ordered), That if the Mafter or other Perfon having Charge of any Ship or Veffel coming from any Port or Place at which there is no regular Establishment of Quarantine declared fufficient by His Majesty in Council, fhall bring with him a Declaration on Oath made by the Owner, Proprietor, Shipper, or Confignee of fuch Ship or Veffel, or of the Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated as aforefaid on board thereof refpectively, before the Britifb Conful or Vice Conful refiding at or near fuch Port or Place, to the fame Purport and Effect as the Declaration required by the faid recited Section of the faid Order of His Majefty in Council, of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, to be made before fome Magistrate of the Port or Place from whence fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes have been brought; or to the fame Purport and Effect as the special Declaration required by His Majefty's above-recited Order of the Fifeenth August last concerning Rags; fuch Declaration or Declarations made before and attefted by fuch British Conful or Vice Conful shall have the like Force and Effect, to all Intents and Purpofes, as the Declaration and Certificate required by Section Fortytwo of His Majesty's faid Order in Council, of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, or by His Majesty's above-recited Order in Council of the Fifteenth Day of August last; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS by an Act paffed in the prefent Selfion of Parliament, intituled An Act for making additional and further Provisions for the effectual Performance of Quarantine, it is amongst other Things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for His Majesty. His Heirs or Succeffors, by his or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in The London Gazette, to prohibit all Perfons, Ships, Boats, and Veffels whatfoever from going, under any Pretence whatfoever, within the Limits of any Station which by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by any fuch Order or Orders in Council, has been or may be affigned for the Performance of Quarantine by any Ships or Veffels without clean Bills of Health; and that if any Perfon whatfoever, after fuch Notification or Publication of any fuch Order or Orders in Council, shall prefume, under any Pretence whatfoever, to go with any Ship, Boat, or Veffel within the Limits of any fuch Station, he or fhe shall for every fuch Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of Five hundred Pounds :

And whereas by His Majefty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, it is directed, That all Ships of War, Transports, and other Ships in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of Commissioned Officers of His Majefty's Navy, coming from any of the Places mentioned in the faid Order,

Order, and not being provided with clean Bills of Health, fhall perform Quarantine at the *Motherbank*, in a feparate and diffinct Place to be appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys for that Purpofe; which Place has been appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys accordingly:

His Majefty, in purfuance of the Power vefted in Him by the faid Act, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That no Perfons, Ships, Veffels, or Boats whatfoever, other than the Veffels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or other Boats regularly employed under the Authority of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in the Quarantine Service, fhall go, under any Pretence whatfoever, within the Limits of the Place fo marked out, except in Cafes of fpecial Neceffity and Emergency, and with Permiffion firft had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Affiftant.

And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Veffels being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the fame at the *Motherbank*, shall come to Anchor within the Compass of the faid Yellow Buoys in fuch Place or Places as shall be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, and shall be kept separate and apart from His Majesty's Ships of War, Transports, and Vessels in the Service of Government, and not having clean Bills of Health, which may be performing Quarantine as aforefaid within the Compass of the faid Yellow Buoys: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasfury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS it has been reprefented by the Governor, Confuls, and Court of Affiftants of the Ruffia Company, that the Productions of the Quarantine Declarations and Certificates required by Section Forty-two of His Majesty's Order in Council, dated Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five (concerning the Performance of Quarantine), in respect to the Growth, Produce, and Manufacture of certain Articles enumerated in the First Class of the faid Order, imported from the Ports of Ruffia, is attended with great Delay, and very ferious Inconvenience to the Trade: And whereas it hath been reprefented that the Bulk of the Articles exported from Ruffia confift of the Staple Growth, Produce, and Manufacture of Ruffia; and that the Hemp, Flax, and Linen imported from thence undergo a certain Process before the Shipment thereof in the Ports of Ruffia, of a Tendency to prevent Infection : It is thereupon ordered in Council, That Veffels having on board any of the Articles enumerated in the First Class of the faid Order in Council, dated the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, arriving from the Ruffian Ports in the Baltic, and from Archangel, and not having on board any Cotton Wool, Goat Skins, Rags, Feathers, or Hair of any Sort, shall, upon the Oath of the Master of the Veffel importing any of the Articles enumerated in the First Class of the faid Order (except as before excepted), and of the Importer or Proprietor or Confignee of fuch Articles, that the fame are not the Growth, Produce,

duce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the Weft Barbary in the Atlantic Ocean, though unaccompanied with the Document required by the faid Section of the faid above-recited Order, be forthwith admitted to report and enter.

And it is hereby further ordered, That in cafe any of the Veffels fo arriving shall have on board any Cotton Wool, Goat Skins, Rags, Feathers, or Hair of any Sort, and the Mafter thereof shall produce a Declaration and Certificate required by the faid Section of His Majefty's faid Order in Council, or a Declaration to that Effect made on Oath before the Britifb Conful or Vice Conful, and duly attefted by fuch Conful or Vice Conful, as allowed by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentyfirst of July last, all fuch Articles (except Rags, which are to continue to be treated in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifteenth August last) shall be also admitted to report and enter; but on Failure of the Production of the Declaration and Certificate abovementioned for any Cotton Wool, Goat Skins, Rags, Feathers, or Hair of any Sort fo imported, or on Failure of the Oath as above requiredhaving been made touching the other Articles of the First Class, then the Ship or Veffel importing the fame shall perform Quarantine as directed by Section Forty-two of the faid Order of His Majefty in Council, bearing Date the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five : And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS by Order of this Board, dated the Thirty-first of July One thousand eight hundred and fix, it was directed that Vefiels having on board any of the Articles enumerated in the First Class of the General Quarantine Order, arriving from the Ruffian Ports in the Baltic, and from Archangel, and not having on board any Cotton Wool, Goat Skins, Rags, Feathers, or Hair of any Sort, fhould, upon the Oath of the Mafter of the Veffel importing any of the faid enumerated Articles (except as before excepted), and of the Importer, Proprietor, or Confignee of fuch Articles, that the fame were not of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, though not accompanied with the Documents required by Section Forty-two of His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, be forthwith admitted to report and enter: And whereas during a Time of War confiderable Difficulties arife as to procuring the Declarations and Certificates required by the faid Section of the faid Order; and the fubjecting Veffels to Quarantine, having Cotton Wool, Goat Skins, Rags, Feathers, or Hair of any Sort on board, not accompanied with the proper Declarations and Certificates, caufes Detention of the Ships, and is attended with Inconvenience and Burthen to the Trade: And whereas no Appear-

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ance exifts at prefent of any infectious Difease or Diftemper, highly dangerous to the Health of His Majesty's Subjects, prevailing on the Continent of Europe or America : It is therefore ordered by their Lordships, That the Provisions of Section Forty-two of the faid Order be entirely sufpended until further Order; and that all Veffels arriving from any of the Ports of Europe without the Streights of Gibraltar, or from the Continent of America, or the Islands adjacent thereto, or from the Western Islands, with any of the Articles enumerated in the First Class, including Cotton Wool, Goat Skins, Rags, Feathers, or Hair of any Sort, be admitted to report and enter without being fubject to Quarantine, provided the Mafters of the faid Veffels shall first make Oath that no infectious Diforder was prevailing at the Port from whence they failed, and on the Importer, Proprietor, or Confignee alfo making Oath that the faid Articles are not the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

- Q. How long after failing from your Port of Lading, or having touched at any Port on the Continent of America, or the Islands adjacent thereto, or any of the Ports in the West Indies, was the first Appearance of Disease observed?
- Q. How had the Perfons attacked been employed before they came on board?

- Q. Can you flate what were the Symptoms of Illnefs with which your Crew was first attacked, and what was the daily Succeffion and Change in them till their Death ?
- Q. Whether any and what Medicines have been used, and what Methods have been adopted to prevent its fpreading among the Crew?
- Q. Whether Attention has been paid to Cleanliness and Ventilation on board your Ship?

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coming from the Places therein in that Behalf mentioned, and not being furnished with clean Bills of Health, which Place was appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys accordingly : And whereas His Majefty, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in Him by the faid Act, was pleafed by His Order in Council of the Twenty-first of July One thousand eight hundred and fix, to order, and it was thereby ordered, that no Perfons, Ships, Veffels, or Boats whatfoever, other than the Veffels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affiftant, or other Boats regularly employed under the Authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in the Quarantine Service, should go under any Pretence whatfoever within the Limits of the Place fo marked out, except in Cafes of fpecial Neceffity and Emergency, and with Permission first had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Affistant; and it was thereby further ordered, that all Ships and Veffels being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which might be ordered to perform the fame at the Motherbank, fhould come to Anchor within the Compais of the faid Buoys in fuch Place or Places as fhould be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Afliftant, and fhould be kept feparate and apart from His Majefty's Ships of War, Transports, and Veffels in the Service of Government, and not having clean Bills of Health, which might be performing Quarantine as aforefaid within the Compais of the faid Yellow Buoys: And whereas it has been reprefented that the Space fo marked out on the Motherbank, within which Ships under Quarantine are to be moored, was more extensive than was necessary for any Number of Ships which it was probable would have Occasion to be there at one Time, and that the Extent of the Space fo marked out rendered it extremely difficult, with the Wind at certain Points of the Compass, for Veffels which might not be fubject to Quarantine to avoid paffing through Parts of that Space, and thereby fubjecting the Commanders of fuch Veffels to the Penalties provided by the before-mentioned Act paffed in the Forty-fixth Year of His Majefty's Reign; and that it would therefore 181

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be expedient that a Reduction should take place in the Limits of the Quarantine Ground at the Motherbank, by the Removal of the West Buoys placed there to the Eastward of Wooton Creek, fo that Boats and other Craft may pass without going through the faid Grounds, and that the Two North or outer Buoys should be shifted nearer to the Ise of Wight, and that in addition to the Buoys already laid down one fhould be put Midway between the East and West inner Buoys, in order to form a more confpicuous and better Line for fmall Vefiels to pafs and repafs, and that another Buoy (painted Red) should be placed as a Mark for a Burying Ground between the Two outer Buoys: And whereas fuch Yellow Buoys have been fixed in the Places last above mentioned for the Purpose of reducing the faid Quarantine Station; accordingly His Royal Highnefs the Prince Regent is thereupon pleafed, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, and by and with the Advice of His Majefty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine Station fo appointed and marked out as laft aforefaid fhall be deemed and taken to be the Station for Performance of Quarantine at the Motherbank, within the true Intent and Meaning of the herein-before recited Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five: And His Royal Highnefs is further pleafed to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, and by and with the Advice aforefaid, That no Perfons, Ships, Veffels, or Boats whatfoever, other than the Veffels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, or other Boats regularly employed under the Authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in the Quarantine Service, fhould go under any Pretence whatever within the Limits of the Place fo marked out as last aforefaid, except in Cafes of special Necessity and Emergency, and with Permiffion first had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Affistant: And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Veffels, being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the fame at the Motherbank, shall come to Anchor within

within the Compass of the Buoys as herein described, in such Place or Places as shall be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, and shall be kept separate and apart from His Majesty's Ships of War, Transports, and Vessels in the Service of Government, and not having clean Bills of Health, which may be performing Quarantine as aforesaid within the Compass of the said Buoys: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

One thousand eight hundred and twelve, and the Thirty-first of July last, refpecting the Performance of Quarantine, be put to the Captains, Commanders, Mafters, or other Perfons having Charge or Command of Ships or Veffels coming from or having touched at any of the Places above defcribed and enumerated : And His Royal Highnefs is further pleafed to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice aforefaid, that fuch Captains, Commanders, Masters, or other Perfons having Charge or Command of fuch Ships or Veffels shall, upon fuch Questions being put by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, or principal Officer or other Officer of the Customs authorized by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Customs or any Four or more of them to act in that Behalf, give true Anfwers to the fame in Writing or otherwife, and upon Oath or not upon Oath, according as they shall be required by fuch Superintendant or his Affiftant, or Principal Officer or other Officer of the Cuftoms authorized as aforefaid, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by an Act paffed in the Forty-fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for making further Provisions for the effectual Performance of Quarantine.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.



It is in the first Place to be observed, That ALL PERSONS are prefumed to know, and are bound to take Notice, not only of the Quarantine Regulations established by Act of Parliament (as they are of any other Public Act), but likewise of every Order of Council made for the Performance of Quarantine, and published in the London Gazette. And as it is easily in their Power to inform themselves of fuch Regulations, and particular Care is taken by this and other Means to promulgate fuch of them as apply to their respective Situations, previous to their being actually put under Quarantine, when they will receive Directions for their Guidance from the Quarantine Officers, no Plea of Ignorance will be admitted as an Excuse for any Neglect, Breach, or Violation thereof; but, for the fake of Example, and for the Security of the Public Health, the Pains, Penalties, and Punishments of the Law will be enforced with the utmost Severity.


