Monsall Hospital, Manchester is the Receiving Hospital for Infectious cases from the District.

The R.R.C.S. Home Service Ambulance for non-infectious and accident cases has been used for the conveyance of 67 patients.

The cottage Hospital is now so much taken advantage of that there are few cases for the District Nurse to attend to in their own homes.

An after care orthopoedic clinic has been started at the Cottage Hospital where all such cases in the district are being attended to
