Samples were examined by the National Institute for Research in Dairying, Reading and the County Laboratory, Winchester. From the 12 samples of ordinary milk taken during the year for bacteriological examination the following results were obtained :-

In 5 of these samples, *Bacillus Coli* was found to be present in 1/1000 m.l., 3 samples in 1/100 m.l., one sample is 1/10 m.l. and 3 samples proved to be negative.

Of the 73 samples of "Pasteurised" Milk taken, 65 proved satisfactory, 10 failed to satisfy the court test and 3 the Phosphatase Test.
