WATER SUPPLY. The following particulars give all information with regard to the Water Supply in Aldershot for the year 1944.

1. (a) quality of water as supplied was highly satisfactory as shown by tests reported in question 2 below.

(b) Supply was satisfactory in respect of quantity as no restrictions were necessary.

2. About 26 bacteriological tests were made on the raw water, of which 21 showed "highly satisfactory" results and 5 "satisfactory".

All water is tested, and about 51 bacteriological tests made of District samples, all of which classed as "highly satisfactory".

Chemical analyses by the Counties Public Health Laboratories were made in August last year on (i) the normal chalk water source and (ii) the new lower greensand water, the former showed no material change from earlier analyses, and there is nothing abnormal to mention.

- 3. Individually or as mixed, there is no reason to anticipate plumbo-solvent action, based on the opinion of an eminent chemist, nor is there any known evidence of such from experience.
- 4. No incident of contamination.
