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1967

To the Chairman and Members of the Alnwick Rural District Council

The report for the year 1967 includes the period covered by my predecessor who left to take up a position in general practice and subsequently by myself when I took up my appointment on 1st July. The initial period has been one of getting to know first people and places and secondly detail. This latter is inevitably a slow and continuing process particularly in an extensive area with a scattered population.

The report is presented in its accustomed form and contains information on the vital statistics for the District and also on the sanitary circumstances which are included in the report of the Public Health Inspector.

VITAL STATISTICS

These show no marked variation from the normal pattern. The number of births, 196, was an increase on the number in the previous year, 172. The crude birth rate was 15.9 live births per thousand population and the adjusted rate 18.1 per thousand, the area comparability factor for births being 1.14. These rates compare with ones of 14.0 and 15.9 respectively in the District in 1966 and of 17.2 in England and Wales in 1967.

Total deaths numbered 143 compared with 153 in 1966. The crude death rate was 11.6 per thousand and the adjusted rate 10.0 per thousand, the area comparability factor for deaths being 0.86. These rates compare with ones of 12.4 and 10.3 respectively in the District in 1966 and of 11.2 in England and Wales in 1967.

There were two infant deaths compared with three in 1966. The infant mortality rate was 10.2 deaths per thousand live births compared with 17.4 per thousand in the District in 1966 and 18.3 in England and Wales in 1967. There were no maternal deaths.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

There were two notifications of pulmonary tuberculosis both in elderly males, and two deaths of persons on the tuberculosis register but in neither of the latter was tuberculosis the cause of death. One of the notifications was made posthumously and in this person also the cause of death was not due to tuberculosis.

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The 1966 measles epidemic continued into the early part of 1967 and there were 167 cases notified during the year. The early months also produced a minor outbreak of dysentery with 15 notified cases.

Intermittantly cases of salmonella infections occurring in livestock are informally notified by the Animal Health Division of the Ministry of Agriculture as a result of specimens submitted by veterinary practitioners. Information was received of five such cases during 1967four in cattle and one in turkeys. The organisims were Salmonella typhimurium, S. dublin, and three unidentified salmonella. These infections in live stock are fairly common and are increasing, particularly in association with intensive rearing methods. They constitute a risk of food poisoning to the workers on the premises and possibly to the public through the consumption of farm bottled milk or through the contamination of meat at slaughter. One case of food poisoning occurred during the year and the patient was a comman. There were at the time suspected infections in the cattle but this was not proved bacteriologically.

IMMUNISATION

The statistics for the area are shown in a modified table - by disease instead of by form of injection. The number of immunisations carried out in young children have been related to the number of births during 1967. The percentages shown are a reasonable index of the acceptance rates and can be considered to be very satisfactory.

To the Chairman and Members of the Alnwick Rural District Council.

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I submit herewith, for your consideration, my thirteenth Annual Report including the appended statistical section.

The Comprehensive Water Scheme of the Coquet Water Board is now complete throughout the area, and an increasing number of small private water supplies are being connected to the water mains. Regular sampling in most parts of the District are undertaken by the Board and the results are fowarded to my office for information. Progress is still being made in the introduction of sewage schemes to villages. Rennington scheme was completed during the year and the Embleton/Christon Bank scheme will also be completed in the very near future. The combined scheme for Alnmouth and Lesbury has commenced and considerable progress has been made on the laying of sewerage pipes throughout the villages. Newton-on-the-Moor scheme has failed to obtain Ministry consent. The Radcliffe/Hauxley scheme is in abeyance pending the outcome of talks with the National Coal Board for the working of this area as an opencast mining site and the possible transference of the whole of Radcliffe to Amble.

The Grants Schemes for housing continues to attract applicants but it is noticeable that in comparison with the period 1962/64, when the total grant aided schemes amounted to 194 houses, there has been only 138 houses for the period 1965/67. There are still approximately 450 houses without full sanitation service and of these 300 are in villages and 150 on farms. It is disappointing that owners of these properties are not making greater use of these Schemes. It may be of interest to you to know that since the inception of the Discretionary Grant the sum of £135,000 has been paid, which averages out at £290 per house. The Standard Grant total sum amounts to £31,000 and averages out at £115 per house.

The new Dual Tip refuse vehicles purchased for the Cleansing Service last year are proving their worth, in so far as they are coping with the additional refuse. A word of warning must be expressed here that, because of this increase in refuse, larger vehicles will be needed in the coming years. There is a correspondingly much larger area of tipped refuse requiring to be covered in Embleton Quarry and, whilst the small tractor is giving invaluable service, a more powerful crawler shovel type machine is needed so that it can not only level the tip, but excavate the spoil heaps in the Quarry.

In conclusion I would like to express my thanks for the assistance I have obtained throughout the year from Council Members, the Medical Officer of Health and the office staff. In particular I am grateful for the co-operation of Mr. R. Lyall, my assistant, and Mr. Sisterson, Pests Officer. It is with regret that I have to report that Mr. Lyall left his post in October for a similar position with Boston Rural District Council.
