Medical Officer's Interim Report for 1939.

The Area of the District remains the same as in 1938. The population has been fluctuating since the outbreak of war, owing to the addition to the population of a considerable number of evacuees, and for a time, some non-civilians. Despite these additions to the population, the general health of the District has been good, and there has been no illness attributable either to the Water Supply or Sewage. No exceptional administrative measures were taken or recommended by the M.O.H. during the year. A certain number of cases of Scabies and Impetigo were imported into the District with the influx of evacuees, but these cases were dealt with at the Smallpox Hospital. From November 1st. Measles and Whooping Cough became notifiable diseases.
