WATER SUPPLY

The water supply in the district has been chlorinated since the beginning of the war and is still satisfactory. The four private piped supplies in the Borough are regularly sampled and satisfactory reports are received. The public piped supply covers most of the Borough.

The water main has been extended as follows:-

SEWAGE

Arrangements at the sewage works are the same as last year.

HOUSING

During 1946 the Council completed the Site Preparation for 166 Permanent Houses, and most of the work of Site Preparation for 50 Temporary Houses.

The first permanent house was completed and opened in May 1946, and up to the end of the year a total of 27 permanent houses were completed and occupied. 6 Houses were completed by Private Enterprise up to the end of the year.

At the end of the year Contracts were in progress which should produce at least 100 permanent houses during 1947, and 50 temporary houses under construction by the Ministry of Works were rapidly nearing completion. Contracts for the site preparation for a further 122 permanent houses had been let. Preliminary steps had been taken with regard to the acquisition of a further site for approximately 120 houses.

The whole of the new dwellings were houses, and not flats or bungalows, but they included a proportion of four-bedroom houses.

GENERAL HEALTH

The general health of the inhabitants is good, infectious disease has been low.

SCABIES

Most cases are treated by their own doctors, a few go to the Public Assistance Institution for treatment.

MEAT SUPPLY

Slaughtering has been at the Ministry of Food slaughter-house, distribution being to the Borough and Rural districts and part of the Kingsclere and Whitchurch district.

Inspection is of a high standard but has involved a great deal of night work by the Sanitary Inspector.

MILK SUPPLIES

There are two pasteurisation plants in the town and weekly samples from these have given satisfactory results.

FACTORIES

There are 127 factories on the Register, 27 inspections were carried out and 11 Notices served.
