GENERAL PROVISIONS OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE YEAR.

There have been no new developments or changes in the following services during the year :- Laboratory facilities, Nursing in the Home, Treatment Centres, Clinics and Hospitals.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA.

There have been no extensions carried out by the Council to any of their water schemes during the year.

Four new service connections have been made to the Hartington Scheme, four to the Doveridge Scheme and twenty four to the Bradley Scheme. The latter includes supplies to an R.A.F. Station and Emergency Hospital.

Sewerage and Sewage Disposal.

No new works have been carried out in respect to sewerage or sewage disposal.

Refuse Collection.

Since the Council purchased a 21 ton Austin Lorry the work of refuse collection has been carried out by direct labour. Fortnightly collections are now carried out in Doveridge in addition to the seven villages previously collected.

The collection of salvage is carried out in every Parish in the District and the following amounts of various classes of goods have been collected and sold:-

Mousing.
Owing to the difficulties of obtaining labour and materials for repairs, routine housing inspections have been discontinued, and only nuisances are dealt with as reported. In this respect, 240 inspections have been made.

INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

Regular and systematic inspections of all butchers' shops and bakehouses have been made. The following amounts of various types of tinned food have been certified as unfit for food -
