Annual rates are not available, and as a matter of fact the whole exercise so far as births and deaths are concerned at this stage is just about futile.

I wish to tank all members of the staff and especially of the Public Health Department for their help and support throughout the year, and to record my appreciation of the courtesy extended to me by the members of the Council.

Great changes in local government are due to take place in a few weeks time and it is to be hoped that they will prove to be wholesome and fruitful.
