There have been only 12 deaths of children under twelve months of age, the chief cause seems to have been premature births, there having been four of such, debility being registered of three, the remaining five of divers causes or to seems ventileting on the road lovel + the order The birth rate is still low, being only a little better than last year, namely, 22.4 against 21.7, and our population being about two hundred more.
