I have the honour to present to you my Annual Report on the health of the County for the year 1944.

The statistical figures show an improvement upon the figures for the previous year.

The Birth Rate shows a slight increase 17.78 as compared with 17.29 for the previous year.

The Crude Death Rate is 14.42 compared with 15.24 in 1943.


The Death Rates from Heart Disease and Respiratory Disease are lower, and the Phthisis Death Rate shows a marked Decrease from .74 to .40 per thousand. This is the lowest figure recorded for Anglesey.

The Cancer Death Rate continues to show an increase.

I feel greatly indebted to the Chairman of the Public Health Committee for his active interest and loyal support in all matters pertaining to the Health of the Community and also to the Menbers for their ready co-operation. COMMENTS.

Maternal Deaths:

There were no maternal deaths of Anglesey Cases confined in Hospital.

One patient suffering from severe disseminated sclerosis died after confinement from paralytic ileus.

- A.J., Anglesey—admitted 22—4—44—died 1—5—44.
 - (i) Multigravida, aged 36. Full term.
- (ii) Did not attend Pre-Natal Clinic but had been an inpatient during the Ante-Natal period.
 - 4th—12th of February 1944—for observation of progressive disseminating sclerosis. She was then about 32 weeks pregnant.

- (iii) Re-admitted in labour and had an easy normal confinement. Nervous lesion became aggravated—paralytic ileus developed. Seven days after delivery ileostomy performed—died 24 hours later.
- (iv) Circumstances—poor.
- (v) Death due to paralytic ileus, complicating disseminate sclerosis.

Still-Births. There were 11 still-births, all of which were within the field of obstetric risks—five being due to serious complications of confinement. It was estimated that 65.1% of all cases of Still-births occurring in Hospital attended the Pre-Natal Clinics.

Neo-Natal Deaths. Eleven neo-natal deaths occurred, two being syphilitic babies and one abnormally developed. Seven deaths therefore followed obstetric causes—as far as can be ascertained these could not be avoided.

Out of eleven healthy premature babies only one died. During the year 69 premature babies were nursed at the County Hospital, 13 died—a percentage of 18.8. In the British Isles premature babies form 50% of the annual neo-natal deaths. Our latest figure in the Hospital shows considerable decrease in the deaths, being only 33%. This is due to the value of a special nursery, a fixed routine of treatment and the untiring efforts of the staff.

Gynaecological Cases. The number of cases has increased, though 20 of these were cases of abortion. Most of this work is being done at the Infirmary, but nevertheless the combined Gynaecological accommodation of the two hospitals is inadequate. The beddage for this work should be increased.

District Work. Five emergency cases were treated on the district.

Pre-Natal Clinics. The attendances again increased and the question of duplicating the clinics at both Holyhead and Llangefni is serious. My thanks are due to the Nurses and voluntary workers, who help in the clinics.

I am of the opinion that as soon as practicable, I should be relieved of all ordinary pre-natal clinic work. At present, it is impossible to have sufficient time available for satisfactory Hospital duties.

FOOD INSPECTOR'S REPORT.

January 1st-December 31st, 1944.

129 samples were submitted to the Public Analyst of which 28 were Not Genuine. These include 56 samples of milk of which 6 were Not Genuine.

378 samples of milk were submitted for Biological Examination for Tuberculosis. 10 were Positive.

2,706 samples of milk were submitted for Bacteriological Examination and for tests for Keeping Quality. 240 were unsatisfactory and required follow-up action.
