ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH. TO THE

URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF BLAENAVON. FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1968.

To the Chairman and Members of the Blaenavon Urban District Council.

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have pleasure in submitting my 20th Annual Public Health Report for your district for the year 1968.

The report is compiled in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of the Public Health Officers Regulations, 1959, and to comply with instructions contained in circular 1/69 (Wales) dated 1st January 1969, from the Welsh Board of Health.

General Comment.

Once again this Urban District had an unevenful year as regards the incidence of notifiable diseases.

The year 1968 was noteworthy in that no case of any form of tuberculosis was notified during the period and it was the second successive year for which no notification of pulmonary tuberculosis was received.

The other notifiable diseases were represented by a few notifications of measles.

The infant mortality rate was again very satisfactory and represented one infant death for the year against the previous year which was free from infant deaths.

There were 17 representations of unfit properties this year, but slum clearance progress at this rate in this district is much too slow to make any impression on the total problem. However, no new houses were built during the year and plans for the immediate future do not seem to provide enough new houses to enable an energetic slum clearance programme to get under way. Since 1959 some 347 unfit properties have been dealt with but many are still occupied long after they have been condemned. There were 80 condemned properties still occupied at the close of the year, and many of these houses had orders placed on them as long ago as 1964.

Water sampling during the year indicated an improvement bacteriologically in the town's water supply due to the action of the Council's Engineer and Surveyor in cutting out some untreated supplies and installing another chlorinator. The quantity of the supply still remains precarious during prolonged dry spells. Some plumbo-solvency was experienced at one source and here the Engineer and Surveyor put in a lime-stone filter bed as a correction.

The population estimate for the district at mid 1968 as furnished by the Registrar General was 7,860 which once again continues the yearly down-ward trend in population for the town as shown over the last forty seven years.

The live births allocated to this district for the year numbered 94 (52 males and 42 females) which is a decrease of 7 as compared with the previous year. There were 4 illegitimate births (3 males and 1 female) in the 94 live births which is 2 more than in the previous year.

The birth rate per 1,000 population was 12.0 as compared with 12.7 in the previous year and continues the downward trend.

The natural increase (i.e. births over deaths) for the year again shows a deficit which is 29.

Stillbirths for the year totalled 4 (2 males and 2 females) which is one in excess of last year. All were of legitimate birth.

The local birth rate for the year of 12.0 per 1,000 population is comparable with the national rate of 16.9 (provisional) if the local rate is multiplied by the comparabilty factor of 1.16 to give a local adjusted birth rate of 13.9.

The deaths allocated to this district for the year numbered 123 (61 males and 62 females) which was 7 more than in the previous year.

These deaths are assigned to their various causes and to age and sex groups in table $\overline{\mathbb{V}}$.

The cancers claimed 19 deaths (9males and 10 females), or 15.4% of the total deaths for the year. Cancer of the lungs and bronchi caused 15.8% of all cancer deaths for the year.

Cancer of the lungs and bronchi caused 3 deaths (2 males and 1 female) as compared with 4 deaths in 1967, 4 deaths in 1966, 2 deaths in 1965 and 4 deaths in 1964.

The diseases of the heart and blood vessels caused 71 deaths (34 males and 37 females), or 57.7% of the total deaths.

Diseases of the respiratory system (excluding tuberculosis and cancer) accounted for 14 deaths (9 males and 5 females), or 11.4% of the total deaths.

There was no death assigned to child birth, pregnancy or abortion.

There was one female death assigned to pulmonary tuberculosis in a person who had been on the tuberculosis register for many years and who also had a malignant condition.

There was one death each assigned to suicide, a motor vehicle accident and another accident.

The local crude death rate is 15.6 per 1,000 population and can be compared with the national rate of 11.9 (provisional) if multiplied by the comparability of 1.03 to give the local adjusted rate of 16.1.

From the above table it will be seen that 86 persons (42 males and 44 females) reached the age of 65 years at death, or 70% of the total deaths.

There were 48 persons (25 males and 23 females) who attained the age of 75 years at death, or 39% of the total deaths.

There were 24 persons (10 males and 14 females) who attained the age of 80 years at death, or 19.5% of the total deaths.

There was only one infant death recorded during the year which is a very satisfactory situation. This infant death, which occurred in hospital, referred to a male child who died 14 hours after birth due to prematurity caused by toxaemia of pregnancy. It is noted that some 90% of the yearly births in this district take place is hospitals.

For the nineteenth consecutive year there has been no notification of diphtheria received but parents are still urged not to be complacent and to take advantage of the facilities provided to have their children fully immunised.

TUBERCULOSIS.

The Chest Clinic for this district continues to be located at the Park Buildings, Pontypool, which is within easy reach. This clinic is open on two whole days weekly on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

This has been another record year in that no notification for any form of tuberculosis was received and the second successive year for which no notification of pulmonary tuberculosis was received. There was, however, one death assigned to pulmonary tuberculosis in a female aged 63 years who also had a malignant condition. This patient had been on the district's tuberculosis register for very many years.

No mass radiography survey for the general public took place during the year as the district had one in 1967 and it is not now considered necessary to provide this facility oftener that three yearly unless special circumstances otherwise dictate.

There is a static mass radiography unit operating at the Chest Clinic, 129 Stow Hill, Newport, for anyone requiring a chest X ray and it is open daily from Monday to Friday (9.0 a.m. to 1.0 p.m. and 2.0 p.m. to 5.0 p.m.) with an evening session Thursdays from 5.0 p.m. to 7.0 p.m.

Respiratory Tuberculosis and Lung Cancer Deaths for England and Wales - 1968.

The provisional death rate per million for England and Wales for 1968 for respiratory tuberculosis /30 as compared with 37 for 1968.

The death rate for cancer of the lungs and bronchi per million population was 593, which shows a further increase in deaths from this disease. In actual figures this means 28,826 deaths (23,896 males and 4,930 females) from cancer of the lungs and bronchi as compared with 28,250 for 1967. There were 1,458 deaths (1,094 males and 364 females) from pulmonary tuberculosis during 1968 as compared with 1,797 deaths in 1967.

For the second successive year there was no notification of pulmonary tuberculosis received in the district.

The one death ascribed to pulmonary tuberculosis occurred in a female aged 63 years who was also suffering from malignant melanosis. This patient had been on the tuberculosis register for many years.

MISCELLANEOUS.

National Assistance Act, 1948.

Action under Section 47 of the above Act to secure the compulsary removal of persons in need of care and attention was not required during the year.

Registered Common Lodging Houses.

The district has no common lodging houses.

Public Swimming Bath.

The district's public swimming bath is an open-air one controlled by the Council and provided with modern purification plant. The samples taken during the swimming season from the baths were satisfactory.

Superannuation Act.

There were 5 medical examinations carried out by the Medical Officer of Health during the year on Council employees.

County Weights and Measures Officer's Report for this District.

The County Weights and Measures Officer, R.J. Bullen, Esq., M.I.W.M.A., reports that a total of 35 samples were taken for analysis in the district under the Food and Drugs Act, 1955. These 35 samples included 20 milks and 15 other foods and all were certified as being genuine by the Public Analyst.

Water Supplies.

Following the elimination of some untreated water supplies to the town by the Council's Engineer and Surveyor last year and the installation of another chlorinator there was an improvement in the bacteriological sampling during the year. There were 83 samples taken and 15 of these were not of the bacteriological quality desired. A lime-stone bed was installed to correct a tendency to plumbo-solvency at one source of supply. The quantity of water available is still not adequate as any prolonged droughts lead to early shortage. There were 9 samples taken during the year for chemical analysis.

INSPECTION OF FOOD AND FOOD PREMISES, ETC.

Fresh Meat.

All supplies of fresh meat are imported into the district as there is no public or private slaughterhouse in operation in the town. These supplies appear to be adequate to meet the town's needs and there is no evidence to suggest that a slaughterhouse is required in view of this fact. There are no poultry processing premises in the district.

Milk Supply.

There is no pasteurising plant in the town and the milk supply comes from plants outside the district.

During the year 5 samples of milk were taken and submitted to the Public Health Laboratory, Newport, for analysis and all were reported on as reaching the prescribed standard. No samples were examined for brucella abortus as no raw milk is sold in the town.

Inspection of Food Shops.

Food shops in the district were periodically inspected during the year to ensure compliance with the Food Hygiene Regulations, and notices served when such was not the case.
