

TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE BRECONSHIRE EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen-

I have the honour to present to you the Fifty-sixth Annual Report of the School Medical Services in the County, during the year ending 31st December, 1966.

The health of Breconshire's school population is very

satisfactory indeed.

During the year, 1,003 children attending Primary Schools were medically examined, and 1,425 children who were attending County Grammar and County Secondary Schools.

Of these 2,428 children, no child was found to be unsatisfactory medically.

Handicapped Pupils—Special Schools.—In parts VI and VII appended to this report will be found full details of handicapped children in the County, including those for whom places have been found in Special Schools.

Education Act, 1944, Section 57.—During the year twelve children were referred by the School Medical Services Sub-Committee to the Local Health Authority under Section 57 of the Education Act, 1944, as being unsuitable for education in school.

School Closures.—No schools were closed on account of infectious disease during the year.

This introduction would be incomplete without reference to the co-operation and ready assistance afforded by the Chief Education Officer and his teaching and administrative staff, and the loyal and conscientious service rendered by the medical, nursing and clerical staff of the School Health Service.

Once again, I express my appreciation to the Chairman and members of the Education Committee for their continued support.

Cases in the Ystradgynlais Area are now examined and treated by Mr. F. G. Hibbert, F.R.C.S., Consultant Ophthalmic Surgeon from Swansea Hospital and any children whom he considers to require operative treatment are referred directly by him to Swansea Hospital.

ORTHOPTIC TREATMENT.

The Orthoptist employed at the Brecon Hospital continues to treat children referred to her by Mr. Hoare from his School Clinics and this work has increased to such an extent that the Orthoptist now attends at the Hospital more often than the one session per week originally allotted for this work when the scheme first commenced in 1960. This arrangement for orthoptic treatment for our children works very satisfactorily.

Cases in the Ystradgynlais Area who need Orthoptic treatment are now dealt with at Swansea General Hospital under Mr. Hibbert's supervision thus avoiding the necessity of having to travel regularly to Brecon Hospital for this purpose.

Orthoptists are also employed at Merthyr General Hospital and the Royal Gwent Hospital, Newport, and these facilities can be used by Breconshire children if required.

ORTHOPÆDIC SCHEME.

A number of children were seen by the Orthopædic Surgeon, Mr. Roy Treasure, F.R.C.S., at the monthly clinics held at Brecon Hospital, when your Orthopædic Nurse attends to assist the Specialist by arrangement with the Regional Hospital Board.

By arrangement with the Regional Hospital Board, Mr. Treasure held Orthopædic Clinics at the Brecon Clinic on

4 occasions during 1966.

REPORT ON THE SCHOOL DENTAL SERVICE, 1966 BY THE PRINCIPAL SCHOOL DENTAL OFFICER, MR. J. H. SUTCLIFFE, L.D.S.

I have the honour to present to you a report on the School Dental Service for the year ending 31st December, 1966.

The staff of two dental officers remains unchanged. There were, however, changes in the staff of dental surgery assistants. Miss A. Lane being appointed following the resignation of Miss E. Abraham and Miss B. Roberts being appointed following the retirement of Miss M. Anthony. The vacancy for a third dental officer remains unfilled.

As in previous years regular fixed clinics have been held at Brecon, Brynmawr, Builth Wells, Cefn Coed and Ystradgynlais and additional sessions held following routine inspections in adjacent schools. The clinics at Crickhowell, Hay and Tirabad have been visited for treat-

ment following routine inspections.

Continuing the programme of modernisation, new equipment was installed at Brecon Clinic. This comprises, X-ray unit, air turbine drill, dental cabinet and dental chair. Additional items of equipment were installed as follows.

Cefn—operating light and air turbine drill.
Builth—operating light, air turbine drill and X-ray.

This following the installation of new equipment at Brynmawr and Ystradgynlais in 1965 has resulted in greatly improved working conditions. This is of great importance if newly qualified dental surgeons are to be attracted to the School Dental Service.

The treatment figures given in Part IV show little deviation from those of 1965 though the percentage of children found to require treatment on inspection has again fallen. 50% of children inspected were found to require treatment compared with 57% in 1965. This could be partly accounted for by the fact that more children appear to be receiving regular treatment through the general dental service though there are no figures to confirm this impression.

25 sessions were devoted to dental health education compared with 16 sessions in 1965. These figures do not account for the time spent in chairside talk on dental care to which great importance is attached, particularly when the parent is present.

This report would be incomplete without reference to the valuable co-operation received from Head Teachers and their Staffs.

POLIOMYELITIS VACCINATION.

This is a service provided under Section 26 of the National Health Service Act. I would, however, like to express my appreciation to the Head Teachers of schools in the County for their co-operation in allowing pupils to attend at the Clinics for vaccination.

During the year the age range of persons eligible for vaccination remained at 6 months to 40 years, and open sessions were held at the various centres in the County. In addition a certain amount of vaccination was carried out by general practitioners on their own patients.

In April, 1961, the Ministry recommended that a fourth dose should be given to school children between the ages of 4 years and 12 years and this policy was continued in Breconshire during 1966.

I give below the figures of children between 4 years and 16 years of age who had been vaccinated by the end of the year:—

Of these children, number (born between 1950 and 1962) who had received four injections by the end of 1966 (or three injections and one oral dose or four oral doses)

In addition, the issue of oral vaccine (Sabin) was commenced by the Ministry in 1962 and this was brought into use in our clinics, where patients now have the option of either Salk vaccine injections or Sabin oral vaccine which is taken with sugar or syrup. The primary course of oral vaccine consists of three doses given at monthly intervals whereas the primary course of Salk vaccine consists of 2 injections at an interval of three weeks; this is followed at an interval of 7 months by a third re-inforcing injection.

B.C.G. VACCINATION AND TUBERCULOSIS.

In 1959 proposals were submitted by the County Council to the Welsh Board of Health for the extension of the Council's original scheme, which was approved in 1954. The extension of the scheme provides for the skin testing or re-skin testing annually of all pupils over the age of 13 years and for vaccination or re-vaccination, if necessary. This extended scheme was carried out by your Medical Officers in 1966, and details of the work are given in Part VIII of this report. Details of the X-ray examinations resulting from these skin tests are shown in Part IX.

T.B. SERIAL TESTING IN SCHOOLS.

In addition to the annual skin testing and B.C.G. vaccination of children over 13 years of age in schools, a scheme was introduced in Breconshire in 1961 whereby school children of all ages are skin tested annually and positive reactors X-rayed.

Annual tuberculin testing of all school children provides accurate and reliable information regarding the number of children infected from natural sources during any period of twelve months.

The annual conversion rate of non-reactor children will serve as a reliable index of the prevailing risk of infection in the community. When the conversion rate is found to be abnormally high in any class, school or district it indicates that viable tubercle bacilli are being disseminated freely and that intensive case-finding investigations should be applied, including possibly the mass radiography service.

A teacher disseminating viable tubercle bacilli would also be detected early and the spread of infection would be stopped.

Investigations should also be carried out among the home contacts of the convertors in an attempt to discover

the source of the infection.

Serial tuberculin testing therefore provides a method of detecting sources of infection which otherwise would not have been discovered until later.

Details of this work carried out in 1966 are shown in Table X and the resulting X-Ray examinations are given

in Table XI.
