

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SECTION B

GENERAL PROVISIONS OF HEALTH SERVICES

Public Health Officers

Mr J.E.Morgan remained as your Public Health Inspector during the year.

Laboratory Fagilities

During the year laboratory facilities were available at Cardiff, Newport, Carmarthen, Swansea, Builth and Brecon. Water samples were sent to the Public Analyst for the County of Carmarthen, whilst any investigation required in the control of infectious disease was performed by the Public Health Laboratory at Cardiff and Carmarthen.

Nursing and other Facilities

The County Council is responsible for the ambulahce and nursing services. The County also administers the maternity and child welfare clinics where treatment is available for minor ailments, dental, eye, and orthopaedic defects. Immunisation against diptheria and whoping cough is also carried out at these clinics.

Hospitals.

The hospital needs of the residents for all diseases apart from infectious diseases are provided by the Builth Wells Hospital. The arrangements for the treatment of infectious disease remain the same as in previous years. Merthyr Borough Council treat the patients fro the district suffering from infectious disease at Mardy Isolation Hospital. These arrangements are proving extremely satisfactory. For the treatment of smallpox arrangements have been made at the Penrhys Hospital, Rhondda.

SECTION D.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES

Water Supply

The Water supplying the town is obtained from two main sources - an impounding reservior at Tycapel, and the Hengwm Springs. The main supply gravitates to a High Pressure Filter plant for screening before chlorination and storage in an underground reserviour. During last year the Radnor and North Breconshire Water Board was constituted and the function of the Builth Wells U.D.C. as a water authority ceased.

Water Samples

Two samples of water were submitted for analysis and in each case the reports were satisfactory.

Sewers and Drainage.

The sewer system of the town discharges crude sewage into the River Wye via two outfalls. A scheme for the construction of a new sewage works to take the sewage from the town and the areas of Llanelwedd and Oaklands has been prepared, and is being installed by Contractors working under Consulting Engineers.

Public Cleansing

Household and trade refuse is collected once per week, and this frequency of service is considered adequate. The refuse is stored in bins and other containers which are placed on the kerbside to await collection. The disposal of refuse is by tipping at the Caeau Farm. The cleansing of highways is carried out jointly by this Council and the County Council. A mechanical suction cleaner traverses the main streets twice weekly while the secondary roads are swept once per week. Litter baskets are placed liberally throughout the main streets and Public open spaces.

There is no problem under this section.

Eradication of Bed Bugs and steps taken to combat infestation.

Rodent Control

The work of infesting and treating infested premises is carried out by a Council Workman. The Caeau Farm refuse tip was treated regularly with good poison bait takes. The seawers were twice flushed out to assist in the control of infestations. Test baits in the manholes revealed no infestations.
