SECTION C. - SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA.

1. (i). WATER. The whole of the Town's supply is obtained from the Llanelly Rural District Council under agreement. (15 years from 1st April 1934 at 7d er 1,000 gallons). No complaints have been received regarding the quality or quantity). My Council are in negotiation with the Llanelly Rural District Council for their terms for a new Agreement or an extension of the existing one, which expires on the 31st March, 1949.

Periodical tests are taken by the Rural Council Engineer who has informed my Council that they are satisfactory.

The population supplied by means of standpipes is 165 which is 2.85%

- (ii). DRAINAGE AND SANITATION. The Town Sewerage is on a partially separate system with outfall to sea, through Woodbrook Terrace on the outh Side of the G.W.R. Main Line, and through a septic tank situated at the Old Harbour. A scheme for the un-sewered portion of the Urban Area has been prepared by Messrs A.P.I. Cotterell & Sons, Engineers, London, and has been submitted to the Welsh Board of Health for their observations. An Inquiry will be held by the Welsh Board of Health in the near future.
- 2. RIVERS AND STREAMS. The watercourses at the rear of Bethany Chapel and Dyfatty Stream are cleaned regularly. No flooding of New Street ocurred during the year.
- 3. CLOSET ACCOMMODATION. The number of houses from which ni ht soil is collected is 41.

MOUSING GENERALLY. One house was built by private enterprise.

There are no vacant houses in the Urban Area.

HOUSING PROGRAMME OF THE COUNCIL. 6 Houses have been built in Erw Terrace. 28 Houses have been built on The Crescent & Brynhyfryd. There are 14 traditional houses in course of erection at Brynhyfryd.

A Scheme is being prepared to erect 36 houses on the Ashburnham Road Housing Site.

The total number of Post War Houses built & occupied is 74.

SECTION E - INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

(a) MILK SUPPLY. There are 19 registered Milk Vendors, 14 of which are in the Urban Area.

Licences are granted on the lines of the Milk and Dairies Order 1926. No Licences have been issued under the Milk Special Designation Order 1936.

Examinations of all registered premises with regard to cowsheds and dairies are made by the Surveyor himself.

84 Samples of Milk were taken under the National Milk Testing and Advisory Scheme and sent for examination. Examinations are made at the Emergency Public Health Laboratory at Carmarthen.

16 Samples of Milk were taken under the National Milk Testing and Advisory Scheme and submitted for tuberculosis examination, all of which were found to be negative.

(b). MEAT etc., Bakehouses, Shops and Vehicles are regularly inspected and always kept under observation.

Section 14 FOOD AND DRUGS ACT 1938. 17 Certificates werei issued under this Section during the year.

ICE CREAM. Ice Cream is manufactured by 4 Vendors in the Area. The premises are frequently inspected and are always found to be very clean, and as far as possible comply with the Act.

SLAUGHTERHOUSE. Public Abattoir. This is the Council's propery.

 When necessary, samples are examined by the University College of Wales Aberystwyth.
- (e) NUTRITION Advantage is taken at the Welfare Centre of instructing mothers as to the value of nutrition.
- (f). SHELL-FISH. (Molluscan). There are no Shell-Fish Beds in the district.

SECTION F - PREVALENCE OF, AND CONTROL OVER, INFECTIOUS AND OTHER DISEASES.

(2). Diptheria Antitoxin is supplied at the Council's expense when necessary, but owing to the immediate admission of cases of Biphtheria to the County Isolation Hospital, few cases receive antitoxin before admission. No cases were notified during the year.

There have been no cases of Malaria or Dysentry notified during the year.

According to Infectious Diseases Regulation 1927, a supply of forms are provided for notification of Malaria, Dysentry, Acute Primary and Acute Influenzal Pneumonia.

No action has been necessary under the Public Health (Small-pox Prevention) Regulations 1917. Disinfection of promises and articles exposed to infection is carried out by the Council.
