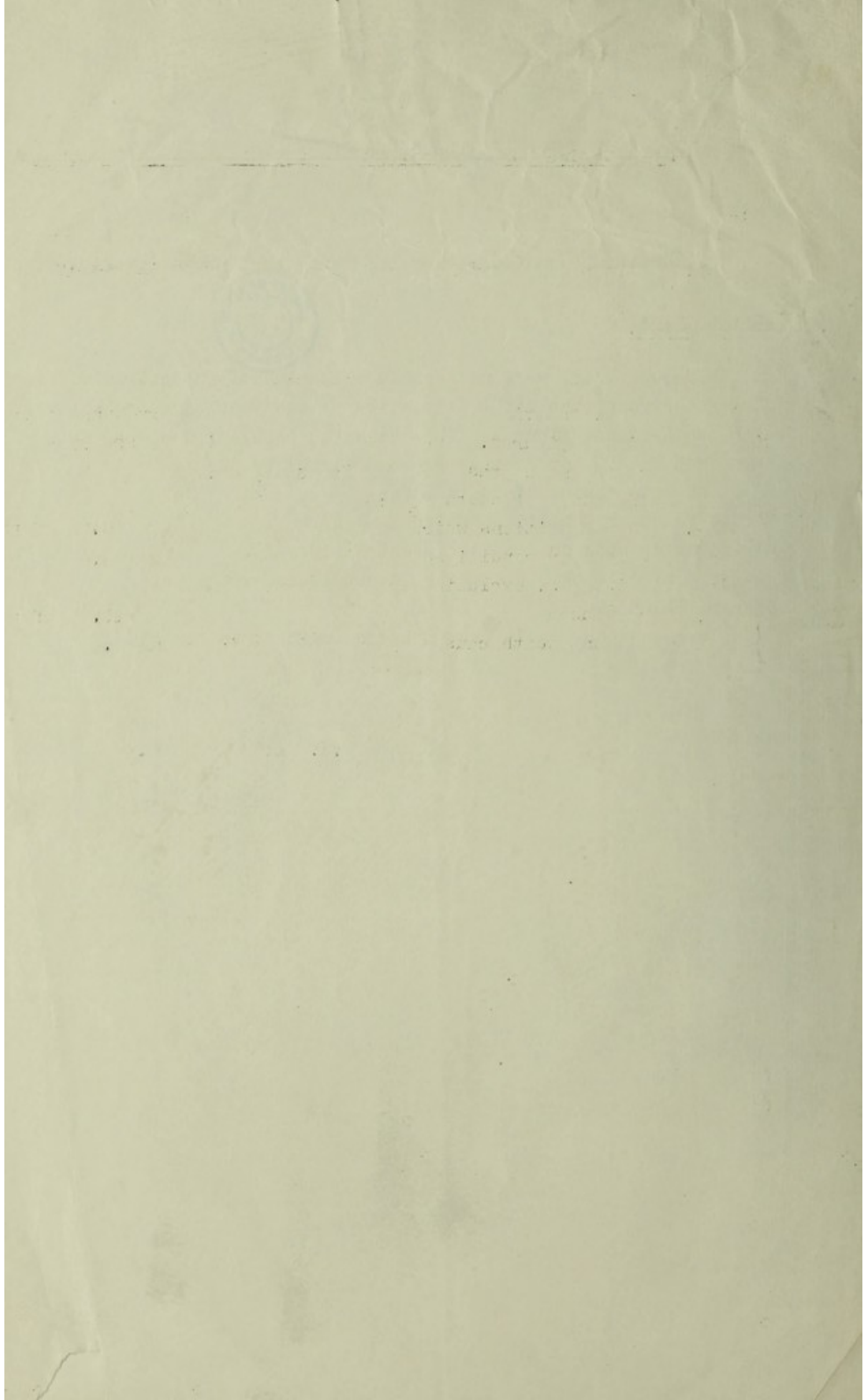

Unit "J" of the Mass Radiography Service is stationed at the neighbouring town of Llanelly (Mondays except Bank Holidays and August month) for the service of the general public who wish to avail themselves of the opportunity of a Chest X-Ray.

BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE.

The National Blood Transfusion Service visited Carmarthen Bay Power Station during the year.

Number of donations received were 183. This compares with a figure of 198 for the previous year.

Regular sessions for the general public are held at the neighbouring town of Llanelly. Most people can donate blood to the "Blood Bank" and the amount of blood taken is quickly restored from the body's reserve which is replaced in a matter of days. With the everlasting and ever increasing need for blood, I appeal that, in the future, more people will donate blood for this most worthy and needy cause.

The figure of usage of blood in the hospitals serving the area is not known, but it can be assumed to be higher than that for the previous years.

RAJAH MANSION X-RAY SERVICE.

The Rajah Mansion X-ray Service visited Government X-ray Power Station during the year.

Number of patients received were 18. This compares with a total of 15 for the previous year.

Regular sessions for the general public are held at the Rajah Mansion of Monday. Most people can be seen from 10.00 am to 12.00 pm and the chest of blood taken in a timely manner from the chest which is placed in a carrier of days. With the exception and with increasing need for blood, I repeat that, in the future, more people will be able to avail themselves of chest X-ray and chest X-ray.

The figure of cases of blood in the Rajah Mansion during the year was 18, but it can be seen to be higher than for the previous year.
