Gentlemen,

I have the honour to submit to you my annual report for the year ended December 31st, 1936,

Seven vessels arrived from foreign ports, with timber, the total tonnage being 1681 tons.

None of these had a history of disease occurring during the voyage, excepting one case of GONORRHEA this case was recommended for treatment at the next port of call. No serious defects were found and the quarters were fairly clean on the whole,

FOOD No foreign meat or other food was imported,

COASTWISE TRADE All the trade is carried on between London, Liverpool and Ellsmere Port being mainly Cement, Petroleum, and General Cargo,

NUISANCES These were investigated and a number of dead animals removed from the foreshore.

HOSPITAL The hospital at Cynifryn continues to be ready for any emergency, in all cases of inspections, enquires were made as to the presence of rats, but no need for treatment was necessary.

Enclosed is an account of the Sanitary Inspector.

Dear Sir,

I herewith beg to enclose particulars of shipping inspections for the year ended December 31st 1936.

The quarters of one ship was disinfected during the year at the request of the Captain, this was due to a case of Tuberculosis who was discharged and entered a Sanatorium for treatment.

No statutory notices were issued as none was found necessary, verbal notice was given respecting untidy and unclean quarter in one case.

Nuisances were dealt with on eight separate occasions, the cause being dead animals on the foreshore. These were immediately removed and disposed of.
