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

PREFACE.

To the Chairman and Members of the Public Health ; Public Assistance and Housing Committee.

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Annual Report, 1940.

Owing to the stress of circumstances and at the express wish of the Ministry of Health, this report is substantially reduced as compared with reports prepared under more favourable conditions.

So far as I personally am concerned, I have been engaged to a considerable extent in the preparation of hospital provision for possible civil or military cases and developing the casualty service of the A.R.P. organisation in the County. Although these duties have necessitated my being domiciled in Ruthin since the commencement of the war, the functions of the department in Wrexham, where all public health activities are concentrated, have worked smoothly and it is a pleasure to record my appreciation of the loyalty of the staff there and the conscientious manner in which they have performed their many tasks.

There has been no depletion or alteration in the personnel of the department during the year, with the exception of the calling-up of two clerks for military service.

I wish to thank the Committee for their whole-hearted support of all my recommendations, and also to Mr. William Jones, C.B.E., Clerk of the County Council and his Deputy, Mr. William Roberts, for their helpful co-operation at all times.

There were no changes in the personnel of the staff during the year.

Births.

2395 births were notified as belonging to the County of Denbigh during the year 1940, the birth-rate being 14.2. These figures compared with 2246 and 14.2 in 1939.

Deaths.

2546 deaths were notified in the County during the year 1940, or a death-rate of 15.1. The respective figures for 1939 were 2189 and 13.6.

Infant Mortality.

The number of deaths of children under 1 year of age in the County during 1940 was 192 or 78.7 as compared with 129 or 57.2 for the year 1939.

Yearly Report on the work of the North Wales Society for the Blind in the County of Denbigh (1940-41).

The Society has this year 409 Registered Blind Persons (excluding evacuees) under its care in the County of Denbigh. The area is divided between five Home Teachers who visit the Blind regularly and see to their needs in the way of extra nourishment, clothing, boots, etc., applications for which are forwarded to the Society for sanction. A great deal of work is also carried on in connection with "Prevention of Blindness" by the sanctioning of spectacles, hospital treatment, drops, etc.

Many Blind Persons are taught by the Home Teachers to read Braille and Moon Embossed type and also do Handwork.

Several Blind Persons have received training in Basketry etc., at various Institutions and in Denbighshire there are 14 Home Workers who forward goods for sale at the Bangor Depot. They each receive augmentation of 50% on their earnings from the Society. There are also 4 Workers in a Workshop in Chester.

Of the number of Registered Blind, 229 plus 30 evacuees are in receipt of Unemployable Blind Grants, which are paid on behalf of the County Council by the Society. Medical Aid is also granted on application to the County Council.

White walking sticks are supplied free of charge to all who apply for same.

Library Books are forwarded weekly from Bangor to readers.

Last Christmas 377 Blind Persons in the County received a gift of 4/- each, the total amount paid out being £175 8s. 0d. This money is mostly collected by children in the schools of the area and it is much appreciated. In addition to this gift, the County Council kindly allows a Christmas gift to all Blind Persons who are in receipt of an Unemployable Blind Grant.

Through **the kindness of the Crosville Motor Company**, 117 Bus Vouchers were distributed in Denbighshire. These vouchers enable the holders to travel within a radius of 12 miles from their homes, for the nominal sum of 2/6 per annum.

The war has brought 48 evacuees into the area. These are visited by the Home Teachers and grants are paid them through the Society.

In the Wrexham area Blind People continue to enjoy rambles, singing classes, teas, etc.

The Society has been very fortunate in realising one of its long desired aims—that of establishing a Home for the Blind in North Wales. This Home is situated in Abergele, and it is hoped that it will be officially opened early in the New Year.

REPORT OF MR. J. H. WYNNE, F.R.C.V.S., COUNTY VETERINARY OFFICER, FOR THE YEAR 1940.

Diseases of Animals Acts and Orders.

The Quarterly Reports of the Divisional Veterinary Inspector, Animal Health Division of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries show the total number of cases of Scheduled (Notifiable) Diseases of Animals to be

Anthrax	1 confirmed case

Milk and Dairies Acts and Orders.

During the Year, 35 "Tuberculin Tested" Licences were issued, four of which were surrendered; and 396 Accredited Licences were issued under the Milk (Special Designation) Orders.

Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) Schemes of the Ministry of Agriculture.

There were 289 Attested Herds and 2 supervised herds in Denbighshire at the end of 1940.

Clinical Examination of Dairy Cattle.

- (a) **Tuberculin Tested Herds.** (These are Clinically examined every 6 months, in addition to the Testing with Tuberculin).

2630 examinations were carried out, and only one cow had to be slaughtered under the Tuberculosis Order.

- (b) **Accredited Herds** (Clinically examined every 3 months).

38,863 examinations were carried out and 97 of these cows were slaughtered under the Tuberculosis Order.

- (c) **Non-designated Herds.** (Clinically examined every 6 months).

Denbighshire is the only County in North Wales where these Herds are periodically examined.

18,459 examinations resulted in the detection of 41 cows affected with Tuberculosis, and these were slaughtered under the Tuberculosis Order.

Tuberculin Testing of Herds Licensed to produce Tuberculin Tested and Certified Milk.

2308 Animals, including bulls, were Tuberculin Tested. 111 of these were Certified to be Reactors, and were removed from the herds.
