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



Staff.

There were no changes in the personnel of the staff during the year.

Births.

2617 Births (for birth-rate calculations) were notified as belonging to the County during the year, the birth-rate being 14.4. These figures compared with 2395 and 14.2 in 1940.

Deaths.

2375 deaths were notified in the County during 1941, or a death-rate of 13.0. The respective figures for 1940 were 2546 and 15.1.

Infant Mortality.

The number of deaths of children under 1 year of age in the County in 1941 was 180, or 68.7, as compared with 192 and 78.7 in the previous year.

The number of re-examinations had to be reduced owing to the difficulty of seeing so many, especially at the Wrexham Clinic. At the latter, four-hour clinics were not unusual and it was found that a patient might have to wait up to three hours before being examined. The increasing difficulty in travelling also affected re-attendances.

(c) Evacuees.

Those in the Wrexham area were examined at a special weekly clinic, which was started on April 10th. Whereas in other areas they were seen with the County cases at the appropriate clinics.

369 examinations were carried out at this special Wrexham clinic. In those cases where conditions were undesirable for confinement in their temporary homes they were mostly admitted to Gerwyn Hall Maternity Home. There were, however, many confinements in private houses and especially in the various nursing homes.

MILK AND DAIRIES ACTS AND ORDERS.

During the year 32 "Tuberculin Tested" Licences and 404 Accredited Licences were issued under the Milk (Special Designations) Orders.

Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) Scheme of the Ministry of Agriculture.

There were 277 Attested Herds and 1 Supervised Herd in Denbighshire at the end of 1941.

Clinical Inspection of Dairy Cattle.

- (a) Tuberculin Tested Herds.—Clinically examined every 6 months, in addition to the Tuberculin Test. 2032 examinations were carried out, and not a single case had to be dealt with under the Tuberculosis Order.
- (b) Accredited Herds.—Clinically examined every 3 months. 38,877 examinations were conducted, resulting in the detection and slaughter of 46 cows under the Tuberculosis Order.
- (c) Non-designated Herds.—Clinically examined every 6 months (Denbighshire is the only North Wales County where these Herds are periodically examined). 18,899 examinations resulted in the detection of 15 cows affected with Tuberculosis, and these were slaughtered under the Order.


