### DOLGELLAU RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Annual Report of the District Medical Officer of Health for the year 1958 TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE DOLGELLAU RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Mr. Chairman, Gentlemen,

I have the honour to submit the Health Report for the year ending 31st December 1958.

Once again there was a drastic fall in the population as estimated by the Registrar General from 9,900 in 1956; 8,670 in 1957 to 7,820 in 1958.

There was an increase of two in the number of live births as compared with the previous year and there was one fewer still birth, than in 1957, and an increase of two in the infant mortality figures.

There were 13 more deaths than in 1957 and once again the live births were below the number of deaths.

The number of cancer deaths showed an increase of two (cancer of the stomach 5, Cancer of Bronchus & lungs 2).

Diseases of the heart and circulatory system were the major causes of death (more than half the total of deaths) and in this group coronary disease increased from seven to nineteen.

There were no deaths from tuberculosis but the number of notifications of pulmonary disease increased from 4 to 9, the incidence being in the higher age groups. There were no notifications of non pulmonary disease.

The epidemics of whooping cough and measles, which occurred at the end of the previous year were carried on into 1958.

One case of pneumonia was notified.

A case notified as being poliomyelities at the end of the year was ammended, in the new year. The cause was then ascribed to a different virus.

No cases of food poisoning were notified during the year.

Immunisation of babies and young children is carried out at the Primary Schools.

One fully equipped hospital at Dolgellau.

There are no industries in the district to pollute the rivers and streams but there are some careless individuals who insist on throwing tins and refuse into the streams. Warning notices are posted in some localities to cease this undesirable custom but it is difficult to achieve.

### Refuse Collection:

The Council have provided a satisfactory covered lorry, the necessary staff and a number of refuse disposal sites and undertakes by direct labour the scavenging of the scattered built-up villages and houses en route throughout the 14 parishes, which involves approximately 360 miles per week. The scheme has now been extended to include the Parish of Pennal. Twice weekly collections are made in the Corris, and Llanegryn areas.

### Smoke Abatement:

No action was taken in this respect during the year.
