GENTLEMEN.

I beg to submit for your information my ANNUAL REPORT for the year 1925.

I.-GENERAL STATISTICS.

Area, 39,149 acres.

Population, 4,191.

Number of Inhabited Houses, 816.

Number of families or separate occupiers, 818.

Rateable Value, £35,629.

Sum represented by a penny rate, £92 8s. 5d.

The District is entirely Agricultural.

There are several small villages and two large institutions, e.g.

- A. The Mid-Wales Mental Hospital at Talgarth, containing 400 patients.
- B. The South Wales Sanatorium at Pontywal, with 300 beds for Tubercular male patients.

There is at present a temporary industrial area in the district, e.g. in the Gwryny Fawr Valley, in the Black Mountains, where the Abertillery Water Board are building a reservoir. The workmen are housed in a number of wooden buts which are well drained. They have a small Hospital for the treatment of urgent cases, and a trained nurse resides there.

In 1920 there were 72 births with a Birth-rate of 22.5.

This of course means that you have now a large number of persons in the district unprotected from Small-pox. In my experience the objection to vaccination is due to two reasons—

- i. The mother objects to you hurting her baby.
- ii. The fact that vaccination makes the baby ill and consequently cross for a few days.

I believe that if the Vaccination Laws were altered, so that instead of vaccinating children before they are 4 months old, the period could be extended to 5 years, that is, all children must be vaccinated before they are allowed to go to school, 90 per cent. of the exemptions would disappear.

You are spending about £900 a year on the Public Health and Sanitary Services in your district, and I think it may be useful to see what you are getting for this and whether you could not increase your activities.

- When the Trefecca Water Scheme is completed, every village in your district will be supplied with a good supply of pure water.
 - 2. You have a Sewerage Scheme for Talgarth and Bronllys.
- 3. You undertake the removal of House Refuse at Talgarth, I think it would be an advantage if you also did this for Bronllys.

You have no Isolation Hospital in the district, but you have got an arrangement with the Hay Urban District to admit patients into their Hospital at Hay, and I consider this is a satisfactory arrangement.

You have no Maternity or Child Welfare Centre in the district. This part of the Health Service you have delegated to the County Council, but I think you might consider the advisibility of asking the



County Council to start a Child Welfare Centre, either at Talgarth or Glasbury.

You have a distinct scarcity of houses in the district. You have decided to build 18 houses, but the scheme does not seem to progress very rapidly, might I suggest that it would expediate matters if you appointed an Architect immediately and asked him to submit plans.

4.- CAUSES OF SICKNESS.

The incidence of sickness has been light. There was no epidemic and no schools were closed for illness during the year.

I believe that one of the causes of sickness in young children is unclean milk, and I would wish to bring to your notice the Clean Milk Competition organised by the Brecon and Radnor Agricultural Education Committee. I was glad to see that there were two farmers from your district who entered for this competition last year. I would like to see all the farmers in the district entering for this competition, and I am pleased to see that the Agricultural Organiser is prepared to advise milk producers free of charge and will visit farms to study the conditions on the spot, and thereby make it possible to give reliable guidance.

5 .- SUMMARY OF NURSING ARRANGEMENTS.

There are two certified Midwives in the district, one at Talgarth and one at Three Cocks. There is also one at Erwood in the Builth Rural District, whose practice covers part of your district.

There is a small Isolation Hospital at Hay to which you can send patients suffering from Infectious Diseases.

6.-LABORATORY WORK.

Your Council has made arrangements with the Clinical Research Association for Bacteriological Examinations. During the year fourteen reports were received from this Association.
