This is carried out by the Medical Staff of the County Health Department.

FOOD POISONING

There were no cases of Food Poisoning notified during the year.

DYSENTERY

There were no cases of Dysentery notified during the year.

TYPHOID AND PARATYPHOID

There were no cases of Typhoid and Paratyphoid notified during the year.

VENEREAL DISEASES

There were no cases notified during the year.

The County Council has an agreement with the Regional Hospital Board for the treatment of these cases. There are no treatment centres in the area and patients attend at Swansea Mount Pleasant Hospital, Hereford County Hospital, Royal Gwent Hospital, Newport, and Moira Terrace, Cardiff. The tracing of contacts and the following up of defaulters is the responsibility of the County Council.

NATIONAL ASSISTANCE ACT, 1948, S.47

LABORATORY FACILITIES

During the year facilities were available at the Public Health Laboratories at Cardiff, Newport, Swansea, Carmarthen and Aberystwyth.

All water samples were sent to the Public Health Laboratory at Hereford and Milk samples were dealt with at Carmarthen.

Any investigations required in the control of Infectious Diseases were carried out at the Public Health Laboratory in Cardiff.

HOSPITALS

Hospital facilities are available at the Brecon War Memorial Hospital and the Hereford Hospitals.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES HOSPITAL

Cases are admitted to the Mardy Isolation Hospital, Merthyr Tydfil and the Hereford Isolation Hospital.

SMALLPOX HOSPITALS

Arrangements have been made for Smallpox cases to be admitted to St. Mary's Hospital, Penarth, and for Consultants to be called in to suspected cases. On diagnosing a case the Consultant will be responsible for arranging for St. Mary's Hospital to be ready, staffed and to receive the patient.

The patient will be removed by County Council under their Ambulance Scheme made under S.27 of the National Health Service Act, 1946.

Sanitary Circumstances

Water Supplies

The Radnorshire and North Breconshire Water is responsible for the water supplies in the district. Water is extracted from Llanbwchlllyn Lake and the River Wye at Llyswen; fully treated at both Purification Plants and supplied through the mains to the district.

Three samples were taken from the Tyruched private supply which serves part of the village of Glasbury(Breconshire); two samples were satisfactory and one was unsatisfactory.

Five samples were taken for bacteriological examination from various private sources; 4 were satisfactory and 1 unsatisfactory.

DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE

The position with regard to public sewerage for the district was as follows : -

Talgarth and Bronllys Sewage Disposal Scheme

The Contractors, Buttington Contractors Ltd., were engaged on the work of constructing a new sewage disposal works at Talgarth and the laying of a sewer from the village of Bronllys to connect this Village to the new works.

Llanigon Sewerage and Sewage Disposal Scheme

The Contractors, Clee Hill Contractors Ltd., carried out the work of constructing a sewage disposal works and the laying of sewers for this village during the year. The scheme was completed and all property owners were informed that they could connect their drains to the new sewers.

Ffordlas Sewerage and Sewage Disposal Scheme

The Council approved a Scheme for the laying of sewers and the construction of a sewage disposal works for this Hamlet.

Planning permission and approval of the Wye River Authority was obtained and the necessary land purchased for the sewage works site.

Work was started on the scheme at the end of 1971.

Drainage and Sewerage Continued : -

Glasbury(Breconshire) Sewerage and Sewage Disposal Scheme

The Council gave further consideration to this scheme during the year, and approved the revised sewer layout.

The Consulting Engineers submitted further plans and details and these were submitted to Breconshire County Council and Wye River Authority who gave approval to the scheme.

Planning consent was granted for the erection of a sewage pumping station which will pump the sewage to the proposed works to be sited on land adjoining the existing works at Glasbury(Radnorshire)

General

A sewage works maintenance scheme is employed by the Council, jointly with Paincastle Rural and Hay Urban District Councils, comprising two workmen with small van for regular maintenance of all the sewage disposal works.

The emptying of the tanks and cesspools is undertaken by a local contractor.

Public Cleansing

The Refuse collection service is carried out by the Council's workmen and lorry jointly with Paincastle Rural and Hay Urban District Councils under the supervision of the Public Health Inspector.

Refuse is collected once weekly in Talgarth, Bronllys, Llyswen, Pipton, Tregoyd and Velindre, Aberllynfi, Llanigon and Hay Rural Parishes. The outlying parts of these parishes, including Pengefnffordd and Capel-y-ffin, have a monthly collection.

Refuse is disposed of by controlled tipping on the Council's refuse tip at Talgarth.

The new 20 cubic yard fore and aft refuse vehicle with power press loader has been found satisfactory and enables a larger quantity of refuse to be loaded also reduces the number of journeys to tip.

Caravan Sites

- 2) Riverside Caravan Park, Bronllys, for a maximum of 34 holiday caravans for the period Maunday Thursday to 31st October in each year. Part of the site can also be used for camping purposes.
- 3) Hollybush Inn, Hay-on-Wye, for a maximum of 10 Holiday caravans for the period Maunday Thursday to 31st October in each year.

There are adequate toilet and washing facilities provided in accordance with the requirements of the Site Licensing conditions.

Planning permission was granted during the year for a caravans site at Chapel Farm, Capel-y-ffin, for a maximum of 15 holiday caravans for the period Maunday Thursday to 31st October in each year.

The owner was asked to submit detailed plans of caravan layout and for sanitary and washing accommodation, drainage and water supply as required under Site Licence and Planning conditions.

HOUSING

The Council own 328 dwellings, including 37 bungalows. There is also a Warden's flat and a Communal Room for the Old People's Bungalows at Talgarth.

There were 9 private houses erected in the district during 1971 making a total of 93 erected since 1945.

Housing Sites at Talgarth, Bronllys and Gwernyfed

The Welsh Office granted approval and tenders were invited during the year for erection of the following Council dwellings : -

The tender submitted by Drury South Western Ltd., was accepted by the Council and work on these sites had commenced by the end of the year.

Proposed Housing at Velindre

Revised layout plans for the erection of eight 3-bedroom bungalows and one 2 bedroom bungalow with shop were granted planning permission by Breconshire County Council in respect of the site in School Road, Velindre prior to the invitation of tenders for the erection of these dwellings and provision of site works.

Proposed Housing Site at Gwernyfed Park

The Breconshire County Council granted "outline" planning permission for housing development on 5.55 acres of land in Gwernyfed Park as an extension to the Council's existing housing estate. The land is owned by Breconshire Education Committee, being part of Gwernyfed School grounds, and they have agreed to sell this area to the Council subject to terms being agreed with the District Valuer, to whom plans and particulars were submitted

Proposed Housing Site at Llanigon

The Breconshire County Council granted "outline" planning permission for housing development on 2.5 acres of land at the rear of Dgeddi Housing Estate in the village of Llanigon. Plans and particulars were submitted to the District Valuer for terms of purchase to be negotiated with the landowner.

Proposed Housing Site at Glasbury

The Council gave consideration during the year to the erection of 8 houses in Glasbury. Various sites were discussed and the Council came to the conclusion that the most suitable site was on part of Field No. 767 opposite the old railway station. Accordingly an application was submitted to Breconshire County Council for "outline" planning permission.
