

There is no ambulance. Hospital ambulances are sent from Liverpool and Chester for serious cases.

- (c). NURSING IN THE HOME.

 Voluntary organisations provide existing facilities.
- (d). TREATMENT CENTRES AND CLINICS.

 Administered by the Flintshire County Council.
- There is no hospital in the area.

SECTION C.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES IN THE AREA .

The following companies supply water within the area.

Brymbo Water Co., Hawarden and District Water Co., Mold Gas and Water Co., Birkenhead Corporation (in bulk).

The Council have also supplies of their own and all supplies have been well maintained.
Chlorinating Plants have been installed on the supplies at Mostyn, Garth, Caerwys, also, an additional Booster Plant has been provided at the Rhosesmor Pumping Station.

SEWERAGE DISPOSAL WORKS.

All sewers and Disposal works have been well maintained.

PUBLIC CIPANSING.

Scavenging of the whole District is undertaken by the Council. The work is carried out by means of contracts and for this purpose the area is divided into 15 separate districts. Generally the work was carried out satisfactorily. Difficulty was experienced in the Ffynnongroew District due to the fact that the Contractor suffered from a severe illness, and was unable to obtain the necessary labour. Another Contractor took the work in hand and no further trouble was experienced. Some trouble was experienced in Districts Nos. 10 and 11, due chiefly to the fact that Contractors have the utmost difficulty in obtaing labour.

REMUSE TIPS.

On the whole those tapes have been well maintained. In some cases they were infested with morauding rats, but have been promptly dealt with by funigation with hydrogen cyanide.

RIVERS AND STREAMS.

No complaints were received.

SHOPS INSPECTION.

All shops were inspected and the statutory provisions relating thereto enforced.

CAMPING SITES.

Sites used for camping were on the whole well maintained, licences issued numbered 17. These sites are regularly inspected and no cause of complaint was noted.

SMOKE ABATEMENT.

No complaints relating to smoke nuisances were received. There are a number of factories in this district and the absence of complaints can be viewed with satisfaction.

SWIMMING POOLS AND BATHS.

There is only one swimming pool within the district. It is privately owned and open only during summer months.

ERADICATION OF BED BUGS.

No cases of infestation were found during the year.

SCHOOLS.

All schools are periodically visited and inspected, the water supply and sanitary arrangements being supervised.

SECTION D.

Inspection of dwelling houses still takes a great deal of the time of the Department. There has been noticeable decline in cases of overcrowding. It is still a difficult problem to have any repairs carried out as the labour shortage in the building trade appears to be acute.

SECTION E.

INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD. MILK SUPPLY. COWSHEDS AND DAIRIES.

The inspection of cowsheds and dairies is carried out regularly. Where conditions were not up to the standard of the Milk and Dairies (3).

Order, instructions were given for the necessary work to be carried out.

MEAT AND OTHER FOODS.

Meat Inspection is carried out at the Ministry of Food Slaughter House, Holywell. Meat Inspection is carried out three or four days each week. In addition emergency slaughtering of casualties is done at all times and these are always examined.
