Section A.

Statistics and Social Conditions of the Area.

Area. There has been no change of boundary and the area of the Ur. an District remains at 2532.4 statutory acres.

Population. The population of the Urban District estimated at mid-year 1948 by the Registrar-General, was 7,840. The corresponding figure for the year 1947 was 7,931.

Inhabited Houses. There were 2,386 inhabited houses in the Urban District at the end of the year.

The average number of persons per house was therefore 3.324.

The population density of the area was 3.09 persons per statutory acre.
