# INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

(a) MILE SUPPLY :

There were 18 Inspections of Dairies and Cowsheds; Milk Carts inspections are almost daily. There are 3 Producer Retailers who are retailing as well. Pasteurised Milk which is delivered in bulk from Carmarthen and bottled here in the Dairies of the Retailers, which in my opinion is not satisfactory, as the Order prescribes that it should be bottled at the Pasteurized Station and kept in Cold Storage af 50 F till delivery to the consumer.

## (b) MEAT AND OTHER FOODS :

Number of animals slaughtered :—Cattle, 1192; Calves, 1032; Pigs, 242; Sheep, 7,576.
 Total of various kind of meat and edible offals condemned were 30,749 lbs., and in addition 212 tins of

# MILK (SPECIAL DESIGNATIONS) ORDER 1936.

There is no Designated Milk being retailed within the Borough and the sampling of all the Local Milk is now undertaken every fortnight by the County Agricultural Committee. 25 Samples of Lee Cream were taken for Bacteriological Examination—18 of them were certified in Grade 1, 5 in Grade 2, 1 in Grade 3, and 1 in Grade 4.

15 Samples of the Town Water Supply was taken for Bacteriological Examination, 12 of them were

satisfactory and 3 unsatisfactory. 1 Sample of the Town Water Supply was taken for Chemical Examination and was found satisfactory

for drinking and domestic purpose

One Sample of the Town Sewerage was taken. It did not conform to the Standard of the Royal Commission.

GENERAL :

The District has been practically free from infectious diseases during the year. No cases of Encephalitis Lethargica, Malaria, Dysentry, or Trench Fever were notified during the year. Diphtheria Antitoxin is supplied free to Medical Practitioners by the Council. Examinations of Pathological and Bacteriological specimens are made by the Emergency Medical Service. Reports of the non-notifiable Infectious Diseases are sent to me by the Head Teachers of the Schools, such as Impetigo, Influenza, Whooping Cough, Vermin, etc. These children are excluded from School until free from infection.

There were no cases of Anthrax or Rabies. Facilities are provided by the Council for the cleansing and disinfection of verminous persons and their belongings at the Temple Buildings, where there is a steam disinfector. All the houses at which Infectious Diseases were notified were visited by the Sanitary Inspector and

disinfected.
