PREFACE

I have pleasure in presenting the Annual Report of the Health Department for the year ended 31st December, 1960.

The number of registered live births was twenty-three, a decrease of five on the figure for the previous year. There were no stillbirths and no infant deaths. No mother died as the result of childbirth.

The number of registered deaths was thirty-eight, five fewer than in 1959. The death rate expressed as per thousand population is very much higher in the Borough of Lampeter than it is in the country as a whole. This is certainly due to the large number of elderly people who are resident in the area. Five persons died of cancer and twenty-eight died of heart and circulatory diseases.

The only cases of infectious diseases notified during the year were fifteen cases of measles. This is a very good reflection on the state of health of the inhabitants of the Borough.

There were two new cases of pulmonary tuberculosis but no one died from this disease.

The year 1960 was one of great activity in the history of the Lampeter Borough Council. Progress was made on the building of twenty Council houses and six bungalows. The sewerage and sewage disposal scheme was completed. This was a costly but, nevertheless, essential scheme and the cost will be amply repaid by the great advantage of safeguarding the health of the inhabitants of Lampeter.

A more detailed account of the work of the Department will be found in the ensuing pages which include a section prepared by the Public Health Inspector.

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES IN THE AREA

These are essentially the same as in 1959. The main features are as follows:-

- (a) No ante-natal or post-natal clinic is held in the district by the local health authority. Expectant and nursing mothers receive medical advice from their own medical attendant and from the consultant obstetrician.
- (b) an infant welfare clinic is held at Lampeter once a fortnight.
- (c) The domiciliary midwifery service is carried out by the district nurses who are also State Certified Midwives.
- (d) A health visitor covers the Lampeter area.
- (e) Home nursing is in the hands of the district nurse.
- (f) Poliomyelitis vaccination is carried out by the local health authority and immunisation against diphtheria is performed partly by the former and partly by the person's own medical attendant.
- (g) An ambulance is stationed at Lampeter.
- (h) Arrangements for the prevention of illness are carried out by medical officers and the health visitor of the local health authority. Care and after-care is in the hands of the district nurse and of the health visitor. Tuberculosis cases are also followed up by the Chest Physician's health visitor.
- (i) Home help is provided by suitable persons engaged locally.
- (j) The Borough of Lampeter lies almost mid-way between the town of Aberystwyth and Carmarthen in both of which general hospitals exist. The former is under the aegis of the Mid-Wales Hospital Management Committee and the latter under its West Wales counterpart. Public Health Laboratories of the Medical Research Council are also to be found in both centres. The infectious diseases' hospital for the area is at Tanybwlch, close to Aberystwyth.

It affords me much pleasure to present my contribution to the Annual Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the year ending 31st December, 1960.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Q. SEWERAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL

In April 1958 Messrs. Hussey Egan and Pickmere commenced work on the Lampeter and Cwmanne Joint Sewerage and Sewage Disposal Scheme, designed by Messrs. Thomas, Morgan and Partners, Pontypridd. The completed system which became operative in March was handed over in September of this year. The Lampeter portion of the scheme comprises some 4,000 yards of concrete and cast iron sewers. The following details appertain to the Sewage Disposal Works.

4. REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL AND CLEANSING

<u>Street Cleansing</u> - Main town centre roads are cleansed daily. Unclassified roads, once weekly.

- <u>Road Gulleys</u> These are cleansed once every three weeks, and during summer months are disinfected once weekly.
- Refuse Collection -Household, and trade refuse are collected once weekly. A mechanical dustless loading vehicle is employed for this purpose.
- <u>Refuse Disposal</u> Two acres of marshland adjoining the Dulas stream, is utilized for refuse disposal. Although controlled tipping is practised, the proximity of the area to the Maesyfelin Housing Estate gives rise to a certain amount of offensiveness. The site should shortly be completed, and it will therefore be essential to site the new tipping area in a position far removed from any dwellings.

5. FILTHY OR VERMINOUS FREMISES

It is again most gratifying to report that not a single case of filthy or verminous persons or premises have been discovered, or notified during the year.

There are not any offensive trades within the Borough. Materials from the slaughterhouse which are utilized for bi products are collected by traders and processed at various factory premises outside the area of the Borough Council.

8. INFECTIOUS DISEASE

There were no cases notified, neither was it necessary to disinfect any premises.

9. FOOD POISONING

Nothing notified during the year.

10. COMMON LODGING HOUSES

There are no Lodging Houses within the Borough as defined in the Public Health Act, 1936.

There are in existence two Welfare Homes, wherein the aged are provided with care. Both are administered by the County Council, and a high standard of cleanliness and hygiene is constantly maintained.

11. LICENSED PREMISES

Each of these premises is inspected once quarterly. All are provided with suitable and satisfactory sanitary accommodation for both sexes, and are well maintained hygienically. This year the Brewery Companies concerned are undertaking a programme of redecoration of their houses.

12. MOVEABLE DWELLINGS

There are not any Licensed Caravan Sites within the Borough. With the introduction of new Legislation controlling the development of caravan sites, every person who erects or stations even one caravan will in future, have to comply with more stringent regulations. Thus Council will be able to exercise a similar control over these dwellings as they do over permanent structures.

13. RODENT AND HEST CONTROL

The wet summer was not conducive to insect infestation generally experienced at refuse tips and slaughterhouses. However an extremely heavy infestation occurred at the sewage disposal works, where several millions of a species of fly larvae was encountered in the digestion tanks.
