PREVALENCE OF AND CONTROL OVER DISEASES OTHER THAN TUBERCULOSIS.

There was no outbreak in influenza this year and it caused no deaths in the district.

In fact no cases of infectious diseases were notified in the area during the year.

FOOD POISONING.

No cases were notified in the area during the year.

IMMUNISATION AND VACCINATIONSDIPHTHERIA

For at least twelve years no diphtheria has occurred in the area and no case was notified in the County but a reminder is required that the disease might recur in this district if a high level of immunity is not maintained in children. Parents should therefore ensure that their own children are protected by obtaining the necessary inoculations from their family doctor or at the Infant Welfare Clinic which is held on alternate Wednesday afternoons at the Church Hall from 2 - 4 p.m.

During 1959 only 15 children under 5 years of age received combined inoculations against diphtheria and whooping cough and four booster doses were given. Four other children received inoculations against diphtheria only, and 8 children were inoculated against whooping cough only.

In addition, a number of infants were vaccinated against smallpox by their family doctor or at the Clinic. Separate figures for Llandeilo are not available but in the whole County 1,134 infants, estimated as 48% of the total births registered for the year, received this vaccination. This compares with 1,140 or 47.62% for the previous year.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES IN THE AREA....T.R.

The supply of water to the Town is obtained from two sources (a) Maesevan Reservoir and (b) Llandyfan Spring.

Maesevan Reservoir is situated $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Town at 397 O.D. and 110 feet above the highest point of the Town. This supply is derived from land springs above the reservoir the latter having a capacity of 1,000,000 gallons.

Llandyfan Spring is situated $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Town at 480 feet O.D. and 193 feet above the highest point of the Town. The supply is derived from a spring in a limestone stratum, with an estimated overflow of 1,000,000 gallons per day.

Both supplies are conveyed by gravitation to the Town in 5" cast iron pipes. The Maesevan pipe line is approximately 100 years old. Examination of the interior surfaces of the pipes show considerable incrustation. The Llandyfan mains are in good condition although 60 years old. This supply is chlorinated at the rate of .3 parts per million, with a Wallace and Tiernan plant at Derwydd.

The Town mains supply parts of Ffairfach and Rhosmaen in the Llandeilo Rural Area and the total population supplied is approximately 4,000. The average daily estimated consumption is 100,000 gallons. All Town properties have a piped supply.

Adequate supplies were available during the year and no restrictions were necessary during the exceptionally dry summer.

DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE.

The Sewers of the Town are combined, taking both sewage and surface water. The sewers serve the Town with the exception of several houses in the Nantyrhibo area. The sewers are constructed in stoneware pipes and culverts.

During 1959 the re-sewering of the Town was completed. The sewers are connected to a trunk main and the sewage is now treated at the Joint Sewage Works at Ffairfach.

Previously the sewage was discharged, untreated, directly into the River Towy.

PUBLIC CLEANSING.

A twice weekly collection of household refuse is made throughout the town. This work is carried out by direct labour.

A collection of Trade Refuse is carried out once weekly.

Disposal of refuse is carried out on a tip outside the District, owned and controlled by a private individual.

RODENT CONTROL.

The Council dispensed with the services of the full time female operator during the year. Rodent Control is now carried out by Council Workmen under the direction of the Public Health Inspector.

The Town Sewers are treated twice yearly in accordance with the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries instructions.

FOOD.

The Council owns a commodious Market Hall divided into Stalls. Four of these Stalls are occupied by Butchers, a caterer, and one by a fishmonger.

A sink, wash hand basin and a constant hot water supply have been provided for the use of the Stallholders and Caretaker.

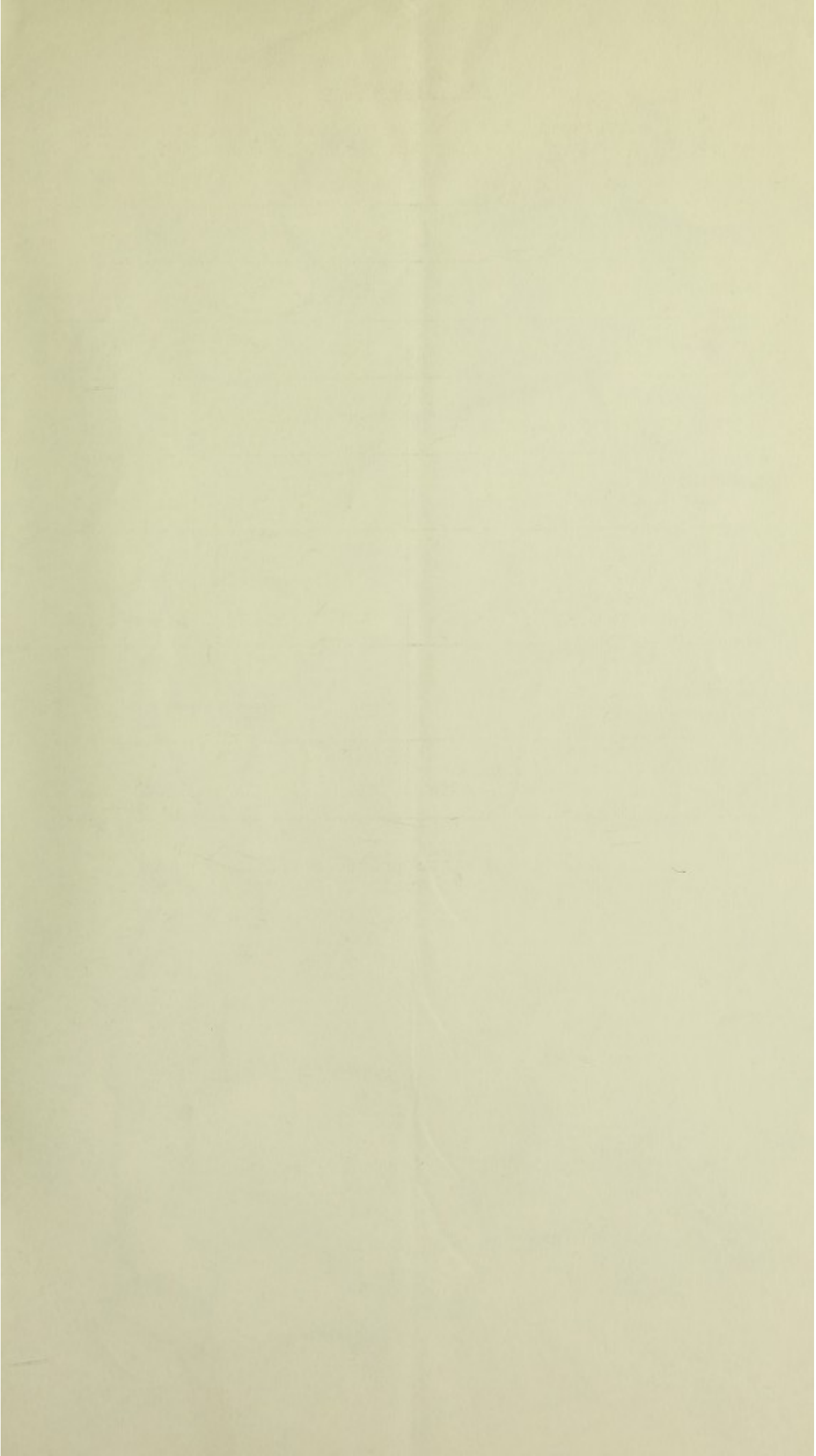
