### NATURAL AND SOCIAL CONDITIONS

During the year 1970 the health of the inhabitants young and old varied little from previous years. No illness could be said to have been directly attributable to poor housing, lack of nutrition, lack of hygiene or major infection.

There were no excessive mortality or epidemics and the health of the townspeople was generally good.

The employment of townspeople is generally as previously indicated in the distribution trades, administrative professions and national undertakings together with those employed in the three Industrial Factories.

### 2. Laboratory Facilities

The examination and analysis of water, sewage effluents and stream contamination are carried out by the Public Analyst of the County Laboratory Carmarthen - Analyst:- H. J. Evans & Partners.

### 3. Health Service

The following services are carried out by the Radnorshire County Council under the National Health Service Act, 1946 and Mantal Health Act, 1959. The County Council services are efficiently and well organised.

### SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA

The water supply undertakers for the district are the Radnorshire and North Breconshire Water Board.

The purification and clarification of the water, as taken from the River Ithon, - Quality was not always satisfactory due to river conditions and lack of settling tanks - Quantity was sufficient. My observations concerning the purification of river water in my report of 1969 still apply. At the end of the year the contract for supply of water from the Birmingham Aquaduct had been started.

No action was necessary by the Health Authority in connection with any form of contamination.

Flouridation. No flouridation was carried out to the water supplied for domestic use by the Radnorshire and North Breconshire Water Board.

### SWIMMING POOL

The swimming pool operated privately by the Hotel Metropole during the summer of 1970 was maintained in a reasonably satisfactory standard. No works of major character have been carried out to remove the dangerous and rough surface. The charges of admission are still very much too high. No progress appears to have been made in provision of a pool jointly with the Education Authority.

The water supply to the pool of 133,000 gallon capacity was taken from the domestic water supply and the pool replenished as necessary. The water was treated by straining and filtration, sterilization being by injection of chlorine. Alkali as sodium carbonate was added as necessary.

Daily tests were made with comparator for free chlorine and alkalinity.

### DRAINAGE AND SEWERS

- 1. Drainage. (a) Generally no major difficulties were experienced in the sewer systems of the town. Arising on flooding of basement offices at Ithon Road due to blockages a new manhole was constructed at a bend on the sewer to ease the problem of rodding.
- (b) The sewer reported on in 1969 to the housing development estate at Cefnllys Lane was extended to the Urban boundary with the Colwyn Rural District by arrangement with that Authority.
- (c) A surface water sower was laid across the garden of four new houses of Victoria Road to prevent the flooding of garden of nearby bungalow.
- (d) Consideration by your Committee was given to the drainage of new housing estate off Grosvenor Road. Calculations of capacities of existing sewers at that part of the town indicated that housing development could take place without over charging sewers. You decided that a sewer pump: system be installed on the new estate.
- (e) During the year you authorised the construction of 2 reptic tanks, one at a farm, the other to be temporary for drainage of three houses on a new estate.
- 2. Sewage Disposal. Certain difficulties occurred at the Disposal works during the year. Failure to drain off sludge from digestion tanks lead to over loading of the tanks. The levels were reduced by pumping out into road tankers and distribution over agricultural land. Additional labour was engaged at the works for cleaning of sludge drying beds.

The works otherwise operated satisfactorily.

Rivers and Streams. Inspection of streams and open water courses were carried out. To prevent flooding the Arlais Brook was cleaned out and widened in the Town Hall grounds. The owners of properties on the stream down stream of Temple Square took minor action in cleaning the stream.

No action on pollution was necessary.

Public Cleansing. (i) In the middle of the year you took delivery of new Compressload Refuse collection vehicle with hydraulic loading equipment and compressing down the refuse 4 to 1.

From delivery date of the new lorry you commenced tipping at the tip of the Rhayader Rural District Council near Nantmel.

The disused Incinerator site at Ddole Road was levelled off, the large accumulation of tins and clinker being deposited in the Civic Amenities tip, the surface of the Ddole Road tip being surfaced with sand so that the site could be used as general open material store.

The Incinerator is to be retained for the burning of confidential papers of various business and public administrative bodies.

The collection and sale of salvaged materials comprising waste paper and scrap iron was continued through the year and the following disposed of:-

- 29 tons waste paper valued at £297
- 22 tons scrap iron valued at £66
- 3 cwts non ferrous metals valued at £15.
- (iii) Civic Amenities Act, 1967. Your arrangements for use of tip at Brookland Road for Civic Amenities tip were continued.

Common Lodging Houses. There are no common lodging houses in the Urban District.

### FOOD

Food Hygiene. The enforcement of the food hygiene regulations was carried out by inspection, advise and informal notices.

Special inspections were again made of the kitchens and food preparation establishments of large hotels and cetering establishments. No prosecutions were found necessary.

Special investigation was necessary at one hotel where a coach load of tourists reported attacks of dioreah after visiting the hotel for one night. No reason for the illnesses were traced.

The inspections of the bakehouse referred to in my report for 1969 were continued. Conditions were improved but the difficulty of the proprietor is age of establishment and equipment.

### HOUSING

During the year new house erections totalled 38. Council erections one and two bedroom bungalows being seventeen and one - two bedroom flat in number.

Private house building numbered 20 bungalows and houses.

One house was officially closed during the year and arrangements were agreed for one flat not to be occupied until repairs were carried out.

The Council purchased 4 acres of land at Quarry Lane for future housing and negotiations were completed at the end of the year for purchase of a further 8 acres.

The Council also purchased three terrace houses of three storey each. These properties being divided into tenements. The purchase was for improvement of the properties into self contained and proper flat dwellings.

Ten housing grants were approved during the year for housing or flat improvements.

Six applications for Qualification Certificates were received and dealt with.

Inspection of houses and flats in respect of housing defects totalled - 34.
