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



(g) Scarlet Fever:

13 cases were reported during the year, as compared with 7 in 1966. The disease continues to be mild.

(h) Whooping Cough:

45 cases were notified during the year.

Measles:

There were 332 cases of measles reported during the year as compared with 400 in 1966. The disease was mainly mild and as far as can be ascertained there were no serious complications.

Dysentery:

All notified cases of Dysentery were investigated and faecal samples taken to the Public Health Laboratory.

All specimens submitted proved negative.

Food Poisoning:

One case of food poisoning was notified and Salmonella Newport was isolated. It was not found possible to trace the source of infection.

Mortuaries

There are no public mortuaries in our area, but by arrangement with Llanelli Borough Council their mortuary is available when necessary. Coroner's cases have, by arrangement between the Coroner and the Regional Hospital Board, been mainly dealt with at the Llanelli or Glangwili hospitals.

Enquiries regarding the domiciliary care of Tuberculous patients should be addressed to the County Medical Officer of Health at Carmarthen.

The County Council will assist in the domiciliary care of Tuberculous and other patients, by the provision on loan or otherwise of beds, bedding, sickroom equipment and home help assistance. In addition, sleeping out shelters are available for certain tuberculous patients.

Assistance is granted in necessitous cases towards the cost of the travelling expenses of relatives visiting long stay patients in hospitals and sanatoria. In practice it has been found that the great majority of applications for assistance have been from relatives

of tuberculous patients.

Assistance is granted for visits to hospitals and sanatoria, which are not less than 40 miles from the residence of the applicant, and is subject to the following conditions:—

(a) That there is urgent reason for the visit because of the patient's serious condition, or that the visit would in medical opinion do the patient good and aid response to treatment.

(b) That because of the length of the journey, the relatives concerned are unable to afford it from their own resources

without substantial hardship.

(c) That subject to (a) above, assistance is restricted to one relative every month or two relatives every two months, unless a senior member of the Medical Staff of the Hospital certifies that more frequent visits are essential on account of the patient's serious condition.

Mass Radiography:

Mass Radiography services are available daily at the New Hospital in Singleton Park, Swansea, and at *Llanelli Odeon Cinema ground on Mondays, except during Bank Holidays and the holiday month of August.

Arrangements are also likely to be made for periodic visits to works and other sites in the area as soon as the facilities available

permits this to be done.

*This arrangement is regrettably to cease after 31/12/1967.

HOSPITALS

The West Wales Isolation Hospital for the treatment of infectious diseases and certain number of cases of Tuberculosis is situated within the area at Tumble.

Local Hospitals:

There are four local hospitals:-

(1) Llanelli General Hospital (160 beds).

(2) Bryntirion Hospital for chronic sick and aged (156 beds).

(3) Glasfryn Maternity Hospital (12 beds) and General Practitioner operated.

(4) Cilymaenllwyd Hospital (43 beds).

Cilymaenllwyd has been used as a pre-convalescent hospital. It has proved of immense value and as a result the surgical waiting list at the General Hospital has been very considerably reduced.

Home Help Service:

The Home Help Service is organised by the Carmarthenshire

County Council.

The Home Helps are provided during the laying-in period of maternity cases where the patient has no relative available to undertake the domestic duties of the home, and also in certain cases of sickness and need. For those on National Assistance limited domestic help can be arranged, when needed, through the National Assistance Board.

Blood Donation Service:

There is a small Blood Bank at the Llanelli General Hospital, and the service of a Pathologist with three trained Technicians is available.

Blood Grouping and Cross Matching are part of the normal laboratory routine and 24 hour service is maintained for emergencies.

Laboratory Facilities:

- (b) Water Analysis—This work is carried out by the County Analyst's Laboratory, Carmarthen, and by the Public Health Laboratories at Carmarthen and Swansea.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA WATER SUPPLY

Considerable useful work was completed or under construction during the year to eliminate or reduce distributional problems, largely by extending the distribution from the Lliedi reservoir and treatment plants.

In addition, the installation of a chlorinating plant at the Llannon reservoir has considerably reduced the possibility of the spread of water borne disease from this storage reservoir, which supplies the major part of the area dependent on the Llynyfan water supply.

An order was made on the 17/10/1967 and retailing of the raw milk ceased. All the milk is now sent to a pasteurising plant.

REPORT OF Mr. A. V. ROWLANDS CHIEF PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTOR

Refuse Collection and Disposal:

The department is responsible for the collection and disposal of house refuse. A collection service is also provided for canteens and industrial wastes. Because of the increased number of factories in our area it has been necessary to expand this service.

Household refuse is collected twice weekly in most areas. The outlying rural areas receive a weekly, fortnightly or monthly col-

lection, depending upon location and accessibility.

Adequate tipping space continues to be a problem. The provision of the new-type refuse lorries has reduced the number of journeys to the tips with consequent economy of time and labour.

It is regretted that the provision of standardized refuse bins by the Council has not been made. If this policy was implemented it would result in economies as well as a higher standard of hygiene.

Eradication of Bed Bugs and other Vermin:

Houses inspected have generally been free from vermin.

Eradication of Ants and Flies:

27 houses were found to be infested with ants or flies, and necessitated an average of three treatments per house.

Schools:

School Kitchens and Canteens are inspected and reports on defects are made to the Schools Medical Officer with requests to remedy any defects discovered.

Rag Flock and other Filling Materials Act, 1951:

No premises exist in the district.

Disinfection:

The four authorities in the Llanelli division share a common disinfector for this purpose. This arrangement is proving satisfactory.

CARAVAN SITES AND CONTROL OF DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1960

Some progress has been made in improving the standards on the licensed caravan sites. This has been achieved by persuasion and regular visiting.

The provision of a caravan site by the Council has now been suspended as the land intended for this use has been earmarked for

development by the Carmarthenshire Education Committee.

The observations made in previous years still apply. Evicted families (from Council and private dwellings) encamp on the sites and aggravate the existing rehousing problems. Concentrated efforts by the Welfare Authorities, to assist problem families to rehabilitate themselves sufficiently to be further considered for rehousing, are still necessary.

Efficient management of caravan sites is crucial and the provision of a site controlled by the Local Authority could be an incentive to private site owners. If co-operation was not forthcoming the unsatisfactory sites could be closed down and the caravans resited

on the Council's caravan site.

The co-operation of the Fire Authority has been readily forthcoming in laying down standards for fire prevention and this is greatly appreciated.

The Department, because of the restricted facilities available, could only deal with abandoned vehicles on Council House Sites.

Where vehicles are abandoned on private land the cooperation of the Police or local scrap metal dealers is usually sought.

Housing Applicants

There were 509 applications on the Council's waiting list on the 31st December, 1967. The cases are investigated by the Department and reports made to the House Letting Committee.

Serious overcrowding has almost ceased to be a problem. The urgent needs for the future would appear to be the provision of suitable accommodation for the aged.

Housing Welfare

The maintenance and improvement of the standard of cleanliness in all Council Houses is attempted by encouragement and the giving of advice to the tenants.

Results have been rewarding as in previous years.

Housing Act, 1958-59-61

A total of 105 applications for grants towards improvement works were approved during the year. Details are as follows:—

The number of grants approved numbered 64, amounting to a cost of £20,478 12s. 9d.

The refuse tips were regularly treated for infestations by rodents and the number of infestations have been reduced as the result of improved methods of controlling and covering tips.

Petroleum (Regulations) Acts, 1928 and 1936:

These regulations are enforced by the Department and there

are 68 licensed premises.

The installation of new tanks is supervised and pressure tests undertaken. Frequent revisits are necessary to ensure compliance with the Regulations.

The Fire Authority has continued to give invaluabe help and

guidance and their co-operatioin is appreciated.

Notices were served on the owners or occupiers of fourteen licensed premises and the majority were complied with immediately.

The main items stipulated in the notices were:-

- 1. Testing of tanks over 20 years old.
- 2. Checking of electrical equipment.

3. Display of notices.

4. Securing of the ventilation pipes.

Because of technological improvements in the methods of serving and storing petroleum, stricter supervision is necessary to ensure proper installation and maintenance.

Pet Animals Act, 1951:

One licensed premises (at Maesydderwen, Llanedi Road, Pontardulais) is kept under supervision.

Animal Boarding Establishments Act, 1963:

There is one premises licensed under the above Act:-The Kennels, The Links, Pembrey, and periodical visits are made.

Open Air Bathing Pool, Hendy:

Regular sampling of the water during the time of operation of the pool was undertaken.

Twenty-four samples were taken, all of which were satisfactory.
