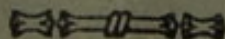

DEATHS

The total number of deaths of residents in this County registered during the year 1944 is 611; 288 males and 323 females. The general death rate for the County being 15.25 per 1,000 of estimated population while the corresponding rate for England and Wales is 11.6.

The number of deaths in each County district will be found in Table V., the death rate for the years 1939-42 are added together with a column of the mean death rate for 1934-38.

The principal causes of deaths will be found in Table X. The death rate from Tuberculosis is slightly larger than for 1943, but is lower than the death rates from this disease that we have been accustomed to.

Tables will also be found in the report showing the number of deaths from all causes and from the several causes in each of the Urban and Rural Areas.

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA

Laboratory Facilities :

Both the County Council and the Local Sanitary Authorities have arrangements whereby throat swabs and bacteriological analysis of water supplies are undertaken by the Emergency Public Health Laboratories, which were established by the Medical Research Council in 1939, one laboratory is at Conway and the other at Aberystwyth.

As has been pointed out in previous reports it is to be hoped that the facilities provided by these laboratories will be continued permanently. They have proved a great boon and have met a real want.

Samples of milk for the presence of tuberculosis continue to be examined at the Dairy Laboratories Aberystwyth.

Ambulance Facilities :

For non infectious Cases.

The two hospitals at Blaenau Festiniog and Towyn have their own ambulance.

Bala and Penllyn districts possess an ambulance stationed at Bala, as also Edeyrnion Council the ambulance being stationed at Corwen.

Deudraeth Rural District Council in conjunction with Portmadoc Council, have an ambulance which is stationed at Cookes Explosive Works, Penrhyndeudraeth.

Dolgelley Urban and Rural Councils with Barmouth Urban Council have obtained an ambulance which is stationed at Dolgelley.

For Infectious Cases :

The ambulance provided by the County Council for these cases is available in any part of the County.

Nursing in the Home :

In Merioneth this is carried out by 18 District Nursing

Associations who employ State Registered Nurses, Queen's Nurses and "village" nurses and/or independent Midwives each of whom is a State Registered Midwife.

All these Local Associations are affiliated to the County Nursing Association. The duties imposed upon the County Council under the Midwives Act, 1936, are delegated to the County Nursing Association and in 1944 one relief Midwife was provided.

(Note in 1945 a second relief Midwife was provided).

The County Council makes an annual grant of £2,500 to the County Nursing Association for these services; other grants are made to the District Associations for other services rendered to the County Council and by the Welsh National Memorial Association for work carried out for that body.

The Non-Medical Supervisor of Midwives and Superintendent Health Visitor is Mrs. Eleanor Owen, S.R.N., S.C.M., H V, who also acts as County Superintendent of general nursing.

Ante Natal and Post Natal Clinics :

In spite of great difficulties caused by the war, these clinics were carried on with regularity and are held at the three Cottage Hospitals of the County once every six weeks.

For cases from Bala, Penllyn and Edeyrnion, special arrangements are made with the Consulting Obstetric Officer after consultation with the County Medical Officer.

The Consultant Obstetric Officer is Mr. J. Gardener Wigley, F.R.C.S. (Eng.)

Nine clinics were held in 1944, and in addition cases were seen by Mr. Wigley at Chester by arrangements specially made.

Venereal Diseases :

A treatment centre has been established at the Caernarvonshire and Anglesey Infirmary, Bangor, by the County Councils of Anglesey, Caernarvon and Merioneth jointly.

The Centre is opened for male patients Tuesdays 2 to 5 p.m., and for female patients Friday, 2 to 5 p.m.

Patients can also be seen at any official centre in the country.

Outfits for the collection of specimens can be obtained free of charge by any medical practitioner in the County on application to the County Medical Officer, Dolgelley.

Specimens should be sent to the Pathologist, The Thompson Yates Laboratory, The University, Liverpool, and should reach the laboratory on a Thursday in any week.

Information with reference to the scheme can be obtained from the County Medical Officer of Health.

HOSPITALS

There is no change to report for 1944.

It is to be hoped that after hostilities cease a permanent infectious diseases hospital will be erected *in a central position in the County*. The experience gained with the temporary hospital at Corwen proves beyond all doubt that this type of hospital services is needed.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

The two institutions at Dolgelley and Penrhyndeudraeth, are in use as Public Assistance Institutions. Part of the latter is set apart for the reception and treatment of mental defectives over 16 years of age.

Under the scheme of the Public Assistance Committee cases were sent to hospitals during the year 1944.

INSTITUTIONAL PROVISION FOR THE CARE OF MENTAL DEFECTIVES

A part of the Public Assistance Institution at Penrhyndeudraeth has been set apart for the reception of certified mental defectives of low grade of both sexes over the age of sixteen years.

In addition to this provision the County Council has entered into agreement with the County Councils of Caernarvon and Montgomeryshire for the reception of children under 16 years to Institutions maintained by these Authorities, and with the County Council of Denbighshire and with the Incorporation of National Institutions for the admission of female cases over 16 years.

The County Council of Caernarvonshire has an agreement with the County Council for the reception of cases of both sexes to Llys Ednyfed.

The clinics are held at the Cottage Hospitals in the County, Blaenau Festiniog, Dolgelley and Towyn.

Cases from Bala, Penllyn and Edeyrnion are seen at Chester by arrangements with the Obstetric Specialist of the Authority.

Medical Aid :

State Certified Midwives must call in a registered medical practitioner in all cases of illness of the patient or child or in any abnormality occurring during pregnancy, labour or puerperium.

Fees in accordance with a scale drawn up by the Ministry of Health are paid to a doctor called in as above by a midwife, but the County Council has power to recover the fee from the person liable to maintain the patient.

INFANT MORTALITY

For the second year since 1911, the total Infant Mortality rate is lower than that of the country generally, being 38 per 1,000 births for Merioneth and a similar rate for England and Wales being 46.

In several previous reports attention has been called to the relatively high neo-natal death rate, that is, of infants in the first four weeks of life.
