
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

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT, COUNTY OFFICES, DOLGELLEY.

To the Chairman, Aldermen and Councillors of the Merioneth County Council

Mr. Chairman, Mrs. Jones-Roberts and Gentlemen,-

I beg to present the Annual Report on the Health of the County of Merioneth for the year, 1948.

Considerable changes took place in the pattern of health administration in the County during this year, when the legislation following the passing of the National Health Service Act, 1946, became operative on July 5th—the "appointed day." The County Council, as a Local Health Authority, under Part III of the Act, had the duty to:—

- (a) make arrangements for the care, including dental care, of expectant and nursing mothers and children under the age of five years.
- (b) provide a Domiciliary Midwifery Service.
- (c) provide a Health Visiting Service.
- (d) provide a Home Nursing Service.
- (e) provide for Vaccination and Immunisation.
- (f) make provision for the Prevention of Illness, and care or after-care of persons suffering from illness or mental defectiveness.
- (g) establish a Mental Health Service.
- (h) make provision for ambulances and other means of transport to be available for those unable to travel by public transport.
- (i) make arrangements for providing Home Helps in certain circumstances.

The provision and equiping of Health Centres was postponed.

As the County Council implemented its schemes on July 5th a full year's review of the new Services is not possible. I should like to mention, however, that the transfer of the Nurses in the employment of the County and District Nursing Associations to the County Council's employment was carried out very smoothly and efficiently, and my sincerest thanks are due to all those

concerned for their very kind co-operation. The whole County owes a great debt to the County and District Nursing Associations, and the Nurses, who have served the inhabitants so well over so many years.

Nearly all the new Services were new responsibilities to the County Council, and I am grateful to Members of the County Council, and particularly to the Chairman of the Health Committee, and the Health Committee Members for their kind help and support.

From the Vital Statistics it is gratifying to see that there were:—

- (a) no maternal deaths. Such a record occurred only in two previous years, namely in 1940 and 1945.
- (b) no deaths from non-pulmonary tuberculosis, and a marked reduction in deaths from all forms of tuberculosis, being the lowest ever recorded.
- (c) There was a marked reduction in the Infant Mortality Rate, this also being the lowest ever recorded.

The Registrar General's estimate of population showed an increase of 886 over that of the previous year.

The Birth Rate was slightly lower than the previous year, but apart from 1947, it was higher than any other year since 1924.

The General Death Rate was slightly lower than in 1947. There was a decrease also in the number of still births per 1,000 live and still births.

I am grateful to the Administrative Officers and members of their staffs for their assistance, and to my own Departmental staff for their help and loyalty.

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA

Laboratory Facilities:

Bacteriological examinations of swabs, etc., and of water were carried out at the Public Health Laboratories at Aberystwyth and Conway. These laboratories are established permanently by the Ministry of Health with free services to all Authorities.

Ambulance:

During the year the Council established its ambulance service under the National Health Service Act. Two ambulances were stationed at Dolgelley, directly under the Control of the Council while the ambulance at Corwen was also taken over. Ambulance stations were established at Ffestiniog and Towyn Hospitals and at Penrhyndeudraeth. Arrangements were made with the British Red Cross, for the use of their ambulance at Barmouth and with Montgomeryshire County Council for the use of the Machynlleth St. John's ambulance. Provision for "Sitting Case" cars was arranged through the hiring of cars, and through the Hospital Car Service as a temporary arrangement until car could be purchased by the Council. It is proposed to have two "Sitting Case" cars stationed at Dolgelley, and one at Blaena Ffestiniog and to use hired cars where necessary to augment the service.

From July 5th., to the 31st December, 1948, 482 patien were conveyed in the ambulance involving a total mileage of 19,9 an average of approximately 41 miles per patient.

827 patients were conveyed in "Sitting Case" cars involving total mileage of 38,493, an average of approximately 41 mil per patient.

There was a tendency for members of the public to consic this service as a free public service to convey any type of patie to a hospital or clinic, and it has taken them some time to real that it is an ambulance service for conveying only those who i unable to travel by public transport.

Nursing in the Home, Midwifery and Health Visiting:

The Council in its scheme under the National Health Serv. Act took over the employment of all the Nurses previously

ployed by the County and District Nursing Associations. Each Nurse carries out the duties of district nursing, midwifery and health visiting in addition to the treatment of school-children for minor ailments. Due to the scattered nature of the County it is proposed to provide each Nurse with a car. For the same reason it is considered advisable to arrange for each nurse to carry out the combined duties of District Nursing, Midwifery, Health Visiting, etc. The Council proposes to arrange for each nurse to attend training courses so as to qualify for the Health Visitor's Certificate.

Hospitals for Infectious Cases:

The Regional Hospital Board took over all the Hospitals after July 4th. Arrangements had to be continued to send infectious disease cases to hospitals situated outside the County. The Council had considered the possibility of establishing an infectious disease hospital at Llanegryn where an up to date Military Hospital had been built. This matter was transferred to the Regional Hospital Board for consideration.

Prevention of Cruelty to Children:

The Inspectors of the N.S.P.C.C. have continued to help in dealing with children referred to them by the Children's and Health Departments. Invaluable assistance was given in improving the conditions where it was considered that there was neglect.

The Inspectors investigated 30 cases apart from supervising old and new cases. 24 were cases of neglect while six sought advice. 13 were warned, 16 advised and one was prosecuted and convicted.

Two children were transferred to the Children's Home, and one was committed by Court Order.

Venereal Diseases:

Treatment of Venereal Diseases had been carried out through a scheme formed by a joint committee of the North Wales counties

up to July 4th, 1948.

On July 5th, 1948, the Regional Hospital Board took over the arrangements for the treatment of patients suffering from Venereal Disease. Following up of cases referred by the V.D. Officer to the Health Department was done by the County Medical Officer of Health personally.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA

Housing:

While some progress was made by District Authorities in the building of new houses, the housing conditions in the County are far from satisfactory. Several houses inhabited by families were far below standard and unfit for human habitation.

Schemes for Water Supplies and Sewerage:

Certain areas in the County were still without sufficient and suitable water supplies and adequate sewerage. Some District Councils were considering various schemes and the following had been considered by the Welsh Board of Health:—

SOCIAL WELFARE

Since July 5th, 1948, Social Welfare and care of certain children became the responsibility of the Welfare and Children's Committees to whom the Welfare and Children's Officer is directly responsible.

The Council has established a Children's Home at Bryn Llewelyn, Llan Ffestiniog, and at the time of writing this report, the Council was negotiating for the purchase of premises as a home for the aged.

Part of Llys Ednyfed is used as a home for the aged, while as certain number of beds at this Institution are reserved for the Caernarvonshire and Anglesey Hospital Management Committee

for the chronic sick.

Llwyn View Institution at Dolgelley was taken over by the Regional Hospital Board for accommodating mental defectives, and all the defectives at Llys Ednyfed were transferred during the year to Llwyn View.

Provision for the Care of Mental Defectives:

Part of the Public Assistance Institution at Penrhyndeudraeth had been set apart for the reception of certified mental defectives of low grade of both sexes over the age of sixteen, but during the year arrangements were made to use the whole of Llwyn View Institution, Dolgelley, for this purpose. All mental defectives were removed to Llwyn View from Penrhyndeudraeth and later Llwyn View came under the control of the Regional Hospital Board. There has been a great difficulty in finding institutional provision for mental defectives and some are still waiting for admission to approved institutions.

Arrangements have been made with the Regional Hospital Board for the continuance of the Psychiatrict Out-patient Services provided by the staff of the Denbigh Hospital for Nervous and Mental Disorders. A monthly clinic is held at the Medical Department, County Offices, Dolgelley. A Psychiatrist, a Psychologist and a Psychiatric Social Worker, all on the staff of the Denbigh Hospital for Mental and Nervous Disorders, attend each clinic. Cases referred include those of low mentality, who are certified, if certifiable, by the County Medical Officer of Health

MENTAL HEALTH

(i) Administration:

The whole Health Committee deals with Mental Health. No special Mental Health Sub-Committee has been appointed.

The County Medical Officer of Health is responsible for the organisation of the service. Arrangements have been made with the North Wales Mental Health Committee of the Welsh Regional Hospital Board whereby a qualified Psychiatrist, a Psychologist and a Social Worker attend at Dolgelley on the third Wednesday of each month to conduct a Child Guidance Clinic and a Psychiatric Clinic. Dr. Roberts, J.P., M.D. (Lond.) D.P.M., the Medical Superintendent of the North Wales Hospital arranged for Dr. R. S. Wilson, to conduct the clinics. At the time of writing the report, one has to record with deep regret the sudden death of Dr. Wilson, as he had been an admirable and capable colleague.

Dr. Roberts reports on the Psychiatric Social Worker Service as follows:—

"The field of the Psychiatric Social Workers covers such a ground as the visiting of the home of the patient. With a view to finding out the circumstances of his breakdown; where possible helping to straighten out any uncongenial family situation and finally helping to rehabilitate the patient—either during out-patient treatment or on discharge from hospital. As in the treatment of tuberculosis, it is little use patching up a patient and then returning him to the same environmental circumstances as produced his breakdown,"

BLIND PERSONS

The number of Blind Persons upon the County Register at the end of the year was 41 males and 40 females, making a total of 81.

Five cases were certified blind within the meaning of the Blind Persons' Act by Ophthalmic Surgeons, and three by the County Medical Officer of Health.

The supervision of the Blind, after the appointed day, was carried out by the Welfare Committee. One full-time Teacher of the Blind was responsible for all the cases in Merionethshire. She was employed by the North Wales Society for the Blind and reports were submitted on the cases to the Medical Officer of Health, before July 5th, and to the Welfare Officer after the 4th of July.

DENTAL TREATMENT—EXPECTANT MOTHERS

Provisions were made for the dental treatment of all expectant and nursing mothers, and to children under the age of five years. Certain cases were referred from the Ante-natal clinics for treatment and although appointments were offered to patients none were willing to avail themselves of the service. Each patient preferred to be treated by their own dentist.
