Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen,

We present the Annual Report for 1968. The main items are summarised as follows:-

Population

The population of the District has increased by approximately 30% since 1947. 1968 showed an increase of 550 over 1967.

Birth Statistics

The birth rate increased over 1967 and was higher than the National rate.

There was quite a reduction in the number of Still births. On the other hand there was a small increase in the number of Illegitimate births.

Mortality Statistics

The general death rate was a little higher than the preceding year, it was, however, still lower than the National rate.

There was an increase in Infant deaths, but the Infant Mortality rate compares favourably with the National rate.

There were two deaths from Pulmonary Tuberculosis, following a nil return for 1967.

There was a considerable increase in the deaths attributed to Cancer resulting in a rather high Cancer Death rate. If the figures for 1967 and 1968 are taken together the Cancer Death rate is then equivalent to the National rate.

There was a considerable reduction in Accidental and Violent deaths as compared with 1967.

Infectious Diseases

There was a low overall notification of Infectious Disease, and the District was relatively free from infection.

The newcomer to the list is Infective Hepatitis, which became notifiable during 1968.

Approximately 1,244 properties are now served by a paper sack refuse collection system, the remainder receiving a kerbside collection from an assortment of containers.

2. Sewage Disposal

It is estimated that 97.6% of the premises in the Urban area are connected to the public sewer.
