Mr Chairman and Gentlemen,

I beg to submit this curtailed report for the year 1941.

Population. (estimated) 5925.

Births.

Birth-rate (per Thousand population) 16.03.

This is slightly higher than the rate for the whole of England & Wales.

Deaths.

Total deaths from all causes, Males 33. Females 34. Total 67.

Death-rate (per thousand population) 11.31.

This is lower than the rate for the whole of England & Wales.

Death-rate of Infants under 1 year (per 1000 live-births) 67.31.

This is slightly higher than the rate for the whole of England and Wales.

Infectious Diseases. (Notifications).

Pneumonia 6; Whooping-cough 23; Measles 55; Erysipelas 1;
Paratyphoid 1; Scarlet Fever 1; Diphtheria 24;

12 of the cases of Diphtheria occurred in children under 15 years of age, 3 of whom had been immunised. The immunised children all had mild attacks, but there was one death among the children who had not been immunised.

Tuberculosis.

There were 4 new cases and 2 deaths during the year. Reports on environmental conditions have been made by your Sanitary Inspector for the Tuberculosis After-Care Committee of the County Council.

Immunisation against Diphtheria.

The number of children who completed the course of Immunisation during the year was :-

Age under 5 years - 197 ; Age 5 years and over but under 15 years-583.

This is an estimated percentage of 37.5 and 73.7 respectively. It is hoped that a large number of children under 5 years will complete the course at an early date, following a propaganda drive which is in progress.

Water Supply.

With the exception of the extension of the main from Lydstep to Ponally, which was completed during the year, no new schemes have been carried out. Many farms have been connected to the mains, thus /

improving facilities for the production of clean milk.

The water supplies in the whole area have been supervised efficiently by your Sanitary Inspector.

All samples taken for bacteriological analysis were satisfactory.

Housing.

Repairs necessary to maintain houses in a state reasonably fit for habitation have been carried out in nine cases, following informal notices.
