ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTOR FOR THE YEAR 1973.

To the Chairman and Members of the Council Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have pleasure in presenting my Annual Report on the health of your district for the year 1973. It is an abbreviated report which has been compiled from available records. The corrected statistics are not received until April or May, but it was necessary, in view of re-organisation, to present this report to the Council before 1st April, 1974.

HOUSING.

The total number of houses built in the rural district during the year was 99; 10 of these were council dwellings and the remaining 89 were private dwellings. The standard of housing throughout the district is good and a total of 40 houses were improved with the aid of grants.

In addition to the completed houses, a further 24 were under construction and the modernisation programme of older council properties was completed. Three further schemes for the erection of council dwellings had reached the tender stage by the end of the year.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

I am pleased to report that the number of infectious diseases reported from your district was confined to 26 cases of measles and 4 cases of scarlet fever. A certain number of mild cases of non-specific enteritis occurred during the summer months, in common with the remainder of the County; this illness is not spread by food or water and is common in all holiday areas. A limited outbreak of influenza occurred in the district in the early months of the year and caused the death of one elderly person.

WATER SUPPLIES.

Water supplies generally in the rural district are of excellent quality. The Pembrokeshire Water Board took a total of 165 samples during the year and submitted them to the Public Health Laboratory for bacteriological examination.

REFUSE COLLECTION.

The Council introduced a plastic bag system of refuse collection during 1973; this service was appreciated by the general public and is proving to be satisfactory. Local Government Operation Research Unit produced a report on refuse disposal in the district of South Pembrokeshire and made a number of recommendations, which will be considered by the new District Council. It is now generally held that refuse should be treated, i.e., pulverised or incinerated, before disposal.

The beach litter collection service was extended during the summer months and all amenity beaches were cleared.

Once again I am pleased to report that there were no deaths from tuberculosis in your district during the year and no new cases of the disease were notified.

The Chest Physician continues to see contacts at the Chest Clinic at Pembroke Dock and Haverfordwest.
