Annual Report of Medical Officer of Health for the year 1943, presented by the Clerk and Acting Sanitary Surveyor.

Gentlemen,

We beg to present the Medical Officer of Health's Annual Report for 1943, which follows the form required by the Ministry of Health.

HEALTH SERVICES IN THE AREA

satisfactory.

WATER

Bodelwyddan, Rhuddlan and St. Asaph are supplied by the Rhyl U.D.C., and most of the parish of Dyserth by the Prestatyn U.D.C. These supplies generally have been satisfactory. Bodfari This parish is supplied from works constructed by the Council. Very few complaints of shortage were received during the year. Owm is similarly supplied; the sources being at Aelwyd Ucha, Church Woods, and above Fron. There is also a supplementary supply when required during the drought from the Water mains of the Holywell R.D.C., who in turn are supplied by Birkenhead Corporation. Bryniau, Dyserth. This high level area is supplied with water obtained from the mains of the Holywell R.D.C. Waen. The water supply to this parish is from works constructed by the Council, and on the whole has proved satisfactory, with the exception of certain premises at the extreme ends of the parish which were intermittently supplied owing to the corrosion of the mains. Tremeirchion. The supply of water to this village continues to be unsatisfactory. Several schemes for improving the supply until such time as a comprehensive scheme can be proceeded with have been under consideration during the year, but it was found necessary to control the distribution during the months of July, August and September, when the greater part of the Village was limited to a supply of four hours on alternate days.

Rhuallt. The small scheme supplying this hamlet has been

DRAINAGE AND SEVERAGE

No extensions were carried out during the year.

RIVERS AND STREAMS

No action was found necessary during the year.

CLOSET ACCOMMODATION

There are only very few privies in the populous areas of the district where sewers are available, and in the remainder of the district 90% of the closet accommodation is of the privy type with fixed receptacles, the remaining 10% being of the privy type with removable receptacles.

PUBLIC CLEANSING.

Scavenging schemes are in operation in the parishes of Bodelwyddan, Dyserth, Rhuddlan, St. Asaph and Tremeirchion. In other parts of the district the above work and cleansing are done by the occupier, and refuse is disposed of, as a rule, on the land.

The Council have controlled tips at Dyserth, Rhuddlan and St. Asaph.

SHOPS AND OFFICES

No action was found necessary during the year.

CALPING SITES

There is only one camping site in the area and no new licences were issued during the year.

SMOKE ABATEMENT

No action was taken during the year.

SWIMMING BATHS AND POOLS

There are no public or privately owned swimming baths or pools open to the public in the district.

ERADICATION OF BED BUGS

No complaints under this heading were received during the year.

SCHOOLS

All schools in the district with the exception of Tremeirchion have a wholesome supply of water on the premises. The schools are closed when necessary during epidemics to prevent the spread of infectious disease.

IMMUNISATION

Every encouragement is given to parents to have their children immunised against diphtheria, and the results have been fairly satisfactory. During the year a further 252 children have completed the treatment.

MEAT AND OTHER FOODS

All animals are slaughtered at the Public Abattoir, Rhyl, which is a municipally controlled centre for the area.

TUBERCULOSIS

No private institution is provided in the district, but patients who cannot afford treatment in private institutions are well provided for at Meadowslea Hospital, Penyffordd, Flintshire, and the North Wales Sanatorium, Llangwyfan, Near Denbigh.

VENEREAL DISEASES

These cases come under the control of the Flintshire County Council, and patients have to be admitted to the Chester Infirmary for treatment.

MATERNITY AND CHILD WELFARE

The nearest centre is at the Old Emmanuel School, Vale Road, Rhyl, which is entirely under the control of the Flintshire County Council and their Health Visitor. Residents of this district make use of it.

SMALL POX

Provision for the treatment of Small Pox is made by the Flintshire County Council.

DISINFECTION

Arrangements for disinfection can be made as required with the Steward of the Isolation Hospital at St. Asaph.

LABORATORY FACILITIES

The Medical Research Council has established a Laboratory Service at Castle Bank, Conway, where all examinations are efficiently and quickly carried out free of cost.

DIPHTHERIA ANTITOXIN

A quantity has been purchased by the District Council and distributed to the local practitioners in the area.

ISOLATION HOSPITAL

The number of cases admitted from the district to the Isolation Hospital at St. Asaph during the year was 49.

VITAL STATISTICS

BIRTH RATE

The total number of births registered in the district during 1943, as given by the Registrar General, was 140 - 78 males and 62 females - 9 more than in 1942. Of that number 12 were illegitimate - 7 males and 5 females. There were 2 legitimate female stillbirths and 3 legitimate and 1 illegitimate male stillbirths. The 140 births give a birth rate of 18.0 per 1,000 of the resident population, compared with 16.5 per 1,000 for England and Wales.

DEATH RATE

The total number of deaths registered in the district during 1943, as given by the Registrar General was 93 - 47 males and 46 females. This gives a death rate of 11.9 per 1,000 of the resident population compared with 12.1 per 1,000 for England and Wales.

INFANTILE MORTALITY

The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 5 legitimates - 2 male and 3 female - with a death rate of 35.7 per 1,000 births, compared with 49 per 1,000 for England and Wales.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

There were 157 cases of infectious diseases notified during 1943, namely 27 Diphtheria, 11 Scarlet fever, 53 Measles, 24 Whooping Cough, 14 Pneumonia, 14 Erysipelas, 7 Pulmonary and non-pulmonary tuberculosis, 4 Puerperal pyrexia, 1 Typhoid, 2 Cerebro-spinal fever.

ZYMOTIC MORTALITY

There were no deaths from diphtheria, scarlet fever, typhoid, measles, poliomyelitis, encephalitis or cerebro-spinal fever.

PULMONARY TUBERCULOSIS

4 deaths were caused by Pulmonary Tuberculosis, equal to 0.51 per 1,000 of the estimated population.

OTHER TUBERCULOSIS DISEASES

Under this heading one death occurred, equal to a rate of 0.13 per 1,000 of the estimated population.

OTHER RESPIRATORY DISEASES

Under this heading five deaths occurred, equal to 0.64 per 1,000 of the estimated population.

DEATH RATE FROM CANCER

16 deaths were ascribed to Cancer, the rate being 2.05 per 1,000 of the estimated population.
