BARNACK RURAL DISTRICT.ABBREVIATED ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH.

My Lord, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I herewith beg to submit my report for the year 1949, which from the Public Health aspect can be considered very satisfactory.

The Birth Rate of 24.9 and Death Rate of 9.3 compare very favourably with those for England and Wales of 16.7 and 11.7 respectively.

The Infantile Mortality Rate of 34.4 is slightly higher than that of the rest of the County (32). There have been no deaths from maternal causes and no deaths from infectious diseases. The incidence of infectious diseases has been slight, no case of diphtheria have been reported. One new case only of tuberculosis, a patient transferred from another district was notified during the year.

The Barnack Water Supply has been very satisfactory in quantity and quality.

Under the Council's Housing Scheme, 36 houses have been completed, (Wittering 20, Barnack 16), and work was commenced on a further 24 houses at Wansford. 7 houses were built under private enterprise.

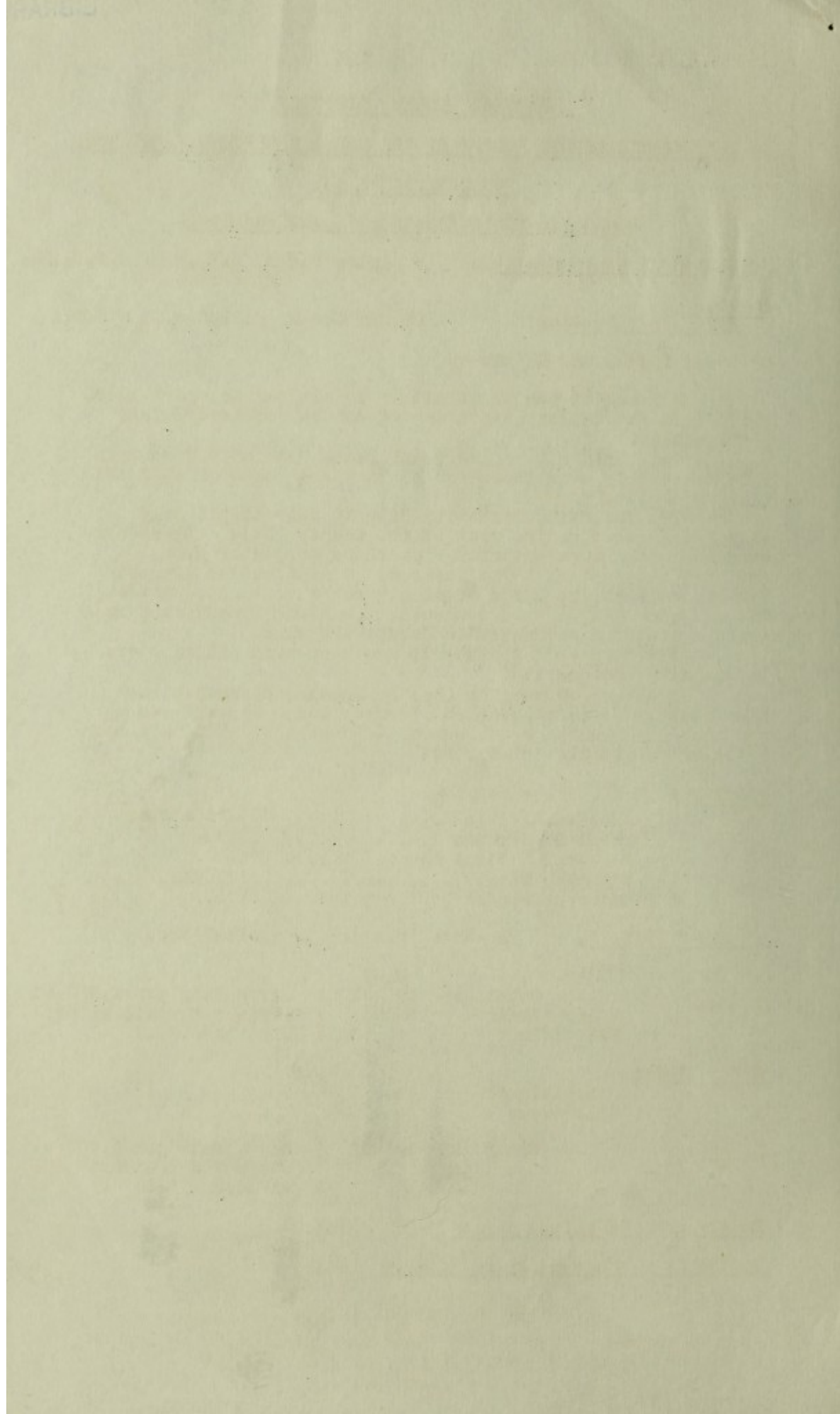

(1) General - District Nursing Service under the County Council is available to all villages.

(2) Infectious Cases - No provision made by the Council.

(c) Clinics and Treatment Centres. - Infant Welfare Clinics are provided in Barneck, Thornhaugh and Wittering.

(d) Hospitals.

Acute medical and surgical cases are admitted chiefly to Stamford Hospital.

Chronic sick are admitted to either St. John's Close, Peterborough or St. George's Hospital, Stamford.

Admission to both these hospitals has been difficult.

(e) National Assistance Act 1948. No action has been taken during the year.

SECTION C. SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA.

(1) WATER. The District is provided with two piped supplies, Barneck and Thornhaugh, owned by the Council.

The Parishes of Wothorpe and St. Martin's Without are supplied by the Stamford Water Company.

Bacteriological examinations are carried out at the Peterborough Emergency Public Health Laboratory, Memorial Hospital, Peterborough.

Wittering is provided with a piped supply from the Stamford Water Works and it is intended to extend this supply to Thornhaugh and Wansford.

All villages in the District have now a piped supply.

BARNACK SUPPLY - BORE HOLE. Chlorinated at source.

Quality - The quality and quantity of water have been very satisfactory. 11 samples were taken for bacteriological examination of both raw and chlorinated water with the following results:-

72%	-	Class I.
18%	-	Class II.

All chlorinated samples were Class I.

Quantity - Has been adequate.

THORNHAUGH WATER SUPPLY - SPRINGS. Chlorinated at source.

This supply has been adequate in quantity but results still show liability to surface pollution.

11 samples were taken for bacteriological analysis:-

45%	-	Class I.
36%	-	Class II.
0%	-	Class III.
19%	-	Class IV.

All chlorinated samples were Class I.

It has not been necessary to make any chemical analysis of water.

(2) DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE.

Temporary sewage disposal works are operating for drainage from council houses at Thornhaugh, Wittering and Pilsgete. The scheme for a general sewage disposal system for the whole district is still under consideration.

SECTION F. PREVALENCE OF AND CONTROL OVER INFECTIOUS AND

OTHER DISEASES.

Patients suffering from infectious diseases are admitted to the Peterborough Isolation Hospital under the Peterborough Area Hospital Management Committee. Accommodation has been quite adequate. The incidence and severity of notifiable infectious diseases have again been very low; with only 9 cases of scarlet fever, no diphtheria, 13 whooping cough and 4 measles. Two mild cases of acute poliomyelitis occurred and were admitted to the Isolation Hospital, Peterborough.

Ambulance removals have been prompt and very satisfactorily carried out.

DIPHTHERIA IMMUNISATION.

Immunisation is provided by the County Council and the general practitioner services. No cases of diphtheria have been reported in the District since 1942.
