Sufficient staff are available to carry out systematic inspections whenever necessary.
- (2) No rodents were sent for bacteriological examination during the year.
- (3) Deratting is carried out in the case of minor rodent infestations by the staff of the department under the supervision of a Port Health Officer, using poison baits and/or traps. Arrangements have been made for the deratting of ships to be carried out by means of Hydrogen Cyanide, when necessary, by a commercial contractor, Hivley Fumigation Co. Ltd., 15 Cheapside, Liverpool.
- (4) It has not been found necessary to carry out any rat-proofing of ships during the year.

Arrangements have been made for the derating of ships to be carried out by means of hydrogen cyanide, when necessary, by a commercial contractor, Hives Sanitation Co. Ltd., 12 Chesapeake, Liverpool.
- (A) It has not been found necessary to carry out any re-derating of ships during the year.
