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

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WATER SUPPLY.

The water supply of the Town has been analysed regularly and frequently and the Analyst's reports show that chemically and bacteriologically it is a very satisfactory supply.



DI HTHERIA IMPUNISATION.

No.of children who have completed treatment = 625. Under 5 years..... = 310. 5 years & under 15 years = 316.

The amount of Infectious Disease was rather more than in 1942 but less than the average of recent years. The Scabies Clinic continued to function and 213 causes were treated during the year.

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AMPUAL RE ORT OF THE B ROUGH SAMITARY INSP CTOR.

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INSPECTICN AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD. 8 samples of milk have been taken during the year. All samples were of Pasteurised milk, and proved to be highly satisfactory.

Meat and Other Foods. 517 visits have been made to the slaughterhouses and other food premises during the year, and 4,682 carcases have been inspected. The detailed inspection of carcases in the slaughterhouse proved somewhat difficult during the hours of 'blackout'. In all 4tons.12cvts.2qts.1stone.& 9:1b of food have been condemned as

unfit for humas consumption. This weight does not include canned and packeted foods not usually sold by weight.


