DITTHERIA INGUMISATION

The Town was again fortunate in having a small amount of Infectious Disease, most of which was of a mild nature. During the current year a widespread epidemic of measles has covered most of the country, including Besingstoke.

Scabies continues to occur more than normally : 203 cases were treated at the Olinic during the year.

WATER SUPPLY

The water supply of the Town has been analysed regularly and frequently and the Analyst's reports show that chemically and bacteriologically it is a very satisfactory supply. Only a very small number of houses have a private independent supply and are not connected to the main.



INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD

Mest and Other Foods

467 visits have been made to the slaughterhouse and other food premises during the year, and 4,544 carcases have been inspected.
In all 3 tons. 1 cvt. 2 qire. 4½ lbs. of food have been condemned as unfit for human consumption. This weight does not include canned and packeted foods not usually sold by weight.


