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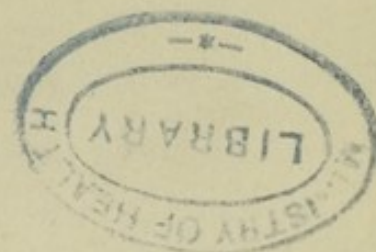

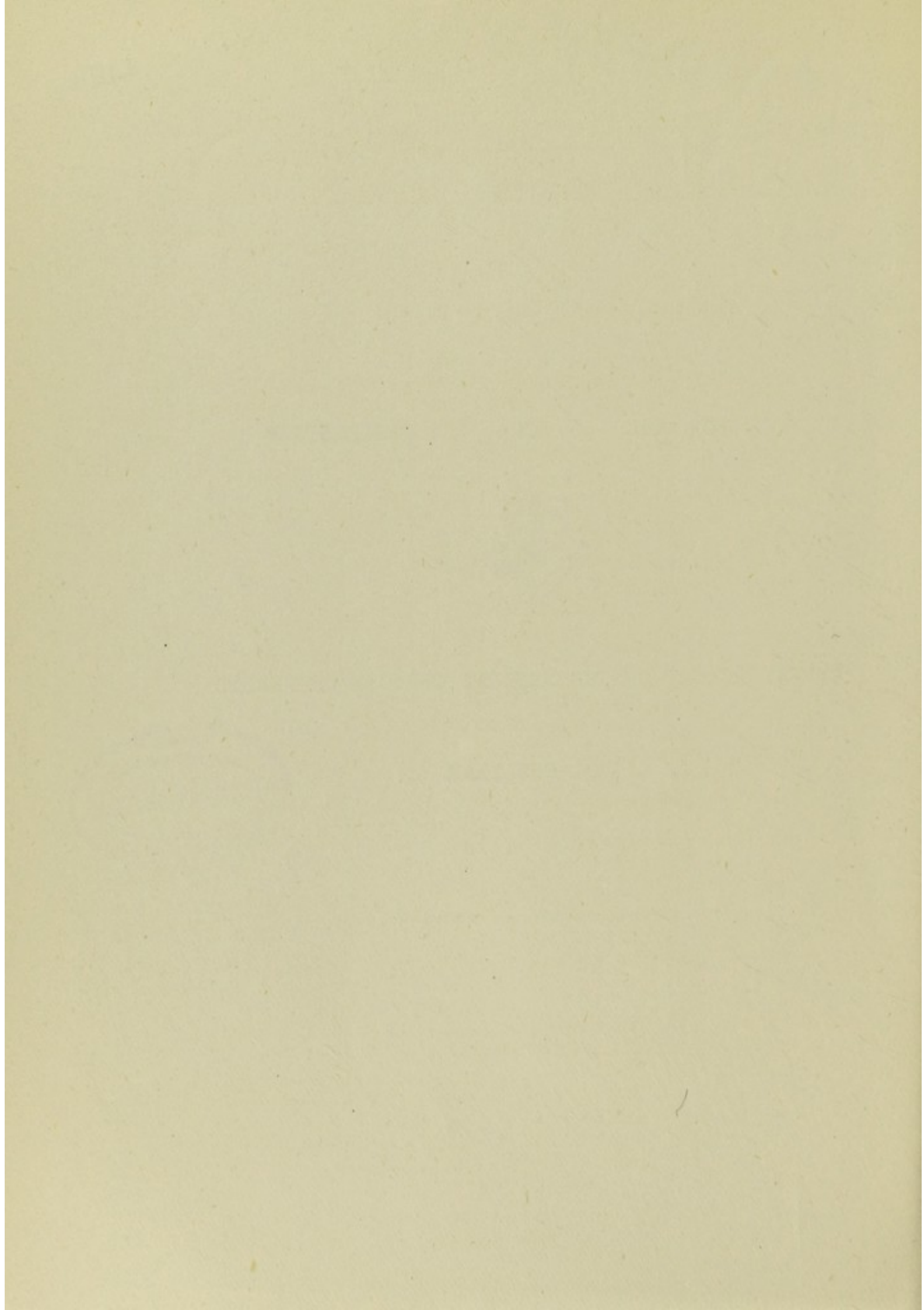

### (A) INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD

#### 1...MILK

Seventy-two (72) Samples of Milk were taken during the year, and the results of the analyses were as follows :-

In addition, samples of Detergent, and also Milk Bottles, were submitted for analysis; these tests were carried out over a prolonged period until results proved to be satisfactory.

#### 2...MEAT AND OTHER FOODS

1,021 visits have been made to the Slaughterhouse and other Food Premises during the year, and 5,692 carcasses have been inspected. In all, 7 tons. 6 cwts. 2 qtrs. 20 lbs. of food have been condemned as unfit for human consumption. This weight does not include canned and packeted foods not usually sold by weight.

**5...RODENT CONTROL**

The duties in connection with Rodent Control are carried out by the Additional Sanitary Inspector (part-time) and 1 Rodent Operative, under the supervision of the Senior Sanitary Inspector. During the year 150 complaints were received and 2,714 visits made in connection with baiting and poisoning at Rat and Mouse infested premises; 2,646 poisoned baits were laid, with 504 complete takes, and 1,104 partial takes; therefore it can be assumed that considerable numbers of Rats and Mice were destroyed. Whilst it is not possible to effect the complete eradication of Rats and Mice, it is by continued visits to infested premises, &c. with subsequent baiting and poisoning, that their increase can be checked. Treatment of business and commercial premises is chargeable, the inclusive charge locally being at the rate of 5/- per hour, with a minimum of 5/-, whilst private dwellings are treated free of cost.

The duties in connection with Rodent Control are carried out by the Additional Sanitary Inspector (part-time) and 1 Rodent Operative, under the supervision of the Senior Sanitary Inspector.
