To the Mayor, Alderman and Councillors of the Borough of Beverley

Mr. Mayor, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have pleasure in presenting my Annual Report for the year 1969. The Registrar General's figure for the year 1969 indicates a mid-year population of 17,320, an increase of 20 compared with last year.

During the year there were 320 births and 215 deaths compared with 313 births and 195 deaths last year. The adjusted birth rate for the Borough of 18.7 compares with the national birth rate of 16.3 per 1,000 population and an adjusted death rate of 12.5 compares with the national death rate of 11.9 per 1,000 population.

Once again, diseases of the heart and circulatory system were the major causes of death. Of these, ischaemic heart disease was the greatest single cause and accounted for 27.4% of the total deaths in the year from all causes. Of the malignant neoplasms, the second major cause of death, the lung and bronchus were the most common sites of origin. There were five deaths of infants under one year of age, compared with two last year.

Of the infectious diseases, 40 cases of scarlet fever were notified and were scattered throughout the first half of the year. Measles was notable by its absence.

Water continued to be supplied by the Hull Corporation and bacteriological samples taken during the year were satisfactory. Seventy-seven samples were taken from 3 private bore holes in the town and sixteen of these were unsatisfactory. In these cases, advice was given by the Public Health Inspectors on how to improve the supplies.

Unfit houses continued to be dealt with and closing orders were made on ten unfit houses during the year. From the report of the Chief Public Health Inspector it will be seen that the inspection of properties during the year increased considerably and part of this was in connection with improvement areas.

One hundred per cent inspection of meat killed in the Borough continued throughout the year and routine inspections of food premises were also maintained.

In presenting this report, may I express my thanks to the staff of the Department for their work during the year and to the Chairman and Members of the Health Committee for their constant interest and support.

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA

HOSPITAL SERVICES

Hospitals in the Borough are under the East Riding Hospital Management Committee and are as follows:

Westwood Hospital

This hospital has 235 beds and provides facilities for general medical, surgical, orthopaedic, paediatric and maternity cases.

Beverley Cottage Hospital

This hospital has 20 beds for gynaecological cases.

Miniature Mass Radiography

The Miniature Mass Radiography Unit of the Leeds Regional Hospital Board visited the Borough once a fortnight and held public and private sessions. A total of 823 persons were examined.

NURSING HOMES

There are no Nursing Homes registered under the Public Health Act 1936 within the Borough.

NATIONAL ASSISTANCE ACT, 1948

Part III. Accommodation

Accommodation is provided by the County Council at Minster Towers and Langholme. These homes together have beds for 66 elderly persons.

LOCAL HEALTH AUTHORITY SERVICES

The following services are provided in the Borough by the East Riding County Council as the Local Health Authority:

Infant Welfare Clinics

Infant Welfare Clinics are held at the Lord Roberts Road Clinic and Coltman Avenue Clinic. At Lord Roberts Road, General Practitioners held closed sessions on Tuesday afternoons and open sessions were held on Thursday afternoons, while at the Infant Welfare Clinic, Coltman Avenue, General Practitioners held closed sessions on Thursday afternoons and open sessions were held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons.

Domiciliary Midwifery Service

During the year 4 Nurse/Midwives working in the Borough attended 7 domiciliary births.

Health Visiting

Six Health Visitors work within the Borough having offices at the Divisional Health Office, Manor Road; the Medical Room, Longcroft School; and Coltman Avenue Clinic.

Home Nursing Service

This service is run in conjunction with the Domiciliary Midwifery Service and 6 Nurses (4 of whom are also Midwives) work in the Borough.

Ambulance Service

The County Council's Ambulance Station is situated in Grovehill Road (telephone number 881198).

Domestic Help

Home Help service rendered in the Borough is administered at County Hall, Beverley, and all applications for the service are dealt with by the Home Help Organiser (telephone number 881281).

LOCAL EDUCATION AUTHORITY SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICE

Routine medical inspections are carried out of all children attending Local Education Authorities schools in the Borough. In addition the following facilities are provided by the County Council.

OTHER SERVICES

Holderness Health Division's Co-ordinating Committee

Once every two or three months the Co-ordinating Committee under the aegis of the County Council, meets in Beverley to co-ordinate the work of officers in the district who are concerned with the welfare of children. The primary objects of the Committee are the prevention of cruelty to children in their own homes and the prevention of break-up of families.

On the Committee are representatives of the County Children's Department, the County Health Department, the School Welfare Department, the County Welfare Department, the Housing Managers of the District Councils, the Ministry of Social Security, the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children, the Women's Royal Voluntary Service, the Police Force and Probation Officers. Representatives of other organisations are co-opted from time to time as the need arises. Your Medical Officer of Health in his capacity as Divisional Medical Officer takes the Chair at this Committee.

Public Health Laboratory Service

Specimens for bacteriological examination are sent to the Public Health Laboratory at the Hull Royal Infirmary, Hull.

Family Planning Association

The Family Planning Association held clinics on Friday mornings 10.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. and the second and fourth Wednesday evenings 7 p.m. to 8.30 p.m.

Action during the year relating to unfit houses

Two further families were re-housed from the Norwood clearance area during the year and five from individual houses. Closing Orders were made on 10 individual dwellings.

Houses in Multiple Occupation

A further 7 houses were brought up to standard during the year and 8 were under investigation and improvement.

Improvement Areas

The Housing Act, 1969 provides for the setting up of improvement areas in which owners are encouraged to provide their houses with modern amenities while the Local Authority seeks to improve the environment generally. A considerable amount of preparatory investigation was carried out during the year and proposals will be made in due course.

Common Lodging Houses

The registered common lodging-house in the Borough was visited 12 times during the year. The premises were generally kept in a satisfactory state of cleanliness.

All the unsatisfactory borehole samples occurred during the first half of the year. One of the properties affected has been provided with a steriliser and this proved to be effective but, as was suggested in my last report, when pumping on the nearby sewage works ceased the trouble cleared and satisfactory samples have since been obtained from the houses involved.

Of the 5,930 inhabited houses in the town, an estimated number of 100 still had no internal water supply.

RODENT CONTROL

Routine work under this Act was carried out systematically during the year by the Rodent Operator. Treatments were given to 50 business premises, 5 Local Authority premises and 104 dwelling-houses in the town, and at all these premises an estimated number of 781 rats were killed.

The number of visits made to the various premises for carrying out these treatments was 880 but in addition to this, further time was spent in survey work in the town generally.

Offices, Shops and Railway Premises Act 1963

Routine work continued under this Act during the year at the end of which we had 257 registered premises in the town employing a total work force of 1,167 persons. 3 accidents were reported during the year consisting of 2 sprains or fractures and 1 laceration. These were all reported to the Ministry of Labour under the Accidents Recording and Investigation Service which they operate.

Petroleum Acts and Orders

At the end of the year 35 premises were licensed to store petroleum spirit and I to store carbide of calcium.

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
