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STATISTICS AND SOCIAL CONDITIONS.

The area of the Urban District of Bowdon is 1090 acres. The Registrarc General's estimate of the population is 3072.

GENERAL PROVISION OF REALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA.

1. (1) The Medical officer of Health is a part-time Officer.

The Sanitary Inspector, who also acts as Surveyor to the Scuncil, is a whole time offical. This position is filled by Mr. A. E. Shimmings, who holds the Certificate of the Royal Sanitary Institute and S. I. R. J. Board and the Meat Inspector's Certificate (R. S. I.).

(ii) (a) <u>Letopertory Facilities</u>. Materials are sent to the Public Heilth Temperatory Manchester.

(b) Ambulanco Facilities. The Halo and Bowdon Joint Ambulance is svailable where necessary.

(c) <u>Nursing in Homo</u>. There is a district Nurse whose services are evailable where necessary.

(d) <u>Clinics & Freetment Centres</u>. None is provided by the Council, nor has the need for them arisen. The Cheshire County Council provide an Infant Clinic in Bowdon Vale.

(c) <u>Hospitals</u>. Altrincham Genreal Hospital 100 beds is available for general and gynacological cases. Costretrical cases may be sent to St. Mary's hospital Manchester. Use is also made of the Manchester Hospital for general cases. St. Anne's Homo, Durham Massey, is a hospital with 50 bods for diseases of the ear, nose and threat, and some medical case are also admitted. There is an arrangement with Manchester for the reception of cases of smallpox should the need arise.

Section C.

SANTTARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA.

1. (i) Mater is supplied by the Manchester Corporation. Both quality and quantity have been satisfactory throughout the year.

(ii) <u>Drainage & Sewerage</u>. No extension has been made during the year, and none is required.

2. Rivers & Streams. The land treatment appears to be providing a satisfactory affluent.

Section D.

PREVALANCE OF & CONTROL CYER INFLCTIOUS & OFFER DISEASES.

Hospital accompdation for infactious diseases was provided by Altrincham Isolation Hospital. This has proved ample and is used for most of such cases. Measles, Whooping Cough, and Scarlet Fever are normally nursed at home, but where considered advisable they can be admitted to Altrincham Isolation Hospital.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SANITARY INSPECTOR FOR THE YEAR 1947.

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To the Chairman and Members of the Council.

I beg to submit by report on the sanitary administration of the district for the year 1947.

Water Supplies.

The whole of the district is supplied direct to the house by the mains of the Mandrester Corporation,

A constant supply of steellent quality has been maintained.

Drainage and Sewerage.

Small emounts of defactive drains and severs have been found and remedied during the year.

Sanitary Accompantion.

The whole of the district with the exception of a few outlying cottages are on the water carriage system.

Collection and Disposal of Refuse.

The collection is carried out by means of a Karrier Bantam Lorry with a trailer for waste paper and salvage tewed behind.

Owing to the vory acute shortage of labour it has not been possible to revert to the weekly emptying of ashbins. Very few ashpits remain in the district, these

are emptied about one par menth.

Paper. rags, metals, bottles etc. are collected, sorted and sold.

Infectious Discess.

We have been very fortunate in having very few cases of notifiable infectious diseases during the year. After infection, the disinfection of houses is carried out free of charge.

Smoke Abatement.

During the year no complaints of smoke nuisance were received.

Factorics.

No action has been necessary during the year.

Offensive Trades.

There are no offensive trades carried out in the Council's area.

Inspection and Supervision of Food.

(a) Milk Supply,

There are four retailers and eight producers in the area. These are constantly being inspected.

(b) No adultaration has been reported and no action has been necessary.
