Section A.

STATISTICS AND SOCIAL CONDITIONS.

The Area of the Urban District of Bowdon is 1090 acres. The Registrar General's estimate of the population is 3,870.

The Number of Inhabited Houses at the end of 1955 according to the rate book was approximately 1,230.

The Rateable Value of the District is £43,633 and the sum represented by a penny rate is £177.

The Social Conditions are good. The District is almost entirely residential and there is no industry of note.

The Chairman and Members of the Bowdon Urban District Council.

Mr. Chairman, Lady and Gentlemen.

I beg to present my Annual Report on the Sanitary Administration of the area, for the year ended 31st December, 1955.

Water Supply.

The whole of the district is supplied from the Manchester Corporation Mains. The supply in all cases is direct to the house or premises. The supply of water has been satisfactory both as regards quality and quantity.

The Thirlmere water is neutralised with hydrated lime so as to give a pH value of 7 to 7.5. Plumbo-solvency tests in past records show that water which has stood in contact with lead service pipes overnight has a lead content very definately less than 0.2 P.P.M.pH.

Sewerage and Sanitary Accommodation.

Existing sewers have been maintained and where necessary small defects remedied.

The whole district is on the water borne system with the exception of 7 outlying cottages.

Factories Act 1937.

No action has been necessary under Part 1, Section 1-11 and Part 8. Sections 110 and 111 of this Act.

Inspection of Food.

- (a) Milk Supply. There are 7 producers in the area. These premises are constantly inspected. No adulteration has been found and no action has been necessary.
- (b) Inspection of Meat and other foods. All food shops are constantly under inspection. There is only one butchers shop in the area, the meat being obtained from the Altrincham Area. No animals have been slaughtered for human consumption. There are no slaughterhouses or knackers yards in the area.

Food Poisoning Outbreaks. NIL.

Wrapping and Handling of Food stuffs. No prosecutions have been necessary.

Ice Cream premises. No ice cream is manufactured in the area.

There are three shops which sell prepacked ice cream in each case under satisfactory conditions.

Imoke Abatement. Although Bowdon is a purely residential district with no industries, factories etc. a keen interest is taken in Smoke Abatement.

For some 10 years or so, the Council have been members of the Manchester and District Smoke Abatement Committe and have taken a keen interest in the suppression of smoke nuisances from surrounding district

A Deposit Gauge is installed in the Towns Yard. From this gauge the necessary data regarding the amount of Sulphur Dioxide in the air, is obtained.

Eradication of Bed bugs and other Insect Pests. No cases of bed bug infestations were discovered or reported during the year. The departments help has been sought for the destruction of wasps nests and the destruction of ants and other insects.

Shops Act 1950. Action has n ot been necessary during the year in respect of the provisions of Section 36 of the Shops Act 1950 with regard to sanitary and other arrangements in shops.

Rodent Control. Treatment is carried out by one of the Council Workmen who has attended a course of instruction in Rodent Control. His services are utilised on this work as and when necessary. The Ministry of Food recommended methods are used.

Sewer tests are taken at intervals. Very few takes are recorded.

The Councils refuse tip and sewage farm are baited weekly and the Towns Yard monthly as a routine precautionary matter. No serious infestations in the area have been reported or found.
