1 case of diptheria notified was not confirmed as such.

(Diptheria inoculation. 55 children under five were done and 64 of school age. The estimated percentage protected is now 61% under five and 86% in the school age group.)

## GENERAL STATEMENT.

Infectious diseases.

Arrangements were made in conjunction with the County M.O.H. for the more efficient treatment of scabies in view of its increased incidence.

Access to tuberculosis records was authorised to Billeting Officers to avoid chances of infection due to billeting.

Housing. 12 houses were inspected for temporary occupation during the war only. 8 of these were fit after some repairs, the remaining were not fit except in extreme emergency and were not licensed at present.

Water. All samples have proved satisfactory and have been shown to me.

Milk. All samples taken for tuberculosis have proved negative.

A.R.P. No change has taken place in the establishments. Exercises that have taken place have shown that the first aid and medical work continue to be satisfactory.

Samples of the Water have been taken, and analyzed by the Public Analyst. The Bacteriological result on each occasion as follows:- Bacteria per c.c. on agar at 37°c.1



Bacillus Coliform absent in 100 c.c.  
Physical Characters. Clear.

Remarks:- This is a pure and wholesome water, of good organic and bacteriological quality, quite suitable for drinking and all the purposes of a public supply.

The quantity of Water available has proved ample at all times.

Sewerage. Total pumped. 30850,000 gallons  
New Connections made - 2.  
All sewers, and sewage Plant has been working effeciently.

Milk. There are 11 registered Cowkeepers, 3 of whom retail milk, and 4 other retailers whose premises are outside the district, also 3 milk shops, one of which retails Pasteurised Milk only. Approximate number of Cows in milk. 245.

Meat. One slaughter house is used as a receiving and distributing Centre.  
No slaughtering has been carried out.

Tinned foods. The following tinned foods were condemned as being unfit for human consumption :-  
Meat. Fish. Milk. Fruit. Vegetable.  
15 tins. 2 tins. 23 tins. 4 tins. 4 tins.

Housing. No new houses have been erected.  
Houses demolished under previous orders. 6.  
Condemned houses, licensed for re-occupation after inspection and repairs. 5.

No action was necessary in respect of Smoke - Abatement, or Infectation of Bugs.

Various properties in one neighbourhood were thoroughly tested for an Infectation of Rats.
