MILK.

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HOUSING.

I should like to emphasise the need to expedite the new housing programme. More of the letters of complaint I receive deal with this than with anything else. I have inspected several individual houses and temporary structures such as bungalows and P.O.W. Huts and in all cases I find defects in the amenities sufficient to cause the complaints and to affect the physical or psychological health of those living in them.

52 houses were built by the Council.
Private enterprise None.

WATER.

Tested from supply, bacteriologically quarterly, chemically half yearly. No bad samples and no shortage reported in the year. 90% of the houses have a piped in supply and 5% stand pipes.

SEWERAGE.

No fresh sewer mains have been laid, but the public enquiry into the proposed reconstruction of the existing sewerage works was held on 15th February and it is anticipated work will commence during 1949.
