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

The sizes of other pictures are given in inches, the horizontal measurement being invariably put first. Unless otherwise stated, the paintings are on canvas.

I have to acknowledge with thanks the valuable assistance given me by Mr. William Maclure in the arrangement of the pictures, a task of some difficulty in consequence of the small amount of space at my disposal.

Besides the other sources of information, I have referred to the Catalogue of the National Gallery of Scotland, by the late W. B. - 1. William Hunter's Vase, presented to him by his Students. Height 15½ inches, width of mouth, 6½ inches. Vase with lid and double handles chased. Lid bears the Hunter crest, a hawk. One side of vase represents in bas-relief a demonstration on a human body; on the table is the motto "Non sibi sed toti:" the other side bears the Hunter arms, said by Burke (Landed Gentry, sub nomine Hunter of Hunterstone), to have been borne till a recent date. Marks: (1) J. S. in Gothic letters; (2) Lion passant; (3) Crowned head ex adverso; (4) E, Gothic.
- 2. Loving Cup of beaten silver; originally a basin, converted into a cup by addition of beaten silver foot. Around margin outside, Collegii Glascuens Poculum ΦΙΛΟΤΗΣΙΩΝ, on a scroll. In bottom of cup PIE | JUSTE | SOBRIE within a foliar border. Height, 9½ inches; width of cup, 8½ inches; depth of cup, 3¾ inches; weight, 35 oz. 2 dwt. Marks: (1) Edinburgh Castle; (2) I.F.
- 3. Baptismal Cup in form of Quaigh, marked outside and inside with radiating lines, crossed outside by four concentric lines. Handles hollow, 2 inches long, 3¼ wide at base. Cup 7 inches in diameter, 2¾ inches high: base soldered on. On outside City arms; mace crowned, above open book, to right tree with bird, to left bell, below fish with ring adossée. Via Veritas, Vita. Weight, 16 oz. 18 dwt.
- 4, 5. Two Patens 13 inches in diameter, 4 inches high. In centre of each City arms as above. Weight of each, 40 oz. 9 dwt. Marks (1) I. L. (? John Luke, brother of R. Luke, silversmith in Glasgow circa 1740); (2) Glasgow arms; (3) J. L; (4) D, block letter like that of 1874-5.
- 6, 7. Two Communion Cups, $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches high, cup $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches wide, $3\frac{3}{4}$ deep; weight, 14 oz. 2 dwt., and 14 oz. 9 dwt. Marks (1) o in shield; (2) King George 3rd, head; (3) R. G. (Robert Gray, silversmith in Glasgow 1775—?); (4) Edinburgh Castle; (5) Thistle. Date, 1820.
- 8. Mace found in Archbishop Kennedy's grave at St. Andrews, and purchased by the University. In 1614 it weighed 5 lbs. 7½ oz., it now weighs 8 lbs. 1 oz. avoirdupois, the core of the silver shaft being loaded. It is 4 feet 9¾ inches high; the

head is six sided, rising by three tiers to a conical apex. Six shields on the lowest tier bear (1) an inscription "Haec virga empta fuit publicis Academiae Glasguensis sumptibus A.D. 1465 in Galliam ablata A.D. 1560, et Academiae restituta 1590;" (2) The arms of Douglas and Dalkeith; (3) Coat of James, first Lord Hamilton; (4) the arms of Scotland; (5) the coat of Archbishop Turnbull; (6) the City arms. These shields probably were inscribed last century. The upper tiers are richly chased in gold and enamelled. The base bears date 1590. See "Munimenta" (Maitland Club), Preface, p. xlii, and MacGeorge's "Old Glasgow," p. 139.
